Laetare Sunday

The Fourth Sunday in Lent is known as *Laetare Sunday* as the mother Church invites us to rejoice with her. *Laetare* in Latin means to "rejoice" which reminds us that the Lenten season is not a time of grief, but rather a time to recharge our spiritual life and a time to seek a new intimacy with God. The Readings present to us an important truth in the Bible, expressed through the most celebrated verse, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." (Jn 3:16)

The God of the old Testament is the definition of "Love" and "Mercy" (Ex 34:6-7). Even despite the sin and rebellion of Israel, which is graphically explained in the book of Chronicles in this Sundays' Mass's First Reading, God does not withdraw His LOVE at all. He has left His imprint on us and each of us is made in the image and likeness of God. We reflect God's beauty and goodness even more than the sun, the stars, and all the other wonders in this universe. God has left His imprint on us because He has formed each of us individually and uniquely. We should not read the challenges in our life as a sign that God has abandoned us. Instead, the challenges serve as a temporary time of cleansing before God reinstates us.

THE SCRUTINIES - Last Sunday at the 10 AM Mass, our parish community along with the Elect (those who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil) celebrated the first Scrutiny.

Today, we will celebrate the second Scrutiny with them at 10 AM Mass, and next Sunday, we will celebrate the third Scrutiny with them again at the 10 AM Mass.

To scrutinize means to examine something very closely. When we celebrate the Scrutinies at Mass, we are not scrutinizing the Elect. Rather, they are scrutinizing their own lives before God, and we are called to do the same along with them. The goal is to be strengthened to overcome the power of sin.

Together with the Elect, we identify concrete issues that they and we need to confront - we name our thoughts and actions that prevent us from living the Gospel fully. Reflecting on the Scrutinies can also be a source of renewal in our own spiritual journey.
