TODAY'S READINGS

Zephaniah 3: 14-18a;

Psalm Is 12:

Philippians 4:4-7;

Luke 3:10-18

"Rejoice in the Lord always, I shall say it again: rejoice!"

We have arrived at Gaudete Sunday (Gaudete is the Latin word for "rejoice") this Third Week of Advent, and the Scriptures take on a joyful tone as we continue our preparations for the feast of our Savior's birth and ultimately for His Second Coming.

Our First Reading, from Zephaniah, certainly gives us cause to rejoice. "Fear not... be not discouraged! The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a mighty savior." Even more cause for joy, this Savior delights in us — "He will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in His love, He will sing joyfully because of you." How can we not be moved by a God who pursues us, who comes to us as Savior, and who actually sings for joy over us!

Our Second Reading gives still more cause for joy as St. Paul reminds us, "The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all." Then he gives us a prescription for maintaining this peace: "In everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

Paul's instructions for obtaining peace come as an early Christmas gift. They remind us that we can and should go to God with all our needs and present them to Him along with our thanks. This guidance calls to mind a vital aspect of a stewardship way of life: gratitude to God in response to His great love and countless gifts to us.

The Gospel passage, from Luke, shows us how to live out this sense of thankfulness, making our lives a "Christmas gift" to Christ in joyful response to His love for us. When the crowds hear John the Baptist's message that their Savior is coming, they ask him what they should do to prepare. He responds, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do the same." He tells tax collectors to stop collecting more than is prescribed and soldiers, to be satisfied with their wages. In other words, he tells them to be good and generous stewards of all God's gifts to them!

As the great feast of Christmas draws near, let us rejoice in Christ's extravagant love. Let's avail ourselves of the peace He longs to give us. And let's look carefully at our lives to make sure we are indeed making of them a gift fitting for Him. When we get this "gift" right, all the other gifts and todo's on our Christmas list will fall into their proper place.







OUR CATHOLIC FAITH



The O Antiphons hold a significant place in the final week of Advent. These ancient prayers have their origins in the 8th century and are traditionally sung or recited during the Vespers service in the Liturgy of the Hours. Each antiphon addresses Christ with a different title, reflecting various aspects of His identity and mission.

These titles include "O Wisdom," "O Leader of Israel," "O Root of Jesse," "O Key of David," "O Radiant Dawn," "O King of All," and "O Emmanuel." Each title reveals a unique characteristic of Christ and invites us to contemplate His role in our lives.

The O Antiphons serve as a powerful way to prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of Christ. They invite us to reflect on the profound wisdom and leadership of Christ, the fulfillment of the promises made to Israel, and His role as the key to salvation. They also remind us of the hope and light that Christ brings into the world, as well as His ultimate reign as King.

By praying the O Antiphons, we can deepen our understanding of Christ and open ourselves to His transformative presence in our lives. So let us embark on this journey of prayer and reflection, as we prepare to welcome the birth of our Savior.



NATIVITY SCENE PRAYER



JUBILEE YEAR 2025 - The Holy Father has decided that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee, something which happens every 25 years. The theme is "Pilgrims of Hope," and it will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, and a climate crisis.

The 2025 Jubilee will officially open on December 24, 2024, at 7 pm with a Mass presided over by Pope Francis in St. Peter's Square. The rite of the Opening of the Holy Door will follow.

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 14 @ 7:00 PM AT ST. JULIE **BILLIART PARISH**. The mass will be presided by Bishop Oscar Cantú. There will be Blessing of Parols (lantern) and a reception following the Mass. The Simbang Gabi Kick-off Mass is hosted by The Diocesan Council of Filipino Catholics (DCFC). Simbang Gabi is a devotional, nine-day series of Masses

attended by Filipino Catholics as a spiritual preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ on Christmas.

The Spanish missionaries brought the practice to deepen the faith of the people of the Philippines. The Simbang Gabi, a novena of Mass, first introduced in Mexico, was known as Misa de Gallo. The Masses were celebrated as early as 4:00 a.m. to allow farmers to participate in the liturgy before they went to the fields. Simbang Gabi is a long Catholic tradition among many Filipinos not only in the Philippines but all over
