REFLECT & RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

We have been given so many gifts and blessings by our Heavenly Father. Yet, in our fallen state it is all too easy to take them for granted. Our readings today teach us that we must live with an intentional awareness of our many blessings and use them gratefully to glorify God.

Our First Reading, from Isaiah, foreshadows today's Gospel passage. Both passages employ images of a landowner and his vineyard. The First Reading tells the story of a landowner who, with great love and care, creates the perfect vineyard and fills it with the choicest vines. Yet, it fails to produce good fruit. As a result, the landowner allows the vineyard to go to ruin. This is a reminder that while Our Heavenly Father is merciful and kind, He is also just. As Christian stewards, we must continuously fight the tendency towards complacency and instead use our blessings to produce good fruit.

Our Second Reading, from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians, is a reminder of one key blessing that is surprisingly easy to take for granted — the gift of our thought life. Our intellect is a gift from God and we are called to steward it well. Lack of discipline in our thoughts can easily lead us down a path of discontentment and fear. St. Paul instructs us rather to "have no anxiety at all." How are we to do this? He tells us, "In everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God." And as it turns out, by turning our thoughts towards God with gratitude, we will be blessed immediately. Paul continues, "Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

Paul gives specific advice for intentionally maintaining an attitude of gratitude in our thought life. "Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, and if there is anything worthy of praise" these are the things we should focus on. As we develop this habit we will discover a powerful way to navigate life with peace and joy despite the troubles that surround us.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, we return to the image of a vineyard in a parable Jesus uses to teach the importance of using our blessings well. It is the story of a landowner who plants a vineyard and leases it to tenants before he goes on a journey. Instead of tending the vineyard, the tenants mistreat the servants in the vineyard and even the son of the landowner, whom they kill. When the landowner realizes what the tenants have done, he puts them to death and leases his vineyard to tenants who "will give him the produce at the proper times."

By Baptism, we have received the gift of salvation and membership in Kingdom of God — we are now "tenants" called to work in the "vineyard" and produce fruit for its owner, our Heavenly Father. This calling is a gift from God to be treasured above all other gifts. Jesus makes it clear that if we squander the gift of salvation, we will lose it. It is a sobering truth.

So let us live each day with a profound awareness of all that we have been given by God. Let us use our intellect to think on these gifts throughout the day and resolve to use all our gifts for God's glory. We will find peace, joy and purpose as we do.







SAINT OF THE WEEK: VENERABLE ALPHONSE GALLEGOS



Alphonse Gallegos was born on February 20, 1931, in Albuquerque, New Mexico. One of 11 children, he struggled with vision problems as a child but, after many surgeries, his myopic condition partially healed. While serving as an altar server at his parish, he came to know the Augustine Recollects. He joined as a novitiate and relocated to Kansas City, Kansas when he was 19.

Following his ordination, he served as a hospital chaplain and at various parishes until he eventually moved to Sacramento, California and was appointed the Director of the Division of Hispanic Affairs of the California Catholic Conference.

Two years after this appointment, in 1981, Father Gallegos was ordained auxiliary bishop for the Diocese of Sacramento. In 1983, he was also appointed as pastor of the National Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe. While serving in his community, he befriended countless neighbors and community

leaders as well as those who were underprivileged and in need. He championed minority groups in his community and also belonged to his local chapter of the Knights of Columbus. In the evenings he would minister to gang members and those at risk in the impoverished neighborhoods of Los Angeles and Sacramento wearing a 99-cent sombrero and a t-shirt to fit in. He became well loved by the region and was affectionately called the Bishop of the Barrios which can be translated to the Bishop of the Neighborhoods and was welcomed as a chaplain-of-sorts for migrant workers and the city's lowrider car community.

On October 6, 1991, at age 60, while pushing his stalled car to the side of the road with his volunteer driver steering, Bishop Gallegos was struck by another vehicle and thrown 50 feet, dying instantly. His funeral procession included some 300 lowrider cars and hundreds of his friends and neighbors. The city of Sacramento named a section of Eleventh St. the Gallegos Square in his memory. In 2016, Pope Francis recognized Bishop Gallegos' heroic virtues and named him Venerable.

LITURGY: PLACE OF ENCOUNTER

Do you want to meet Jesus?

Pope Francis has written, "if we had somehow arrived in Jerusalem after Pentecost and had felt the desire not only to have information about Jesus of Nazareth but rather the desire still to be able to meet him, we would have had no other possibility than that of searching out his disciples so that we could hear his words and see his gestures, more alive than ever.... That which was visible in Jesus, that which could be seen with the eyes and touched with the hands, his words and gestures, the concreteness of the incarnate Word— everything of Him had passed into the celebration of the sacraments." (Desiderio Desideravi, 9). In other words, liturgy is the place of encounter. Liturgy is where we meet Christ. In fact, Pope Francis says, "The Liturgy guarantees for us the possibility of such an encounter" (11, emphasis added).

Liturgy comes from a Greek term that means "work of the people" or "public work." For Catholics, "liturgy" refers to the formal worship offered by the Church and includes the Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, celebrations of the sacraments, rites, and blessings.

The bread that you see on the altar is the Body of Christ as soon as it is sanctified by God's word. The chalice, or better what is contained in the chalice, is the Blood of Christ as soon as it is sanctified by God's word, St. Augustine

The definition of liturgy as "work" is worth pondering. Catholic isn't just something we are—
Catholic is something we do. Faith is not passive; faith is lived. Through the ordered and repeated patterns of the liturgy, we enter into the tradition of the Church and touch the mystery of faith.

But the true "work" of the liturgy is what God does. (Saint Benedict referred to liturgy as Opus Dei, work of God!) It is Christ who gathers the community together, Christ who fills and gives meaning to the rites and makes them fruitful. The Church, united with Christ, offers with Christ the eternal sacrifice to the Father.

When we all come together for the liturgy, we are much more than a crowd that gathers for a concert, sporting event, or lecture. We are not spectators, but a worshiping assembly, being formed, by Christ, into the very body of Christ. And our presence is no accident. As Pope Francis writes of the apostles at the Last Supper, "no one had earned a place at that Supper. All had been invited. Or better said: all had been drawn there by the burning desire that Jesus had to eat that Passover with them" (DD, 4). As we hear in Eucharistic Prayer III, "look graciously upon this family, whom you have summoned before you."

So what is the liturgy? Liturgy is God gathering his people together to offer worship through, with, and in Christ. Liturgy follows patterns, many of which are extremely ancient. Liturgy speaks many languages—not only spoken language, but also the languages of movement, sound, silence, gesture, and symbol. Liturgy employs many different art forms—music, poetry, architecture, and rhetoric, among others. In short, liturgy does not exist on paper. Liturgy is something that happens, when Christ gathers a community in prayer.
