



REFLECT & RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

First Reading:

The author of Wisdom teaches us that our limited understanding can be overcome by the gift of wisdom from God's Holy Spirit. Have you ever prayed for the gift of wisdom in discerning a difficult course of action?

TODAY'S READINGS

Wisdom 9:13-18b; Psalm 90; Philemon 9-10, 12-17; Luke 14:25-33

Second Reading:

Paul is asking Philemon to welcome back his runaway slave, Onesimus, as a brother in Christ. Who do you consult when making difficult life decisions?

Gospel:

Jesus challenges the crowds to weigh carefully the high cost of discipleship. What have you given up following Jesus?

Today's readings make very clear the demands that will be made of those wanting to be called disciples of Christ. We must be prepared to give our all to Him. But in the end, the life of discipleship — the stewardship way of life — is the only life that can truly satisfy.

Our First Reading, from the ancient book of Wisdom, prepares us for the challenging teaching that will follow in today's Gospel passage. "Who can know God's counsel or who can conceive what the Lord intends? For the deliberations of mortals are timid... the corruptible body burdens the soul and the earthen shelter weighs down the mind that has many concerns."

Weighed down by financial woes, relationship stress, illness — all the concerns of modern life (and apparently, ancient life, too) — how can we possibly concern ourselves with anything more than these immediate needs? Our human "earthly" instincts limit our ability to think with an eternal perspective. But, a few verses later, we are told that God has sent His Holy Spirit from on high to assist us. "And thus were the paths of those on earth made straight." Relying on the Holy Spirit, we can live indeed live for higher goals despite all the challenges of daily life.

But this way of life will not be easy, and our Lord, knowing well our human nature, must prepare us for the challenge. In the Gospel passage from Luke, Christ is very straightforward about the cost of living for the higher aims of discipleship. "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." Our Lord is speaking here not of emotions, but rather of priorities. He must come first in all aspects of our lives. Period.

He goes on to say, "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." In other words, it's all or nothing. Compromise is simply not possible. Christ wants us to give all of ourselves, all aspects of our individual lives, our family life, our parish, over to Him and to the pursuit of His kingdom.

To further this point, Christ shares two parables. The first is about a builder who wants to construct a tower. Christ says that before beginning, the builder must sit down and consider the cost to see if he has what is needed to complete the project. The second parable is of a king facing a potential battle. Again, Christ says he must first consider if he has sufficient troops for success before he goes off headlong into battle. Discipleship will cost us, and we must be prepared to give it

And just when we think our Lord might soften His message to make it a little more palatable, He goes further! "Anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." Why is our Lord being so demanding? Only because He knows us so well and loves us so much.

He knows that if we do not live with great intentionality — putting Him first before all else — we will easily be swallowed up by the earthly cares that weigh us down — our material things, our status, and our egos. He knows that these things cannot satisfy us. He knows this because He is our Maker, and He made us for more.

We are made to be His disciples, to seek after Him and His Kingdom. Embracing stewardship as a way of life allows us to count the cost and then run after Him with all our might.



ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION


My Jesus, I believe you

OUR CATHOLIC FAITH

AMERICANS ON THE PATH TO SAINTHOOD - multi-part series

VENERABLE ARCHBISHOP FULTON SHEEN

Ordained a priest of the Diocese of Peoria, Illinois, at the age of 24, Archbishop Sheen was appointed auxiliary bishop of New York in 1951, where he remained until his appointment as bishop of Rochester, New York, in 1966. He received a titular

appointment three years later, making him an archbishop. He moved back to New York City until his death in 1979.

During his lifetime, Archbishop Sheen published dozens of books and hosted popular radio and television shows, even winning an Emmy for "Most Outstanding Television Personality."

In 2019, Sheen's remains were transferred from the Archdiocese of New York to Peoria, following a long legal battle over his burial place.

The Diocese of Peoria opened Archbishop Sheen's cause for sainthood in 2002, and in 2012, Benedict XVI recognized his life of heroic virtue, landing Archbishop Sheen the title of "Venerable." Sheen was originally scheduled to be beatified in 2019, but a number of unexpected factors have led to his sainthood cause being suspended since then, though interest by the faithful continues.

SERVANT OF GOD RHODA WISE

Rhoda Wise (1888-1948) was a Canton, Ohio, woman who converted to Catholicism after being introduced to the Rosary.

She suffered greatly for years under serious medical problems, including a permanently injured foot and a 39-pound ovarian cyst that was surgically removed in 1932. Wise claimed she was completely healed of her ailments after receiving a visit from Jesus in her home.

During Wise's life, some 300 to 500 people a week came to her home seeking help, and many additional healings were reported. One of those healings was of a skeptical Rita Rizzo — the future Mother Mary Angelica, the foundress of EWTN — who at the time was suffering from severe stomach problems and "so engrossed in survival that religion did not affect me," she later admitted.

Wise advised praying a novena to St. Thérèse, which Rita did. After doing so, she says her stomach ailment, which had caused her suffering for years, was healed overnight. She spent a lot of time over the next few years volunteering at the house and learning from Rhoda.

The Diocese of Youngstown, Ohio, opened Wise's cause for canonization in 2016, granting her the title "Servant of God."
