

# A FAREWELL MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

At the end of my homily at my installation Mass on October 27, 2018, I spoke these words.

Finally, I stand before you this evening as your pastor— only the third in the very brief history of this parish. I was not elected by a single vote. I submitted not a solitary resume and I appeared before no interviewing committee. I have been given no authority to expel demons; no miraculous might to change water into wine, and no power to raise the dead. I am no more filled with mercy, no more gifted with holiness, no more beset by weakness—than any of you.

However, as we read from the Letter to the Hebrews, "no one takes this honor upon himself but only when called by God." Let me conclude with the

words of our patron saint, Francis: "I am who I am—nothing more, nothing less."

What gives me the greatest joy is how many of you have told me that you will "miss my homilies." Preaching is what a priest does more than anything else he does. It is a gift that I have cultivated over the years, and I truly hope it has given you a greater appreciation for the Scriptures; has helped you to live a more fulfilling life, as well as deepening your relationship with the Lord.

It is time to turn another chapter in both my life and the life of our parish. Change is good because it brings new opportunities for growth. Being a pastor is not easy. We paid off our debt. We survived a pandemic. We celebrated our Silver Jubilee. I went to bed each night telling the Lord, "I did the best I could." I woke up each new day promising to do better—so that I might lead us to where Christ would have us go.

Now my hair is a little grayer, my wrinkles are a little deeper, my memory a bit more foggy, but what remains at full strength is passion and commitment I brought to the work I love 1,825 days ago. I want you to know my heart is replete with gratitude and love for the opportunity to "offer you better service than you expect." Thank you for a wonderful 5 years!



Stewardship of Treasure Report - May 2023

May is the penultimate month of the current fiscal year. Thank you for your continued support of the mission and ministries of our parish. During the month of **May** our average weekly collection was \$18,627 (3.8% decrease vs. Apr. 23). You also generously donated to various important causes in our May second collections at \$20,820 (\$5,205 a week.) This brings our May weekly average to \$23,832. We budgeted our Sunday Offertory income for the current fiscal year (46 weeks x **\$16,000**) at **\$736,000** and received **\$898,564 (+\$162,564).** We have budgeted the extra income for the continuing maintenance and improvements to our parish campus buildings and grounds. As you know, we are dependent upon your practice of good stewardship to fulfill our parish mission. The love that these gifts represent will enable us to continue the work that we must undertake here at St. Francis of Assisi Parish.

#### FRANCIS FUND COLLECTION - NEXT SUNDAY!



St. Francis reminds us that we should always "start by doing what's necessary; then do what's possible; and suddenly you are doing the impossible." The goal of the Francis Fund is to offer tangible assistance to those in need on a person-to-person

basis and to offer spiritual services. People, who have nowhere else to turn, come to our doors seeking assistance with utility bills, overnight shelter, food and other needs. Your generosity in next Sunday's second collection will assist us in helping our neighbors. "For it is in giving that we receive."

#### **THE INSTITUTE FOR LEADERSHIP IN MINISTRY** is a 3-year



course of study for the laity. The ILM provides training and faith formation for lay leaders in the Church. The theological base for this program is grounded in the documents of the Second Vatican Council.

Responding to their baptismal call, graduates return to their parish to serve in various leadership roles in Liturgy, Catechetics, Social Justice, Pastoral Care, as well as many others. We plan to continue sending laypersons to the Institute for Leadership in Ministry. If you feel called to explore this possibility, we are looking for a few qualified candidates for the new ILM academic year, which begins in the fall.

#### **OUR PARISH FAMILY IS CURRENTLY IN NEED** of more



ministers to the sick and the homebound. As you know when people fall sick or are unable to attend Mass, they still greatly

desire to receive Holy Communion. Pastoral care ministers to the sick become the channel through which our parish family reaches out to our sick sisters and brothers. The priests, of course, do their part to visit, bring Holy Communion, and anoint the sick; however, we cannot do it

alone. We need lay ministers to visit the homebound and bring Holy Communion to sick.

NATIONAL Revival

**ROMAN MISSAL - COMMUNION Eucharistic** 84. The priest prepares himself [for Communion] by a prayer, said

quietly, that he may fruitfully receive Christ's Body and Blood. The faithful do the same, praying silently. The priest next shows the faithful the Eucharistic Bread, holding it above the paten or above the chalice, and invites them to the banquet of Christ. Along with the faithful, he then makes an act of humility using the prescribed words taken from the Gospels. 85. It is most desirable that the faithful, just as the priest himself is bound to do, receive the Lord's Body from hosts consecrated at the same Mass. In the instances it is permitted, they partake of the chalice, so that even by means of the signs of Communion will stand out more clearly as a participating in the sacrifice actually being celebrated.

#### DOES THE CHURCH RECOGNIZE MY MARRIAGE?



Like other couples in our parish or family, you may be wondering if your marriage is fully recognized by the Catholic Church. Catholic Church law ordinarily requires baptized Roman Catholics to marry before a priest or deacon. Unless they

received a "dispensation from canonical form," Catholics who exchange vows in the presence of ministers from other religious traditions or civil officials are not considered validly married in the eyes of the Catholic Church. Regardless of what happened in the past, the Catholic Church invites you to bring new meaning to your lives by embracing the vocation of marriage and dedicating your family's mission to sharing God's love. Our Red Zinfandel is made from a red wine grape, grown extensively in California since the mid-1800s, and is grown in few other places in the world. The grapes can produce wines with plenty of character. High in natural alcohol and tannin, grown carefully it can be rich and complex, with dark berry fruit and peppery spice. The most known example of Zinfandel outside of California is Italy's Primitivo, which can be similar in style, but is often a bit lighter and less alcoholic than West Coast examples.

The Memorial Garden is a place for the cremated remains of those who have gone before us, and to memorialize others who have died but are buried elsewhere. St. Francis is unique in offering this service to the Catholic Community.

This Garden space is set aside because those who have died form with us the Communion of Saints and are always present with us in prayer. We stand with all people, both living and dead, to sing our one song of praise to God for those who have died with Christ, have risen with Him and for the one Spirit that binds us together as one people.

The Garden is a quiet space in which you can pray and remember those who have died. We also honor the four periods and peoples of the history of Evergreen: the Ohlone Native Peoples, the Spanish and Mexican settlers, the ranchers and vintners, and those who have developed the land and reside here now.


