



8:30AM (in church & livestreamed) & 7:00PM (in church)

Ash Wednesday is a day of universal fast and abstinence in the Church.



THE SEASON OF LENT

Associated with Jesus' temptation in the desert (Mt 4:1-11, Mk 1:12-13, Lk 4:1-12), the 40 days of Lent are the Church's penitential season. It is a time for introspection and self-evaluation, a time for each of us to express sorrow for sins and to ask for the grace of conversion. Today, as in the early Church, Lent is a special period of preparation for those seeking baptism at Easter, while those who are already baptized should prepare for the Easter renewal of baptismal promises. Traditionally, Catholics observe the Lenten season by participating in the activities of fasting, praying, and almsgiving (works of mercy).

LENTEN REGULATIONS

- ♦ Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) years of age and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent
- ♦ Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics who are eighteen (18) years of age but not yet fifty-nine (59) years of age on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- ♦ All Catholics who have received their first communion must receive holy communion at least once a year during the Easter season (the "Easter duty")
- ♦ Catholics are also obligated to confess any serious (mortal) sins at least once a year. The Lenten season is an ideal time in which to fulfill this obligation.

SAINT OF THE WEEK – EXAMPLES OF OUR FAITH St. Katharine Drexel - March 3

With a family like hers, it's no wonder that St. Katharine Drexel (November 26, 1858 – March 3, 1955) grew up to become one of the first American-born saints.

Born in Philadelphia in 1858, her mother passed away when she was only five weeks old. Her father, a renowned banker, remarried a wonderful woman, and together they raised St. Katherine Drexel and her two sisters in a life of privilege. Both financially and spiritually well-endowed, the Drexels were devout Catholics and set an excellent example of true Christian servitude with prayer and care for the poor.

After her father's death, St. Katharine Drexel gave up her inheritance and instead devoted her life to the material and spiritual well-being of black and native Americans. Mother Drexel, as she would become known as, established the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored, and together they opened a boarding school in Santa Fe, the first of 50 missions for Native Americans in 16 states.

At 77, she suffered a heart attack and was forced to retire from active ministry. She spent the next 20 years of her life in quiet yet intense prayer. She died at the age of 96 and was canonized in 2000 by Pope John Paul II. ©LPi

LIVE THE LITURGY INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

"From the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks." What we say reveals so much about who we are. It discloses what is really going on within us: our integrity, priorities, depth of conscience, level of compassion and understanding of mercy. People whose speech is judgmental or overly critical usually reveal an interior life that is angry, unsettled, defensive, and shallow. Our speech communicates our sense of right and wrong, the strength of our relationship with God and how we feel about our fellow human beings. We are also quick to point out the faults of others, concentrating on their shortcomings and wrongdoings before our own. Only God fully understands what is going on inside the human heart. Only God can see the depth of a human soul. Perhaps it would do us well to consider what may be happening inside our brothers and sisters and temper our critical speech of what we see occurring outside. Looking within will also help us identify our own sins and weakness so that we can be better positioned to offer the type of wisdom and compassionate guidance that can really be of help to our friends. IN-PERSON LISTENING SESSION: March 10, 6:30pm

You're being asked to participate because you are a valuable member of our Church! We warmly welcome you to join us for an inperson listening session at St. Mary where, guided by the Holy Spirit, we will reflect, share and listen to one another.

Join us on March 10, 6:30 pm at St. Mary for our in-person Synod Listening Session. Pope Francis invites us to be part of a Synod that begins with listening sessions in local churches and religious communities around the world and will culminate in a meting of bishops in Rome in 2023.

Our listening session will follow a common goal and format established for all parishes in the Diocese of San Jose.

In this intentional process of mutual listening, we want to involve everyone - young and old, in every role and ministry, even those who are not active.

GUIDING QUESTIONS FOR OUR LISTENING SESSION:

We will be considering these questions:

- Where and how do you personally experience Church today?
- What joys do you experience?
- What difficulties and obstacles have you encountered?
- What insights do you have?
- What is your dream or vision for our church in the future?
- Are there any aspects of the Church's evangelizing mission that you would like to see?
- How do you value the Church's social mission to care for the poor and marginalized, as well as its efforts to address poverty and social change?

WHAT TO EXPECT AT ST. MARY LISTENING SESSION

- ♦ Plan to spend 2 hours together
- ◆ Small Groups No matter how many people show up, we'll break into groups of no more than 10 people.
- ♦ Timing From our initial welcoming with prayer to our final closing, we plan to spend 2 hours together.
- Respectful Sharing A small group facilitator will guide the process for each small group.
- Each person will have 3 minutes of uninterrupted time to say what is important to them.
- We will reflect silently on what everyone says and then have an opportunity to speak, one at a time. Our emphasis will be on respectful listening to each other.







