Oil for Our Own Lamps

What parent doesn't want the best for their child? We teach them to be polite, to be nice to others and to love God, so they are well prepared to live a life of their own when they leave home. So too does God our Father want the best for us, doing everything in his power so we can be welcomed into his kingdom. And in today's gospel, Jesus teaches us through the parable of the ten virgins that we must always be prepared because no one knows the time of our own death. Our Divine Bridegroom

may appear at any time to escort us into the heavenly wedding feast. It seems obvious this is why the five wise virgins brought with them sufficient oil for their lamps.

But Jesus also narrates an exchange between the foolish and wise virgins that is a bit perplexing. If the words are taken literally, the wise virgins seem to be selfish as they do not want to share their oil with the foolish ones. The beauty of parables is that there is always a deeper meaning that Jesus wants us to discover. You see, the oil in their lamps isn't really oil. It is our love of God and the faith we carry within us. It is something that we are not able to share.

Yes, we can teach others about our knowledge of God and our faith, but we cannot give them our faith. Just like the parents who teach their children how to lead a Christian life, the parent cannot live their lives for them. That child will have to live his own life. Jesus teaches that our lamps cannot be fueled by somebody else's oil. We must have oil replenished by our prayer and love of God for our own lamps.


