# FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Christmas is just around the corner. It is that week when people make last minute shopping, wrapping their gifts in boxes with labels and cards addressed to specific people.



As we reflect on today's readings, we realize that it is the opposite in God. *God does not want to be put in a box.* He desires to make himself *available* as a gift to everyone, in every place, and in every time. This is the message we can take from today's readings. In the First Reading we hear of King David's plan to build a temple for God. King David was enjoying the most luxurious type of house available at the time. The house was particularly important to him because it was a gift. In gratitude to God, he decided to reciprocate what God has done to him in a manner he thought was best.

King David's plan seems nothing but admirable. It was a great plan. But there was a problem: It was his plan, not God's. Prior to this, God journeyed with the people in a tent. Wherever the people went, they felt God's presence accompanying them. Now, David wanted to fix the place of God's presence. God's presence, however, cannot be confined to one place, within a structure of stone and cedar and control people's access to him. David was thinking within a box\_and God does not want to be tied down to human expectations. God, therefore, tells David through the prophet Nathan that it was not for David to build a temple for him, for God desires to build a temple in each person. He

is not a gift to be wrapped in a box to an individual. God desires to remain present through living people, through anyone who would hear the word of God and say, "Fiat" or YES. And that was exactly what Mary did. Mary's question was not a question of doubt, but a question of her humanity who has a specific way of viewing things. For Mary, one can only be conceived when one had a relation with a man. Like David, Mary was thinking within a box. God invited Mary to abandon ordinary expectations and go beyond the confines of society's sense of the norm. God makes things possible in the most surprising way to reach out to all of us. St. Paul in the Second Reading focuses on God's involvement with humanity. God desires to dwell in the midst of humanity. He desires to dwell in each one of us so that His love cannot be walled in a single



place, a single time, or a single person. And so, St. Paul extends his invitation to us to join him in singing praise to God through the life we live. As we move into the table of plenty where God desires to make available his grace to all, God invites us to make his Son known to all so all may share in the banquet of heaven someday.
