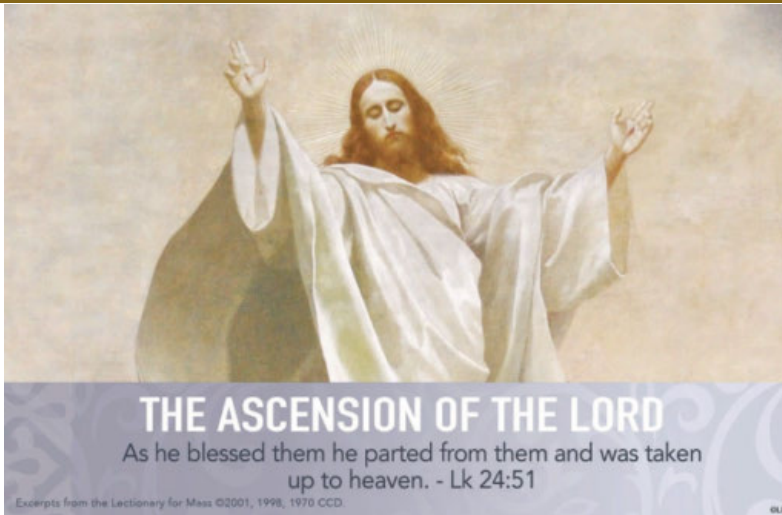

REFLECT & RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

First Reading:

As Stephen was being martyred, we hear how he forgave those who were stoning him to death.

When have you found it hard to forgive someone?

Second Reading:

The Book of Revelation (and the entire Bible) concludes with John's prayer of petition: "Come, Lord Jesus!" *Is there something you really need from the Lord?*

Gospel:

Jesus speaks of believers as God's gift to him. *What gift might you offer this week to a family member or friend?*

On this Feast of the Ascension, we celebrate Christ's triumphant return to the Father after perfectly accomplishing His mission on earth. But we also can also view this Feast as a celebration of the "launch day" of our commissioning as Christ's disciples.

Both the First Reading and today's Gospel draw our attention to the clear instructions that Jesus gave His disciples just before ascending to the Father. In the First Reading, from Acts, He tells them (and us) "you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Then in the Gospel, from Luke, we read, "Jesus said to his disciples: 'Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.'"

Embracing a stewardship way of life, with its emphasis on the use of time, talent, and treasure, helps us to live in such a way that our very lives speak as a witness of the Good News of the Gospel. While we take time to reflect and renew our commitments in these three areas annually as a parish family, it is of great benefit to take some time individually throughout the year to take stock of the commitments we have made — looking at both our strengths and our need for continued growth in each area.

On this Feast of the Ascension, take the time to celebrate your victories as Christ's disciples and renew your commitment to remain faithful to Him and the unique mission He has entrusted to you!

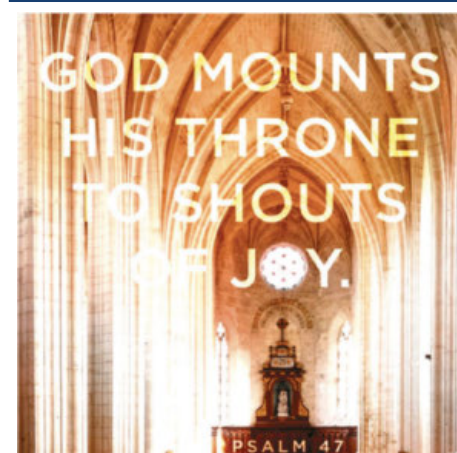

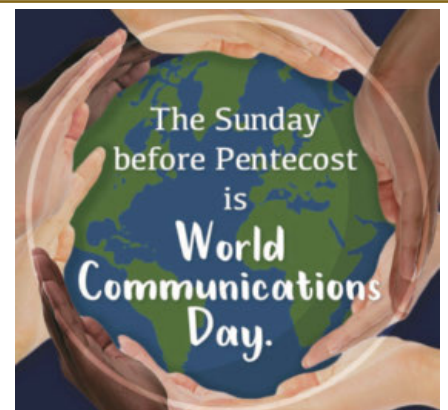

DIAPER DRIVE 2025: IMPACT REPORT



Thank you to all who contributed to Diaper Drive 2025. We are grateful for the generosity of our students, families, and parishioners across Saint Mary Parish & School of Los Gatos.

Together we donated:

- 1,500+ diapers
- 200+ packs of wipes
- 200+ handmade comfort items (baby blankets, bibs, and hats)
- 10 containers of baby formula

Donations collected were distributed to 4 organizations:

- ♦ Hispanic Ministry of Diocese of Monterey serving Migrant Farmworker Communities
- ♦ Heritage Home of San Jose
- ♦ Sacred Heart Community Services
- ♦ Birthright

We were blessed to be able to increase student volunteer participation this year. Six grades participated, up from four grades last year. Thank you to the 2nd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th & 8th grade classes for their excellent community service work in Hofmann Center in early April.

New this year, our 6th, 7th & 8th grade classes completed a reflection and planning activity. The students worked in groups to come up with lists of non profits they have, or would like to, donate their time, talent, or treasure. Then we had a group discussion on the benefits and challenges of volunteering - the students broadly observed that volunteering is an important and meaningful way to spend time, although prioritization and transportation (they can't drive themselves yet!) are challenges. As a takeaway, each student was given the personal challenge to complete a volunteer activity of their choosing by the end of the school year (this is not a school assignment - just a personal challenge).

OUR CATHOLIC FAITH

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord commemorates Jesus' ascension into Heaven. Historically, this holy has been celebrated 40 days after Easter Sunday – the Thursday in the sixth week of Easter. Most U.S. dioceses, however, have moved the celebration of the Ascension to the seventh Sunday of Easter. For this reason, it is now often referred to as “Ascension Sunday.” The day of celebration – Thursday or Sunday – seems to vary from diocese to diocese and country to country in 2025.

When celebrated on a Thursday, the Ascension of the Lord remains a **holy day of obligation**. The Church expects Catholics to attend Mass every Sunday already, so when the Ascension is celebrated on a Sunday, attendance is doubly encouraged.

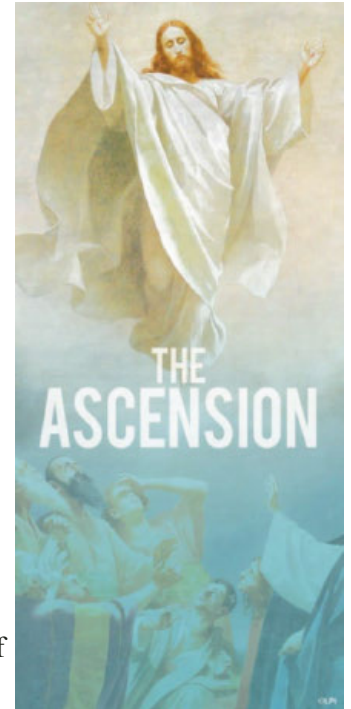
PRAYERS FOR THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Pray with the words of St. Paul in his Letter to the Colossians: “If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.” (Col. 3:1-4)

Pray with the Collect Prayer for Ascension Sunday: “Gladden us with holy joys, almighty God, and make us rejoice with devout thanksgiving, for the Ascension of Christ your Son is our exaltation, and, where the Head has gone before in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.”

Listen and pray with Day 322 in the Bible in a Year with Fr. Mike Schmitz, which draws on the Acts of the Apostles, Romans, and Proverbs.

COMMONLY-ASKED QUESTIONS



When is the Ascension of the Lord?

Historically, the Ascension of the Lord is celebrated 40 days after Easter Sunday on the Thursday in the sixth week of Easter. In the last decade, there has been a shift in the U.S. to celebrate the Ascension on the seventh Sunday of Easter. In 2025, Ascension Sunday is May 29.

Is the Ascension a holy day of obligation in 2025?

When celebrated on the Thursday in the sixth week of Easter, the Ascension is a holy day of obligation. When celebrated on the seventh Sunday of Easter, Catholics are already expected to attend Mass that day.

When did Jesus ascend into Heaven?

Based on the Acts of the Apostles, the Church holds that Jesus ascended into heaven 40 days after His resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Is the Ascension the same as Pentecost?

The Ascension and Pentecost are not the same, though they are connected. It was 10 days after Jesus' Ascension into Heaven that the Holy Spirit was able to descend upon His disciples. Pentecost signals the end of the Easter season and is also the day we recognize as the birth of the Church.

What happened between the Ascension and Pentecost?

For ten days, Jesus' disciples and Mary patiently and prayerfully waited for the coming of the Holy Spirit.

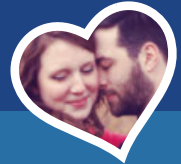
