REFLECT & RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

TODAY'S READINGS

Jeremiah:33:14-16;
Psalm 25;
1 Thessalonians
3:12—4:2;
Luke 21:25-28, 34-36

First Reading:

The prophet Jeremiah speaks of God's promise to save Jerusalem so all can "dwell safely" in the land. *Where in your life do you feel the safest?*

Second Reading:

In preparation for the return of Jesus, Paul prayed that the believers in Thessalonica would love one another and conduct themselves in a way pleasing to God. *As we enter the season of Advent, what could you do to actively prepare for the return of Jesus?*

Gospel:

Jesus forewarns his disciples not to let the daily anxieties of life distract them from the coming day of his return. *Who helps you when you are overcome with anxiety?*

We have arrived at the powerful season of Advent, a season to prepare with awe and gratitude for the Feast of the Incarnation of Jesus, born to us as Savior and Brother. A season to prepare for His return at the end of time. It is also a moment to remind ourselves that our individual judgment day is coming, too — the moment when we will be called to give an account for all the love God has shown us and the gifts He has given us during our lifetime.

An important document on stewardship published by the Diocese of Wichita titled The Pillars of Parish Stewardship says, "God reveals His perfect and infinite love for us most visibly in His son, Jesus Christ. A steward makes God's love visible by imitating Jesus... Stewardship is the response of the disciple to God's unconditional love for us. Stewards bask in the wonder and awe of God's love" Or, in other words, Advent is a steward's season!

Our readings for the first week of Advent waste no time in calling our urgent attention to these themes of reflection and preparation. They seem to shout, "Wake up! Get ready!" and offer us some practical advice to make the most of this Season.

The Gospel from Luke warns, "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life."

How easy it is to lose focus on our Lord either by too much indulgence in our lives or by too much worry about our lives. Both extremes are easy to fall prey to. To avoid these traps, we are told to "be vigilant" and "pray for strength to sustain us."

During Advent, we Christian stewards must ask ourselves some hard questions. Am I staying faithful to my prayer life? Am I using my energy and skills to serve others? Am I overly concerned about material gain? Am I relying on my "stuff" or my investments as my source of comfort or security? Am I living for the moment or for the coming of the Lord?

Our Second Reading from Thessalonians offers us a beautiful Advent prayer as we move through this season of reflection and preparation. Let us make it our prayer for each other: "May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all... so as to strengthen your hearts, to be blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming our Lord Jesus with all his holy ones. Amen."

Get ready Christian stewards! He's coming! Let us prepare with awe and wonder.

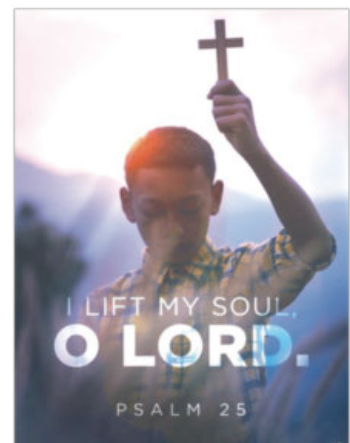

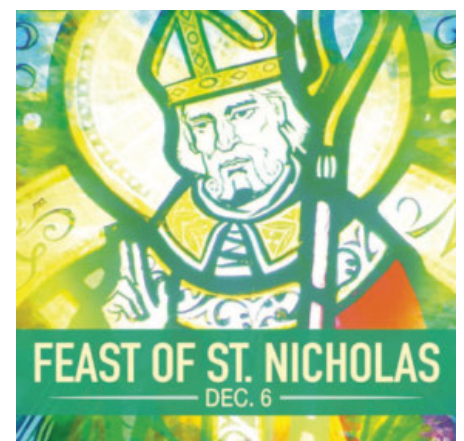

PRAYERS FOR LIGHTING THE ADVENT WREATH CANDLES

It's time to bring out and bless the Advent wreath! The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead.

When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another member of the family.

FIRST WEEK

All-powerful God, increase our strength of will for doing good that Christ may find an eager welcome at his coming and call us to his side in the kingdom of heaven, where he lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen.

WHAT DO WE REMEMBER EACH WEEK OF ADVENT?



FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT: HOPE

The first candle on the Advent wreath represents Hope - the first Sunday of Advent not only leads us to anticipate the birth of Christ but celebrate the beginning of a new liturgical season as well. It is purple, the primary color of Advent and a color symbolizing royalty. Sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle" the first candle harkens us back to Isaiah's foretelling of the birth of Christ and all of the promises God gave us in the Old Testament that would be fulfilled by the birth of Jesus



THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT: JOY

The third candle of Advent symbolizes Joy. As we continue to approach Christmas Day, our joy grows more and more. It takes us back to the joyful anticipation of the shepherds who journeyed to see Jesus in Bethlehem, even before the wise men. On this third Sunday of Advent, which the Church calls "Gaudete Sunday," meaning rejoice or praise, we light the third candle and rejoice like the shepherds. For this reason, it is called the "Shepherd's Candle," and its color is pink, the liturgical color for joy.



SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT: PEACE

The second candle on the Advent wreath represents Peace and is also purple. Often called the "Bethlehem Candle," this candle reminds us of Mary and Joseph's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem before Mary gave birth to Jesus. It also builds on the meaning of the Prophecy Candle, recalling that after the division, destruction, and dispersion of the kingdom in the Old Testament, there might finally be peace on Earth.



FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT: LOVE

The fourth candle of Advent represents Love, the ultimate love of God that He might send His only Son for us. Called the "Angel's Candle," the fourth candle of Advent is lit the Sunday before Christmas, and it is the color purple, leading us to eagerly await the new Kingdom of God on earth

SECOND WEEK

God of power and mercy open our hearts in welcome. Remove the things that hinder us from receiving Christ with joy so that we may share his wisdom and become one with him when he comes in glory, for he lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

THIRD WEEK

Lord God, may we, your people, who look forward to the birthday of Christ experience the joy of salvation and celebrate that feast with love and thanksgiving. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

FOURTH WEEK

All-powerful God, your eternal Word took flesh on our earth when the Virgin Mary placed her life at the service of your plan. Lift our minds in watchful hope to hear the voice which announces his glory and open our minds to receive the Spirit who prepares us for his coming. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Bishop Oscar Cantú will celebrate a diocesan Mass in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe at Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish.

JUBILEE YEAR 2025 - The Holy Father has decided that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee, something which happens every 25 years. The theme is "Pilgrims of Hope," and it will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, and a climate crisis.

The 2025 Jubilee will officially open on December 24, 2024, at 7 pm with a Mass presided over by Pope Francis in St. Peter's Square. The rite of the Opening of the Holy Door will follow.

DISPENSATION IN THE DIOCESE OF SAN JOSÉ OF THE SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION

Bishop Cantú grants dispensation of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception Holy Day of Obligation celebration. Since December 8 falls on the Second Sunday of Advent, the celebration of the Solemnity will be transferred to Monday, December 9. The Holy See has recently clarified that the obligation to attend Mass on this solemnity remains. However, given the relatively short notice of this clarification, in the Diocese of San José, in accordance with Canon 87, §1, Bishop Cantú is granting a dispensation, this year only, to the Catholic Faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Monday, December 9.
