TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Last week, we looked at a form of nativity scene called a presipio, characterized by framing the crèche of Jesus with a vast array of personalities and a rich geographical context. The tradition was carried to the New World, and finds very rich expression in Latin America today. While in Europe the presepio was reserved mostly to the homes of wealthy nobles and great churches, in Latin America it was claimed by the poor and expressed the skills of native artisans. In Mexico, you can still find clay figures in every village market. In a way, the native people took the religion of Spanish rule and baptized it with their Indian culture by surrounding the crib of Jesus with local geography and people. In Brazil, where Christmas falls in summer, the figure of the baby Jesus is wrapped in gold and gems, and set on a hillside surrounded by flowers and animals of all kinds. Sometimes there is a double presepio, presenting both Nativity and Crucifixion.

In some places in Latin America, even non-religious people take care to have a presepio in the home, sometimes dedicating one whole room in the house or apartment to the scene. Some cities have markets where people from the countryside sell plants and figurines. In Cuzco, churches and families provide hot chocolate for the children of the poor who come down to help create the nativity scenes. In Paraguay, the baby Jesus grows—the small infant who arrives on Christmas Eve is replaced at New Year with a toddler Jesus who holds in one hand the globe and in the other a cross. Few Christmas traditions have the vitality and variety of presepios and crèches honoring the Nativity.

ADVENT SEASON

It has taken a long while to learn how generous the people of this parish are. Evidence for this is evident during the Season of Advent. What's not so clear is the source of what motivates others to be so magnanimous. Most of it doesn't make much rational sense; consequently we are likely to be more mindful of our capacity to employ intuition and emotional intelligence in matters of the heart.

Nothing makes us happier when we see the eyes of another light up to a gift freely given—it's priceless. What if it were possible to have others experience the exchange of goodwill from one to another. Even while they may never encounter one another, there is a spiritual connection between the recipient and the donor. That encounter

reminds us of the gift of life—by sharing what we value with one another we find true value and we are drawn more closely in our life together. This is the basis for trust.

Most of us carry around the memories of Christmas past. It was a time of innocence when Santa Claus seemed plausible, though now we are likely to focus on the Christ child born in Bethlehem. Still, many adults look forward to living these memories of innocence again with their children until they grow into adulthood. The surprises of this season will eventually reveal themselves as gifts: just as our children are to this present generation as it makes evident the mercy of God's love in the Word made Flesh.


We do need a savior in our time, and we await the return of Jesus. Part of being a disciple of Jesus is to find ways of sharing a word that causes us to rejoice. It is like receiving an unexpected gift—it has deep meaning because it conveys a spirit of gratitude.

Knowing that another thinks well enough to have spent the time to be thoughtful and providing a request is an act of kindness and goodwill.

The generosity from the parishioners of St. Mary is truly exceptional. You are caring for many children and adults who may not have extended family near. The Advent season is a time of contrast between the darkness and the light. Most of the time our rational sensibility gives way to emotional intelligence. As self-evident as it may seem, we need to remember to take care of one another; particularly our children and elders.

This Advent let us keep our promise to prepare for the arrival of the one who comes in the name of the Lord. As the time approaches to celebrate the gift of life God offers us in Jesus, may we also gratefully acknowledge God's promise now.

As we celebrate the third week of Advent let us remember that Advent means coming. It is a time to prepare for the coming of Christ at Christmas. We really celebrate a three-fold coming---the coming of Christ as an infant at Christmas, the coming of Christ in our daily lives, and the second coming of Christ. It is a time to prepare our hearts for Christmas by working on changing something that has prevented us from following the path of Christ. As we continue to wait in joyful hope may we be grateful for the many gifts in our lives.



As we then move into into the Christmas season let us remember all of the reasons that we have to give thanks to God for his many blessings and his many signs and symbols at this time of year:

Fir Tree: the pure green color of the fir tree remains green all year long, depicting the everlasting hope of mankind. All needles point heavenward, making it a symbol of our thoughts turning toward heaven

Star: The star is the heavenly sign of promise long ago, God promised a Savior for the world and the star is the fulfillment of that promise.

Candle: The candle symbolizes that Christ is the light of the world, and when we see this great light we are reminded of He who displaces the darkness.

Wreath: The wreath symbolizes the eternal nature of love. Real love never ceases. Love is one continuous round of affection.

Holly Leaf: The Holly plant represents immortality. It represents the crown of thorns worn by Jesus. The red berries represent blood that was shed by Jesus.

Gift: God so loved the world that he gave us his only Son as a gift.

Candy Cane: The J of the candy cane stands for Jesus; the crook of the candy cane represents the shepherd's staff, they who first heard the news of the birth of Jesus. The stripes of the candy cane remind us that by His stripes we were healed, the red represents the blood that was shed for us and the white represents the light of purity and resurrection and the hope that Jesus brought to us.

Angel: The angels were the ones that heralded in the glorious news of the Savior's birth.

Bell: The lost sheep are found by the sound of the bell, it should bring people back to the fold. The bell symbolizes guidance and return.
