## Walking in Simple Joy

Palm Sunday April 13, 2025

"Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." - Luke 23:34

My Dear St. Francis of Assisi Family,

Today we enter Holy Week, beginning with the triumphal entry into Jerusalem and moving swiftly to the passion narrative. The contrast is stark – from "Hosanna!" to "Crucify him!" in the span of a few days. This dramatic shift reminds us of the complexity of human nature and our own capacity for both devotion and betrayal.

Luke's passion narrative particularly emphasizes Jesus' mercy and forgiveness. Even in His suffering, Jesus prays for His executioners, promises paradise to the repentant thief, and remains faithful to His mission of love. His words from the cross continue to challenge and inspire us: "Father, forgive them."

As we walk through this holiest of weeks, I invite you to enter deeply into this story. Attend our Holy Week services if you can. Spend time in prayer with different characters in the passion narrative – Peter in his denial, Mary in her steadfast presence, Simon of Cyrene in his unexpected service, the centurion in his moment of recognition.

This week, consider: Where do you find yourself in this story? What crosses do you help others bear? What sacrifices is love asking of you? How can you remain faithful when faith itself is tested?

Fr. Lieu | Passion Sunday Welcome to Holy Week! Today we begin Holy Week, a week when we enter into the mystery of Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection; the mysterious depths of a love that is stronger than death.

We begin the week by calling to mind the triumphant entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem (Luke 19:28-40). The prophecies are fulfilled and Jesus

prepares to complete his mission by embracing the Cross.

The prophet Isaiah in the first reading (Isaiah 50:4-7) talks about the Suffering Servant. The Suffering Servant is the Messiah who suffers with patience and trust in God: "The Lord God is my help; therefore I am not disgraced; knowing that I shall not be put to shame."

Jesus in the Gospel (Luke 22:14-23:56) is the Suffering Servant foretold by Isaiah. He is able to embrace suffering and death with a confidence that God the Father will not let him be put to shame, but will vindicate him. Jesus' confidence in the Father is surely tested in the last hours of his life, and Jesus clings to God the Father.

St. Paul in the second reading (Philippians 2:6-11) talks about the plans of the Father for Jesus: "Jesus humbled Himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." Jesus dies for us. In the midst of incredible suffering, Jesus clings to his love for all people and clings to his will to save all people.

So we come to the Passion once more. By the end of today's long Gospel, the work of our redemption will have been accomplished, the new covenant will be written in the Blood of his broken body hanging on the cross at the place called the skull. Jesus remains faithful to God's will to the end, and does not turn back in his trial. He gives himself freely to his torturers, confident that God the Father will vindicate him.

This is why God greatly exalted him; this is why we have salvation in his name; and this is why we come to the table of the Lord offering our thanksgiving to God for our salvation in Christ. As we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ at the table of the Eucharist, let us follow his example of humble obedience in the trials and crosses of our lives, we know we will never be forsaken. We know, as the Centurion said: Truly this was the Son of God (see Matthew 27:54).
