Rejoice and Be Glad

You may have noticed that the purple liturgical color during Advent is the same color as Lent. They both have penitential themes, getting ourselves ready for the two biggest mysteries in our religion: (1) the incarnation, where God enters into our humanity in Jesus and (2) the resurrection, where God conquers sin and death for us. On the third Sunday of both seasons, we pause and remind ourselves of what we are preparing for. On this *Gaudete Sunday*, we wait in joyful anticipation for the birth of Jesus, a reason to rejoice and be glad.

Rejoicing is a sentiment that abounds in today's scripture readings as we await the coming of Jesus.

The prophet Isaiah describes him as the one who heals and liberates us from our suffering, saying he "rejoices mightily in the Lord". His mother Mary sings praises exclaiming that her spirit "rejoices in God". St. Paul exhorts us to "rejoice always" and to pray and give thanks.

At the same time, we are called to give testimony that Jesus is our Lord, just as John the Baptist did in our gospel story. John knew that his role was to bring people to God, to testify to the light that all might believe in Jesus. Similarly, our role is to live our lives in such a manner that we bring Jesus to others.

As we enter this busy week amidst the frenzy of all the Christmas parties and last-minute shopping, remember that we are all baptized with Christ's spirit. Smile. Accompany the lonely. Be kind and gentle. There are so many waiting for the light of Christ to shine upon them. Be that light, and the joy of Christmas will be yours. Rejoice and be glad.
