A time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance.

A time to scatter stones, and a time to gather them; a time to embrace, and a time to be far from embraces.

Ecclesiastes 3:4-5

The author of Ecclesiastes understood our tendency for an emotional response to actions that flow from contrasting events. As part of the Wisdom literature in the Hebrew Scriptures—albeit an apocryphal text found only in Catholic Bibles—the author describes the human condition with seeming detached ease. The above text gives the reader a good sense of knowing how the events of life can fill us with great joy or immense sorrow. The author understood that for all the events in life there is a time and a purpose under heaven, and while we may not always understand the immediate meaning, we all hope that our existence will make sense in the end.

The now deceased folk singer/song writer Pete Seeger used these words to remind generations of listeners the importance of human wisdom. Our current cultural milieu may be less inclined towards wisdom because it does not really give any of us an advantage regarding our acquisitive nature. However, children seem to care more about wisdom because they can see the flaws of humans and the preventable disasters we create through our own hubris. If everyone listened to wisdom, we might find a way to create less suffering in this world and new solutions to the problems that continue to plague us. Towards the end of chapter 3, the author states, "I recognized that there is nothing better than to rejoice and to do well during life" though that may seem easier said than done.

Many have asked why Bishop Cantú is making new assignments to parishes at such an inopportune time. The practical answer is a matter of policy. Every pastor serving 12 years or more is subject to move, and he has every right to enact this policy with pastors—including those who have served less than 12 years. The wise answer is quite different. I read a quote from Meggan Roxanne recently; namely, "Your fear of the unknown has convinced you that comfort is more rewarding than growth." All of us will have to face the unknown at one time or another and be challenged to grow. This is the time for me to leave behind the comfort of what I know and love and to embrace the unknown to grow in faith.

To everything there is a time and purpose under heaven. May we never tire of the challenges that life brings and may we find meaning in our search for wisdom.

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today's celebration varies from place to place. In some parts of the United States, people gather for the Seventh Sunday of Easter, while other places celebrate the Ascension of the Lord. Several years ago, regions of bishops were permitted to decide whether to retain Ascension



Day on Thursday, the fortieth day after Easter, or to move the celebration to the nearest Sunday. This new flexibility in the Christian calendar has to do with the desire to gather the Church to celebrate its central feasts fully, and with the Eucharist. Increasingly, as priests serve remote and scattered parishes, this is not always possible mid-week.

The Ascension is a key moment for grasping what life in Christ is all about. It is not about a departure, but rather a plan for presence. We who are nourished by the Lord's body and blood in the Eucharist are transformed to be his abiding presence in the world. That is a truth so worth celebrating that we can adjust our calendar in order that the fullest possible gathering of the Church can be achieved.


