IESUS

This week's Gospel (Mk. 1:21-28), St. Mark wants us to know who Jesus is. He introduces His Gospel with the words: "the beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the SON OF GOD" (Mk. 1:1).

Within a few verses, we hear the testimony of John the Baptist: that Jesus would baptize with the Holy Spirit. A few verses later, Mark tells us that at Jesus' baptism a voice came from the heavens saying to Jesus: "You are my beloved Son. With you I am well pleased" (Mk. 1:11).

Now, not even halfway through Mark's first chapter, St. Mark gives us more information about Jesus, but from an unexpected source, the devil. The people in the synagogue recognize the power in Jesus' teaching and recognize that He is teaching as "one having authority" (Mk. 1:22). Indeed, Jesus speaks the Word of God with a freshness and a power they had never seen before. This is to fulfill what Moses, in the first reading (Deut. 18:15-20), spoke about to God's people before he died; that God would send another prophet who speaks God's Word with power and authority. But the devil is not a dummy. The devil catches on immediately. The devil cries out from the person who is possessed: "I know who you are---the Holy One of God" (Mk. 1:24).

The devil is not only perceptive and clever but remembers everything. The devil would have remembered the announcement of the Angels to the shepherds when Jesus was born: "Today in the city of David a Savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord" (Lk. 2:11). The devil would have remembered the visit of the Magi when Jesus was born. St. Mark not only wants us to know who Jesus is but he wants us to know Jesus was not afraid of the evil power in this world and was willing to face them head on.

Throughout the Gospel of Mark, amidst the continual teaching and miracle-working of Jesus, the question lingers: Who is this man? This continues until, at the moment of his death on the cross, another unlikely voice reveals Jesus' identity: the Roman soldier who sees Jesus die calls out, "Truly this man was the Son of God!" (Mk. 15:39).

We can admire the teachings of Jesus. And why not? They have had a major influence on the Western world and much beyond. We can marvel at the miracles described in the Gospels. But do we really grasp and abide in the truth of WHO HE IS? Jesus is not merely a "good man" or the "best of men," but the Holy One of God, the SON OF GOD.
