


St. Blaise lived in the 4<sup>th</sup> century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The

legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

TODAY'S READINGS

Malachi 3:1-4:

Psalm 24;

Hebrews 2:14-18;

Luke 2:22-40

Today we celebrate the **Feast of the Presentation of the Lord**, when Mary and Joseph brought their infant Son to the Temple in obedience to the laws of their Jewish faith. This is a beautiful, and in many ways, mysterious feast - and one that is filled with lessons for a stewardship way of life.

Our first reading, from the book of Malachi, includes a prophecy of the event we celebrate today. "Lo, I am sending my messenger [a reference to John the Baptist] to prepare the way before me; And suddenly there will come to the temple the Lord whom you seek..." Our first lesson is contained in that verse, "the Lord home you seek." Do we truly seek the Lord through the prioritizing of our relationship with Him above everything (and everyone) else in our lives? If we want to know Him and His will for our lives, we must spend time with Him in daily prayer, regular participation in the sacraments, and the study of our faith. Only in this way will be ready when he "suddenly appears" in our lives — perhaps through a new opportunity to serve Him or an unexpected difficulty or blessing He wants to entrust to us. This is how a steward stays "spiritually fit" for whatever God may be asking of him or her next.

Our second reading, from Hebrews, is a poignant lesson in why we should embrace the stewardship way of life as both a true privilege and a serious responsibility. It reminds us that our Lord "had to become like his brothers and sisters in every way" and further that "because He himself was tested through what He suffered, He is able to help those being tested." What amazing intimacy our Lord desires to have with us, and what amazing humility and love He shows us in His incarnation and the suffering He chose to take on for us. Of course, we can trust Him with ourselves and our gifts! Truly, how can we have any hesitation to do so for a Savior who has done so much to prove His love for us?

Our Gospel passage from Luke, recounting the details of the Presentation of our Lord, teaches us a stewardship lesson through the example of St. Joseph and the Blessed Mother, the "Holy Parents." Even knowing their Son was God, they still carefully observed the faith practices of their day bringing him to the temple "to present Him to the Lord just as it is written in the law of the Lord." Later in the passage we read that, "When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to their own town of Nazareth." The Holy Parents were good stewards of their child, teaching Him to live in obedience to the practices of their faith from his infancy and throughout His "growing up" years. Those of us entrusted with the care of children, whether our own children, godchildren, nieces, and nephews, grandchildren, or students, have a vital role to play in the faith formation of these young ones. We, like the Holy Parents, must steward these children well, forming them in the faith by both instruction and example throughout their lives.

What a privilege and high calling we have as Christian stewards. Let us take these stewardship lessons to heart and present our gifts and our young ones joyfully to the Lord.

You in Holy Communion. Amen.


## LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes and is an important opportunity for those who serve in Catholic health ministry to reflect on caring for those who are sick as well as those who provide care to them.

#### **JUBILEE YEAR 2025**

#### JUBILEE PRAYER: PILGRIMS OF HOPE

In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII called the first Jubilee, also known as a "Holy Year," a time in which God's holiness transforms us. The frequency of Holy Years has changed over time: initially celebrated every 100 years, Pope Clement VI reduced the interval to every 50 years in 1343, and Pope Paul II further shortened it to every 25 years in 1470. By participating in the Holy Year, the faithful are granted a plenary indulgence. Below is the Jubilee prayer composed by Pope Francis.

Father in heaven, may the faith you have given us in your son, Jesus Christ, our brother, and the flame of charity enkindled in our hearts by the Holy Spirit, reawaken in us the blessed hope for the coming of your Kingdom.

May your grace transform us into tireless cultivators of the seeds of the Gospel.

May those seeds transform from within both humanity and the whole cosmos in the sure expectation of a new heaven and a new earth, when, with the powers of Evil vanquished, your glory will shine eternally.

May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, a yearning for the treasures of heaven. May that same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth.

To you, our God, eternally blessed, be glory and praise forever. Amen.

#### JUBILEE PLENARY INDULGENCE

The plenary indulgence has been a key feature of Holy Years for centuries within the Church. It is a remission of the temporal punishment due to sin, obtained by adhering to the norms established for a given Jubilee Year. In the *Decree on the Granting of the Indulgence During the Ordinary Jubilee Year 2025* issued by His

Holiness Pope Francis, the Holy Father invites "everyone to an intense experience of the love of God." He emphasizes that the gift of the indulgence is "a way of discovering the unlimited nature of God's mercy. Not by chance, for the ancients, the terms 'mercy' and 'indulgence' were interchangeable, as expressions of the fullness of God's forgiveness, which knows no bounds" (Spes non Confundit, 23).

During the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, all previously granted indulgences will remain in effect. Additionally, all faithful who are truly repentant, free from attachment to sin, and moved by a spirit of charity can obtain a plenary indulgence under the following conditions:

- ♦ Purification through the Sacrament of Penance
- **♦** Reception of Holy Communion
- ♦ Prayers offered for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff

This plenary indulgence, accompanied by the remission and forgiveness of all sins, can also be applied in suffrage for the souls in Purgatory. The faithful may obtain it in the following ways:

#### 1. PILGRIMAGES

Visits to the four major Basilicas in Rome, the three major Basilicas in the Holy Land, or local diocesan Cathedrals (e.g., the Cathedral Basilica of Saint Joseph in the Diocese of San Jose).

#### 2. PIOUS VISITS TO SACRED PLACES

Engaging in Eucharistic adoration and meditation. Concluding prayers with the *Our Father*, a Profession of Faith (in any legitimate form), and invocations to Mary, the Mother of God. Pope Francis highlights that during this Holy Year, all the faithful "will come to know the closeness of Mary, the most affectionate of mothers, who never abandons her children" (*Spes non Confundit, 24*).

#### 3. WORKS OF MERCY AND PENANCE

Participation in popular missions, spiritual exercises, or formation activities focused on the documents of the Second Vatican Council and the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. These activities should be held in a church or other suitable place and follow the intentions of the Holy Father. Through these practices, the Jubilee Year 2025 becomes a profound opportunity for renewal and an invitation to immerse oneself in the fullness of God's mercy.
