



Wasn't Jesus commanding Eucharistic the apostles to host a perpetual memorial dinner in his honor instead of

commanding them to literally eat his body and blood? One final objection goes like this, "How could Jesus have offered up a sacrifice of himself when the apostles could still see him? Did Jesus receive himself at the Last Supper? How could Christ receive his own body and blood?" It is important to remember that Christ's physical presence in the Eucharist is not limited by space and time. St. Thomas Aguinas said it was fitting that Christ would receive himself at the Last Supper, "Because Christ himself was the first to fulfill what he required others to observe. Hence, he first took his own body and blood, and afterwards gave it to be taken by the disciples. (more next Sunday).
