

TODAY'S READINGS

Acts 15:1-2, 22-29;

Psalm 67;

Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23;

John 14:23-29

The concept of hospitality is fundamental to a stewardship way of life. When we envision hospitality, we naturally think of offering a sincere and warm welcome — to those new to our parish, for instance. We picture inviting them in and making them feel at home and at ease in our presence, communicating to them that they are highly valued.

Today's Gospel reading from John invites us to think of hospitality in a slightly different way. In it, we hear Jesus speaking this to his disciples: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him."

Jesus is asking that we permit the Blessed Trinity to come and dwell within us. This is a stunning request. It tells us that our first and most privileged form of hospitality should be directed towards God Himself.

How does one show hospitality to God? How do we make God "at home and at ease" within us? How can we communicate to God that He is "highly valued" by us? Jesus tells us how: we are to keep His word, to follow HIs teachings.


To keep His word, we must know His word. This takes discipline and effort on our part. We must make the study of Scripture and Church teaching a priority in our daily lives. This can be done in small and simple ways. Perhaps you can commit to setting your alarm ten minutes early to meditate on the day's Gospel. Perhaps you could read a paragraph of the Catechism with your family at dinner. You could pray over a portion of the Psalms before going to bed at night. You can join (or start!) a Bible study right here at the parish. There are many ways to grow in knowledge and love of God's word.

Over time these simple practices can radically change one's life. We will begin to more easily think like Jesus, respond like Jesus, and live like Jesus. We really will form our minds, hearts, and souls into a place where the Blessed Trinity is pleased to dwell.

How is this possible? Because we have an Unseen Teacher with us as we seek to know and keep God's word. Jesus tells us so later in this same Gospel passage. "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." Ask the Holy Spirit to show you when and how you can get to know God's word in your particular circumstances and then commit to it!

If we want our parish to be a place of genuine Christian hospitality, we must be sure that our own hearts are hospitable dwelling places for the Blessed Trinity. Then our smiles and words, our greetings and ministries will radiate with the warmth of God's love. And our parish family will become at least a little bit like Heaven on earth. This is the simplicity and glory of a stewardship way of life.


My Jesus, I believe you



OUR CATHOLIC FAITH



Pope Leo XIV's coat of arms offers a clear reflection of his Augustinian roots and the values he seeks to promote during his pontificate, particularly unity and communion within the Church.

The shield is divided diagonally into two sections. The upper half features a blue background with a white lily.

The lower half of the shield has a light background and displays an image that recalls the Order of Saint Augustine: a closed book with a heart pierced by an arrow. This is a direct reference to the conversion experience of Saint Augustine himself, who described his personal encounter with God's Word using the phrase: "Vulnerasti cor meum verbo tuo" - "You have pierced my heart with your Word."

Pope Leo XIV has also chosen a motto that reflects this Augustinian tradition: In Illo uno unum, which means "In the One, we are one." The phrase is taken from Saint Augustine's Exposition on Psalm 127, where he explains that "although we Christians are many, in the one Christ we are one."

SYMBOLS OF PAPAL DIGNITY

The same symbols used by his predecessor Francis - the mitre above (symbolizing papal authority) crossed keys of gold (representing spiritual power) and silver (representing and silver (representing temporal power), bound by a red cord (signifying unity and bond between spiritual and temporal aspects) - signify the authority entrusted to Peter's successor, representing the Pope's role as the supreme leader of the Church and his connection to the apostolic

A WHITE LILY (FLEUR DE LIS) ON A BLUE FIELD

Evokes the Blessed Virgin Mary, symbolizing her Immaculate purity, virginal innocence, and devoted flat. This emblematic representation highlights the Pope's profound devotion to Our Lady, underscoring her role as a model of evangelical humility, perfect surrender to the Divine Will, and maternal intercession for the Church, inspiring the Pope's own faith, pastoral charity, and apostolic

THE AUGUSTINIAN **EMBLEM**

A flaming heart pierced by an arrow, resting atop a book that represents the Sacred Sacred symbolizing Scriptures, Augustine's transformative conversion through the illuminating power of divine conversion grace. The heart ablaze with ardent love for God and neighbor signifies the fervor of divine charity, while the arrow represents the gentle yet piercing call of the Holy Spirit, guiding Augustine's journey to deeper faith and intimacy with the Sacred Heart of Christ. This rich symbolism points to the core of Augustinian spirituality: a deep interior life, love of neighbor, and pursuit of truth.







THE MOTTO

prawn from the inspired commentary of Saint Augustine on Psalm 127, beautifully encapsulates the essence of his papal vision: "In Him who is One, we are one." These profound words reflect the Church's unity in doctrine and sacramental life, beautiful to the professional to the professi unity in doctrine and sacramental life, bound together by the profession of the same one true Faith, despite the frailties and divisions that mark its human dimension. This motto eloquently expresses the supernatural communion rooted in Christ's redeeming love, which fosters brotherhood, reconciliation, and evangelical charity, even amidst the most complex pastoral challenges. It is fitting that Pope Leo XIII underscored this vision of a Church as a bridge of salvation, called to transcend earthly divisions, facilitate encounters of mercy and forgiveness, and proclaim the Gospel of hope to all nations.


ILM - NEW ACADEMIC YEAR BEGINS SEPTEMBER
