REFLECT & RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

First Reading:

Our wisdom writer speaks of just souls resting peacefully in God's loving hands. Can you think of a more peaceful image of death?

Second Reading:

Paul teaches the Romans that with Jesus' resurrection, "death no longer has any power over him," or us, as believers. *Does this belief*

help you through times of grieving from the loss of a loved one?

TODAY'S READINGS

Wisdom 3:1-9;

Psalm 23;

Romans 5:5-11 OR

Romans 6:3-9;

John 6:37-40

Jesus taught the crowds that anyone who believes in him will have eternal life and be raised from the dead on the last day. How do others know you believe in Jesus?

On this commemoration of All Souls Day, the Church turns her gaze toward all the faithful departed, entrusting them to God's mercy and proclaiming once again our hope in the Resurrection. The readings selected for this day speak with one voice: death does not have the final word, for those who live and die in Christ will share in His victory over the grave.

The Book of Wisdom sets the tone with its consoling declaration: "The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them" (Wis 3:1). Though the world may see death as destruction, we know that for the faithful, it is a passage into life with God. The Psalm echoes this confidence in the familiar words, "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want" (Ps 23:1). Just as a shepherd cares for his flock, so does God guide and protect His people, even through the valley of death.

St. Paul's words from Romans remind us that our hope is not abstract but rooted in Baptism. "Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?" (Rom 6:3). To be joined to Christ in His death means that we will also share in His Resurrection. This is the central truth of Christian discipleship — we belong to Christ, in life and in death, and He will not abandon us.

In the Gospel, Jesus Himself assures us: "Everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day" (Jn 6:40). These words are not merely a distant promise, but an invitation to live differently now. Eternal life is God's greatest gift to us, yet like all gifts, it comes with responsibility. To believe in Christ is to entrust ourselves fully to Him and to shape our lives according to His will.

This is where the message of stewardship comes into focus. All that we are and all that we have is entrusted to us by God, not for our possession but for our faithful use. On this All Souls Day, the Church not only calls us to pray for those who have gone before us, but also to reflect on how we are living our earthly days. How are we using the gift of time? How are we sharing our talents in service to others? How are we offering our treasure in gratitude to God?

Today, we are reminded that our time on earth is limited, and every moment is an opportunity to love God and neighbor. Just as we entrust the departed to God's mercy, we are called to entrust ourselves daily to His grace, living as stewards who long for the fullness of life in Him. May this All Souls Day renew our faith in Christ's promise and inspire us to live each day as disciples who await the day when He will fulfill His word: "I shall raise him on the last day.





WHAT DO CATHOLICS BELIEVE ABOUT THE RESURRECTION OF THE DEAD?

Every Sunday, we proclaim in the Creed that we believe "in the resurrection of the body." Does that mean Christ's resurrection or our own? Both! Jesus' resurrection is part of the work of salvation, but it's also a sign of what's to come. While death separates our bodies and our souls, this was not the intention of God when He first created us. It's an effect of original sin. At the end of time, our bodies and our souls will be reunited.

Scientifically, we may have questions about this, since bodies decompose over the course of centuries. Or what about the saints, whose relics are spread around the earth? How the resurrection will happen is a mystery. But we know that our resurrected body will be our body. If we are in heaven, our body will be in a glorified state. Some theologians speculate what this glorification will be like based on Jesus' resurrected body. Will we be able to walk through walls? Will we eat, since Jesus broke bread with his disciples? We don't really know the answers to these questions. We do know, however, that we will be free from the effects of the fall (such as sickness and pain) and physical defects that occurred in life. PRAYER FOR THE DEAD, EXPLAINED!

It may seem strange to pray for someone who is already dead and who, according to our earthly reckoning of time, has already undergone judgment. But God is not subject to the constrictions of time as we understand them. Our prayers for the dead are, like our prayers for the living, an expression of charity and the unity that exists between all members of the Body of Christ.

Prayer for the dead is a practice which not only predates Catholicism but predates Jesus Christ, as we see in the Second Book of Maccabees (2 Maccabees 12:42-45).

"By virtue of the 'communion of saints,' the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers, especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf," says the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 1055).

The most common Catholic prayer for the dead is as follows: "Eternal rest grant unto them, o Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace." ©LPi
