NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Solemnity of The Assumption of The Blessed Virgin Mary August 15

There was this social experiment about couples who were asked to measure their individual self-esteem. Those with lower self-esteem scores were asked to leave the room. While the ones with higher self-esteem were asked to stay and write as many authentic compliments, they could give to their respective partners who left the room. Those who stayed behind were asked to read aloud to their partners what they wrote about them. In response, the ones who

were asked to leave the room were told that they cannot say anything else other than say "Thank you" and what the compliment meant to them. After the activity they were asked to measure their own self-esteem one more time. The results showed that scores of those who initially got a lower measure of self-esteem had an increase in score by as much as 31%!

Giving authentic compliments can greatly alter people's mood and improve their well-being and performance. A simple compliment like telling a proficient sales clerk, "My, you're awesome at your job!" make wonders. This is because it gives a strong message to the other person that he or she is valued. Such was what happened in the case of a father who struggled with his teenage son. The father used to always call his son's attention for all the wrong things he did. One day, he decided to catch his son doing something right rather than doing something wrong, and compliment him every day for it. What happened after that was awesome. It not only improved the self-esteem of his son and his behavior; it also opened the eyes of the father to all the good things his son did that he often failed to notice!

On Tuesday, we will celebrate the Assumption of Mary. Mary thanked God for "lifting up the lowly." We are all lowly in one way or another, and we all need a little lift. We need to start giving each other compliments! When we learn to give praises to people, it not only lifts the spirit of another person, but it also lifts our own. Knowing that we have done something good to somebody is enough to lift our own spirit up! Mary's Assumption into heaven is a foreshadowing of what will happen to us if we remained being in right relationship with others. Regularly complimenting others rather than regularly reprimanding them allow us to be in right relationship with others. Consequently, when our relationship with others is right, we end up also in right relationship with God. Give someone a compliment today! Catch people doing something right rather than doing something wrong. Be sincere, specific, and lavish with your praise! On this note, I say to you: "You are awesome ©!"

J.O.Y. Jesus, Others and

Yourself: J.O.Y. is our religious education process for children 1st grade-High School. In this process the children and youth learn the basics of the Catholic Faith. Children preparing for Sacraments of First Eucharist and High School Confirmation start their preparation in J.O.Y. Registration for J.O.Y. starts July 1 and closes August 30. Registration is done on our website at www.sfoasj.com.

First Communion- First Communion preparation starts in the J.O.Y. process. Those wishing to prepare for First Communion must have been in J.O.Y. in the year prior. Children must be in the second grade or above and already baptized as a Catholic.

High School Confirmation-High School Confirmation starts in High School beginning in the 9th grade. Preparation for Confirmation starts in our J.O.Y. process. Youth must have been in J.O.Y. in the year prior. Youth must have been baptized Catholic, received First Communion.

Adult Confirmation-If you did not complete the Sacrament of Confirmation, we offer monthly sessions to learn and grow in your faith. Online Registration begins in July-August. Questions? contact Lerma Simpson at


