Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
 This next week begins the month of November, traditionally dedicated to praying for the faithful departed. We begin the month next Friday with the Feast of All Saints, when we remember all those who have passed before us, who having been purified of all sin, and having sought the holiness of God with all their hearts, now share in the eternal happiness of God, partakers of his divine nature.

What does it mean to be a saint? Simply put, to be one with God, seeking his will alone, to be totally and wholly his. Of course, that's no small thing! That's not just a wish, or an intention; it's not just a moment of fervent prayer, or even an extraordinary act of kindness or mercy. It's a whole character of life, it's a total offering and consecration. Anything short of everything is not yet sainthood. At the same time, holiness is a progression: we move toward it step by step, closer and closer.

The substance of that teaching of the Church is what is called the three ways of the spiritual life: the purgative stage, the illuminative stage, and the unitive stage.

Theologians and saints have worked out the features of these stages since the earliest centuries of the Church, by observing their own experiences and the experiences of others who have strived toward holiness. What are their distinguishing characteristics?

In the beginning of the spiritual life, the purgative stage, we must rid ourselves of all actual sin and attachment to sin: first mortal sins, then venial sins, and then our attachments to the occasions and appearances of sin. Many, if not most, remain at this stage throughout our lives, as it takes a great effort and much love and generosity to put aside all that is sinful. But that's just the beginning!

As we grow into the illuminative stage, we have become proficient in the works of holiness, praying without ceasing and doing works of charity constantly. But we remain attached to the goods of the world and the flesh: and so God gives us crosses and struggles so that we would love him alone, above all other things, and seek to share in the Passion of Christ. Holiness is not just not sinning, it's positively desiring to take up the cross and die to our self-love, our inordinate love of created things, in which we put the creature before the Creator.

The key events of this stage are what is called "The Dark Night", first in which we no longer feel any pleasure in the spiritual life, and then finally in which we no longer perceive the presence of God

at all. This experience of emptiness and then finally abandonment that all future saints must go through is nothing else but a share in what our Savior went through on Good Friday, in which he put obedience to the Father out of love for him, before all else.

The saint is the one who perseveres by faith, hope, and love through these dark nights, and rather than reacting in resentment, grows in deeper love of God alone, even in emptiness and abandonment. The conclusion of that perseverance is the unitive stage, what we call sainthood: the soul at this point is wholly and totally devoted to God, experiencing the fruits of mystical prayer, seeking the will of God in their personal vocation with all their heart, sharing in the joy and peace of heaven even now on earth.

Is such a thing possible? It is. The saints testify to its reality, just as the Church teaches this possibility in her spiritual doctrine. And our Lord calls us on just the same:

"Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Mt 5:48)

"If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me." (Lk 9:23)

What happens if we do not advance through these stages while here on earth? Short answer: purgatory. And that's good news! It means that God will not rest until we have been made holy as he desires. As for purgatory, the traditional focus of the month of November, I'll write more about that next week.
