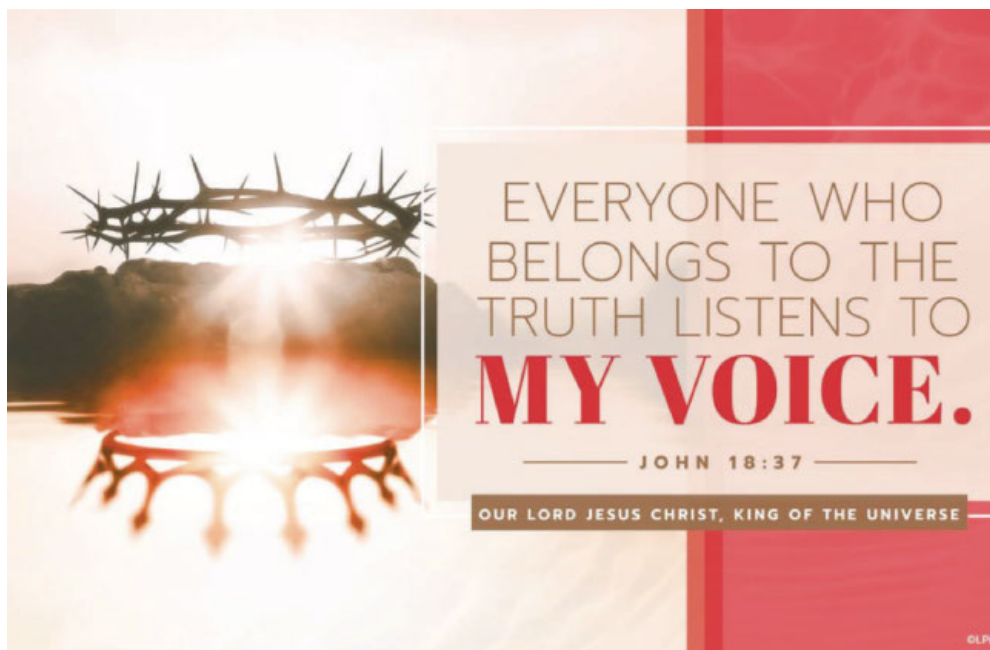

## REFLECT & RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

### TODAY'S READINGS

Daniel:7:13-14;

Psalms 93;

Revelation 1:5-8;

John 18:33b-37

#### First Reading:

Daniel had visions of Jesus ("Son of man") receiving everlasting dominion, glory, and kingship from God ("the Ancient One"). *Why do you think some people receive visions?*

#### Second Reading:

Revelation teaches that Jesus loves us and has made us into a kingdom of priests for God. *What do you think Jesus expects from us in return?*

#### Gospel:

In his trial Jesus tells Pilate he was born to testify to the truth. *Can you think of a time in your life when you had to tell a difficult truth to someone?*

Today is our last Sunday of Ordinary Time for this liturgical year, as we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King.

This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, at a time when the world was experiencing a rise of secularism, materialism and individualism and an increasing denial of Christ's existence and authority. The hope was that the establishment of this feast would accomplish three goals: that nations would see that the Church has the right to freedom, that leaders and nations would see that they are required to give respect to Christ, the King of kings, and that the faithful would be strengthened and encouraged by the reminder that Christ must reign in our hearts, minds, wills, and bodies.

Our First Reading, from Daniel, predicts a time when Christ will indeed "receive dominion, glory and kingship" and "all peoples, nations, and languages will serve him in an everlasting dominion that will never be destroyed."

The Second Reading, from Revelation, describes Christ as ruler of the kings of the earth and describes the day when He will come "amid the clouds and every eye will see him." In the Gospel we hear the words of Christ Himself. As He is questioned by Pilate, Christ declares, "My kingdom does not belong to this world" but that He "came into the world to testify to the truth."

This feast is needed more than ever for all people and for us especially, as Christian stewards. It reminds us of three vital truths.

First, even when it seems the world is spinning out of control, we need not fear because we have a King of kings who is very much in charge and who is loving, merciful and just.

Second, if Christ is king of all, then He is also king of me, personally. I am not "lord" of my time, talents, and treasure. He is. I am a servant of the King and a steward of His gifts to me.

Third, as His disciple, I am called to imitate my King. Christ's kingship is characterized by humble service, by emptying Himself for the good of others.

The Scriptures tell us He went about doing good and He says of Himself, "I came not to be served but to serve." How can I live in any other way than as a humble servant like my King?

We are on the verge of a new Church year and the holy season of Advent, and this week is an ideal time to take stock of our priorities, to see if we really are allowing Christ to reign in all aspects of our daily lives; to ask if He comes first in our schedules, our budgets, the use of our skills and talents. It's also a great moment to celebrate! We are not only servants of Christ the King, but we are also His brothers and sisters. This should fill us with great joy.

After celebrating the Holy Eucharist, take some time to celebrate at home, too. Bake a cake, take a walk, put on some music and dance with your kids. Christ is King!

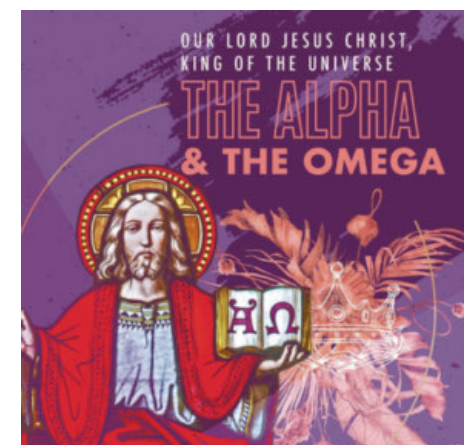

You in Holy Communion. Amen.*

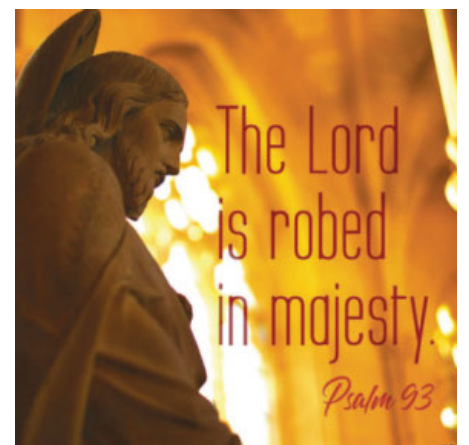

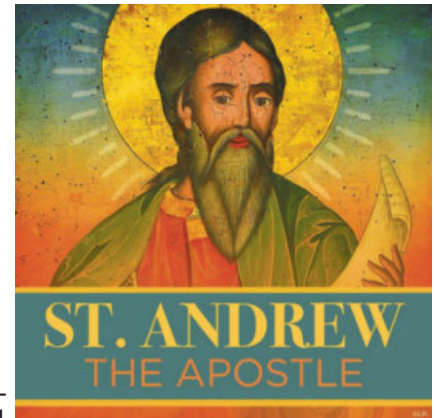

### SAINT ANDREW | NOVEMBER 30

Saint Andrew was a fisherman in Galilee, along with his brother, Peter, when they were called by Jesus to leave their boat and become fishers of men. John's Gospel also places him as a follower of John the Baptist before he came to be one of Jesus' twelve Disciples. Beyond the scant references in the Gospels, not much is known of Saint Andrew's life.

According to Christian tradition Saint Andrew, like many of his fellow Disciples, went out into Greece and Turkey to preach the Good News. A 4th century account of the saint's life tells of his martyrdom by crucifixion in Patras. Medieval accounts describe the cross used as X-shaped because Andrew said he was not worthy to die on the same style of cross as Jesus.

Famously, Saint Andrew is the patron Saint of Scotland, the country's flag bearing the X-shaped cross associated with him. Legends claim that the saint either traveled to Scotland to spread the Gospel or that his relics were brought there by St. Regulus who had a vision telling him to take the bones to the end of the earth. Regulus set out and was shipwrecked on the coast of Scotland. Today relics of St. Andrew which had been held by the Vatican are now at a shrine in Patras.



### SIGN OF THE CROSS



We often make the Sign of the Cross as we begin and end our prayers, when we celebrate the Holy Mass, for others when they leave their homes or before driving their cars, or even when passing by a church. Actually, the Sign of the Cross is in itself a very short prayer. With it, we appeal to God to make our prayers worthwhile and, at the same time, we profess two

truths: the first is the deepest mysteries of the Christian faith which is the Holy Trinity - the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. When we say "In the name of," we profess that we believe that there is one God. We don't say "In the names of" stating it in singular and not plural. When we say, "the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," we state that we believe that in one God there are three Divine Persons. The second truth that we profess is the saving work of Christ on the Cross. This is shown as we trace the cross from our forehead to our breast and from our shoulder to shoulder. This short prayer of words and action is not just a statement of our belief, but it is a vow to defend that belief, even if it means taking our own cross to follow Jesus, our Lord and Savior.

*Did you know?*

The Feast of Christ the King was instituted in 1925 to address growing attitudes of secularism and atheism and to proclaim Christ's kingship forever. The day also marks the final Sunday on the Church's Liturgical Calendar.

### DISPENSATION IN THE DIOCESE OF SAN JOSÉ OF THE SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION

Bishop Cantú grants dispensation of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception Holy Day of Obligation celebration. Since December 8 falls on the Second Sunday of Advent, the celebration of the Solemnity will be transferred to Monday, December 9. The Holy See has recently clarified that the obligation to attend Mass on this solemnity remains. However, given the relatively short notice of this clarification, in the Diocese of San José, in accordance with Canon 87, §1, Bishop Cantú is granting a dispensation, this year only, to the Catholic Faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Monday, December 9.
