TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

As election campaigns move into high gear, sometimes the phrase "the Catholic vote" is heard. It's an interesting concept, since Catholics started out in this country as a very fragile group: fewer than forty thousand of us at the time of the first census in 1790, and only about 2 percent of the population by 1830. It was a priestless church for all intents and purposes, lay-led clusters of Catholics waiting patiently for the occasional visit of a priest, sustained by gathering when they could on Sunday for devotional prayer like litanies and the rosary. They tried to hold on to their ancestral faith as best they could. Archbishop Jean-Louis Cheverus told one family in Maine to "every day say your prayers on your knees with affection, and every Sunday gather to hear the Gospel, to pray in common, and to quiz the children on the catechism." Inevitably, some became Protestant, but many more stayed Catholic from generation to generation, with very little encouragement or sacramental ministry from the clergy. Archbishop John Carroll, the first American bishop, tried to make Church law flexible: shortening the length of the fast before Communion, easing the Lenten fast, and even relaxing the rule of Sabbath rest at harvest time. Catholicism in England had been guietly sustained in this way for two centuries, and the first American Catholics carried on as had their ancestors, providing a fertile soil for the unprecedented success and phenomenal growth of the Church in our country.

KNOCK, KNOCK

Having grown up in the 70's, it was fun to visit the home of a neighbor or friend from school when invited to his or her home. There you discovered another household with all the order and civility the family could accumulate. The housing track in Santa Clara where we lived had 4 standard designs. All of them were good floor plans, but some had custom accessories that the buyer could have installed for a nominal fee. One of those accessories was an intercom that was capable of allowing the resident to call from a box on the wall in order to remotely address the person knocking at the front door. Sometimes when visiting households built in the 70's I see that the family has yet

removed a control center like the ones I remember from of old. By most reports, suburban neighbors weren't quite ready for so much city living, and by most accounts, these systems usually broke down, were difficult to repair, and became relics before their time.

You might imagine that these systems have improved and improved they have. Many companies have present systems that are wireless ones. I don't suppose there's a need to explain the advantages of our present technology albeit at times fragile and inefficient—of course it all depends on the conditions.

Nevertheless, as you might guess, the Pastoral Ministry Office of St. Mary will have a new entry system based on one that is already in use at St. Mary School. With all the order and civility we can accumulate, I do hope you will welcome this change. Basically, instead of leaving the door to the main office unlocked, we now ask that you push the button to

ring the bell for the attendant to speak with you on an intercom and she or he will "buzz" you in for those of you unfamiliar with American idioms, that means, the door will be unlocked remotely so that you can enter; at which time you can open the door. This kind of change may seem an unwelcome one, even so as we assess the security and safety of children and staff, we are aware of due diligence in this regard. This is not the intercom system of homes in the 1970's I remember with such great nostalgia, and I hope it will not convenience anyone in need of our assistance.

We continue to adjust and get use to change even though it's never easy. Prudence is our best course in these matters, and time will give us the chance to become familiar with change. Thanks for reading these musings on intercom systems. May they not fail or disappoint anyone seek our assistance at St. Mary.

From the Diocese

As you saw this week, Bishop McGrath and the Diocese of San Jose released the names of clergy with credible allegations of sexual abuse of children as part of the commitment to transparency and accountability to assist in the process of reconciliation and healing for victims/ survivors.

With the release of the list, the Bishop expressed his deepest apologies for the actions of those who were in positions of authority and who violated that sacred trust by abusing children. The Bishop also voiced his commitment to continue to improve upon the vigilance, training, and prevention efforts that have been in place since 2002.

The Bishop personally encouraged other victims/survivors to come forward. Anyone who has been a victim of sexual abuse by anyone working on behalf of the Church is urged to contact civil authorities (police department or sheriff's office) and then to contact the Office for the Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults at 408-983-0113 or opcva.ethicspoint.com.



Visit The Church: Celebrating the Sacraments strengthens our friendship and bond with God. During mass, for example, we learn more about God by listening to his Word and meeting him in the Eucharist. Do not deprive children of even one Sunday Mass, make this a weekly ritual as a family.

Talk With God: At least once a day, pray as a family.
