A REFLECTION FROM FR. VINCENT PINEDA June 29, 2025 - Saints Peter and Paul

"And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church." - Matthew 16:18

Dear St. Francis of Assisi Family,

Today we celebrate two pillars of the Church – Saints Peter and Paul. Though different in background, temperament, and ministry, both were transformed by Christ and became foundational leaders in the early Christian community.

Our Gospel recounts Peter's confession of faith – "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" – and Jesus' response naming him the rock on which the church would be built. This exchange reminds us that the Church is built on faith in Jesus as the Christ, a faith that comes not from human wisdom but as a gift from God.

Peter's story encourages us – a fisherman with no special education or status becomes a leader of the Church. His journey includes both profound insight and serious failure. Remember, this same Peter who confessed Jesus as Christ would later deny him three times. Yet Jesus restored him and used him powerfully.

Though our readings today don't include Paul's story, his transformation is equally remarkable – from persecutor of Christians to apostle to the Gentiles. Like Peter, Paul's life shows that God's call doesn't depend on our perfection but on our willingness to be transformed by grace.

As we honor these saints, let's reflect: What is my confession of faith? How has Christ been working to transform me? Where might God be calling me to use my gifts for building up the Church, despite my limitations and failures?

St. Peter & St. Paul: Saints of Communion & Mission | by Therese Bao

Happy Feast Day of St. Peter and St. Paul! Fun fact: my husband chose St. Peter and St. Paul as his patron saints and today also marks our one year anniversary, so there is much to celebrate on this lovely Sunday! Every Sunday during the Nicene Creed, we profess that we believe in "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic" Church. We call these four descriptions the Four Marks of the Church, though they can be synthesized into two functions: communion and mission. These two incredible saints embody communion and mission through their lives and their legacy.

When we say that the Church is "one," we mean that we are united in *the* One and with each other. If you recall the words of the doxology (when the presider raises the host and chalice), as a Church we are "one" when we do all things "through Him, and with Him, and in Him." When we say that the Church is "holy," this means that the Church is sanctified through its communion with the Holy One and safeguards the sacraments, which are holy. The Church as "holy" doesn't necessarily mean that all of its members are perfect or sinless. Instead, there is a recognition that the more we participate in the sacramental life of the Church, the closer we get to one another and to the Lord. This is why the marks of "one" and "holy" can be summarized by the term "communion." Another way to look at "communion" is the vertical and horizontal relationships that make up the Cross: the vertical relationship from us to one another.

From his call to discipleship to his legacy as the rock upon whom the Church is built, St. Peter truly embodies this concept of communion. Though he was by no means a perfect follower of Christ (his doubt upon the water, his tripartite denial of knowing Jesus, etc.), he continually returned to ask for forgiveness and to reunite himself to the Lord. As the first Pope, he became a unifying figure for the early Christians and his legacy — apostolic succession through the papacy — continues to unite billions of Catholics worldwide today.

When we say that the Church is "catholic," notice the lowercase 'c'. "Catholic" with an uppercase 'C' is the name of our religion, but "catholic" with a lowercase 'c' simply means "universal." The Church is not only universal in how we celebrate the sacraments, but also in our outreach to everyone. All are called to be a part of the Church, regardless of their background! When we say that the Church is "apostolic," this points to apostolic succession, but more importantly, it also points to the mission of the Church: to send forth bearers of the Good News and to bring others into communion with the larger Church. Our faith invites us to move beyond stagnation and towards invitation and incorporation of others into the life of Christian discipleship.

Enter our wonderful role model for the concept of "mission": St. Paul. He was infamously established as a persecutor of Christians, had a radical encounter with the risen Jesus, and dedicated the rest of his life to spreading the Good News to the Gentiles and beyond, even when faced with the threat of imprisonment and death. In union with Peter and the other apostles, St. Paul's message to the early Church was clear: we are a Church on a mission to bring the peace, love, hope, and joy of Christ to others. As we celebrate these two holy men, may this be our prayer today: *O holy Apostles, Peter and Paul, intercede for us. Protect, O Lord, your people who trust in the patronage of your Apostles, Peter and Paul, and by their constant protection protect your people. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.*



Our 2022 St. Francis of Assisi Red Zinfandel is ready with your donation to our Wine Club.

Our Red Zinfandel is made from a red wine grape, grown extensively in California since the mid-1800s, and is grown in few other places in the world. The grapes can produce wines with plenty of character. High in natural alcohol and tannin, grown carefully it can *be rich and complex, with dark* berry fruit and peppery spice. The most known example of Zinfandel outside of California is Italy's Primitivo, which can be similar in style, but is often a bit lighter and less alcoholic than West Coast examples.
