TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today's Gospel centers on the plight of a leper and Jesus' response of healing. In Hawaii, the bacterium that causes leprosy probably entered from China in the mid-1800s, and the native islanders were susceptible to the dreaded disease. In 1866, the government literally dumped the sufferers on a remote and virtually inaccessible island peninsula with towering cliffs. Thrown off ships into the sea, the sick people were told to swim for the beach and head for caves, and for seven years the only supplies were similarly cast into the sea to drift ashore. It was then, 1873, that a thirty-three-year-old Belgian priest, Damien de Veuster, went voluntarily to Kalaupapa. Before long, he cajoled the government into funding his mission and its hospital, built a village with proper homes and sanitation, and recruited Mother Marianne Cope to bring sisters from Syracuse, New York, to nurse the sick. Damien, who eventually died of leprosy, has been canonized, and Mother Marianne as well. Although leprosy has been curable since the 1940s, today a few patients remain in their lifelong home, now a national historic site. The peninsula is still utterly isolated from the outside world, and the speed limit for the few cars there is 5 mph since there's nowhere to go! The hospital is still well-staffed and equipped, but access is regulated and visitors must take an official tour, often involving a descent down the cliffs by "Molakai mule." There are few places on earth that evoke the healing power of Jesus, or our call to follow the Healer, more than Damien's beloved island mission.

Mr. James Johnston, our principle, had a chance to address the assembly at every mass as well as teachers from our faculty and members from the Student Council. All of them demonstrated the excellence for which we strive at St. Mary School. Lynn Dickerson and Cecile Mantecon directed the efforts of the various students who served as lectors, altar servers, and song leaders. I am very grateful to all the families that attended the Sunday Masses on the last weekend of January to inaugurate a week that focuses on the importance of Catholic School Education.

What seemed most memorable was how many in the assembly

stood when asked if they attended, taught or worked at a Catholic School. Many of these have had a lifetime of learning because of dedicated teachers like our own at St. Mary School. Some continue their education by serving in leadership positions in our parish members or by volunteering their time and efforts to those that need them the most.

As is often true with parish leaders, one could easily feel that the results of a year's work may seem inconclusive. Far-reaching results necessitate the consultation of many more than the few parish leaders conducting the work. In my experience with parish leadership, the most effective leaders do 80% planning and 20% execution of the plan. It is not so easy to balance between these two aspects. Planning with other leaders requires patience and understanding. Leaders understand the importance of results and know that planning is essential to any endeavor.

The same requires a common vision that will engage and inspire others to have hope for our future. Planning can be a lengthy process


in where leaders agree to set goals and eventually achieve them together as a team. Ultimately, being able to communicate our progress to the parish community will allow us to consider next steps for establishing future goals.

It is said that if you wishes to establish institutional change that will last more than 20 years, you need leaders that can respond to the inevitable change that comes with time. That is why we have become a Drexel School and joined with other Catholic Schools throughout the diocese to help form families as Roman Catholics. We have many more scholarship opportunities than previously for those who believe that a Catholic School Education is out of reach for their family. I hope many more families will consider this as they decide on their children's academic future.


