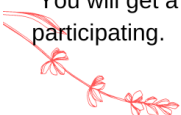

Dear Parishioners:

On behalf of Rev. William D. Wuenschel, the Saint Aidan Parish Finance Council would like to present a summary of results and highlights related to the diocesan-provided financial report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022. Also included are comparative results to last fiscal year and statistical data concerning the parish.

Summary of Results:

Saint Aidan Parish achieved a parish surplus of \$315,285 for the year ending June 30, 2022 comprised of an operating surplus of \$116,414 and a non-operating surplus of \$198,871.

While realizing a surplus is great news, monthly debt service of approximately \$13,000 on nearly \$2.0M of outstanding debt will begin in January 2023 producing a significant cash flow deficit. There is hope that this financial concern will be eased as unfulfilled Church Alive pledges of \$1.8 million are asked to be honored. In addition to debt consideration, routine maintenance as well as larger capital improvements at both church properties will be needed.

During this past year, the following extraordinary improvements were made: renovation and creation of two new youth rooms, roof repairs, and concrete sidewalk improvements. We are grateful that a large portion of the materials and labor was donated in-kind by a generous parishioner.

Highlights to Diocesan Financial Report:

Operating Results: While Mass attendance averaging 1,224 per weekend is still 800 less than pre-covid levels, it represents an increase of approximately 125 or 11% from 2021. Regrettably, the increase in attendance has not correlated into higher offertory collections as they have declined by 2.5% to \$1.34 million. This \$34,600 decline in offertory income was mostly offset by higher fundraising proceeds, continued cost control measures and a debt service holiday granted by the diocese. This debt service holiday is set to expire on December 31, 2022.

A favorable change in our parish's operating cost structure was brought about by the diocesan Elementary School Grant resulting in all parishes in the diocese now contributing an equal percentage of their income to benefit their region's catholic school. Before this grant program, Saint Aidan Parish was paying a disproportionate share relative to other local parishes.

- Offertory Collections, the primary source of income for the parish, has declined 27% over the past four years from \$1,833,000 to \$1,343,435 annually or \$152,800 to **\$112,000 monthly**. Starting in January 2023, the diocese will begin automatic monthly deductions of certain recurring expenses; for our parish, that amount will be **approximately \$110,000 per month** representing outlays for salaries/benefits, insurance, elementary school grant, and church debt repayment and parish appeal (formerly Parish Share).
- This scenario could potentially result in approximately \$2,000 per month remaining of offertory collections to pay for other expenses such as utilities, maintenance, taxes, and other parish programs whose cost has historically totaled approximately \$40,000 per month. This potential deficit will be partially mitigated by non-operating revenue ie. other donations.

Non-Operating Results: Non-operating revenue of \$198,871 as of June 30, 2022 was largely generated by cash receipts from past capital campaigns, net parish share, and a lone asset sale partially offset by maintenance costs and a one-time insurance expense.

At present, the Finance Council is actively reviewing financial projections related to parish operating and non-operating revenue and expenses for fiscal year 2023, with special attention focused on developing a process for collecting unfulfilled pledges.

In conclusion, we would like to thank our parishioners for your continued support and for all that you do for Saint Aidan Parish. We are blessed to be a part of such a special community.

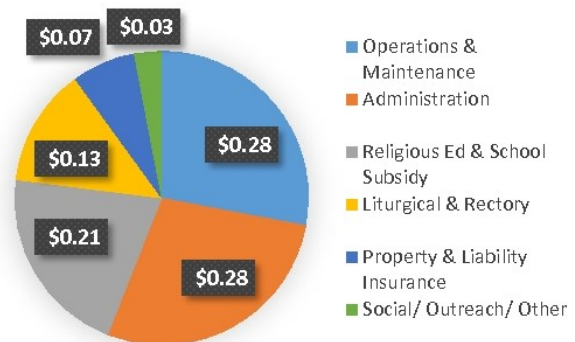

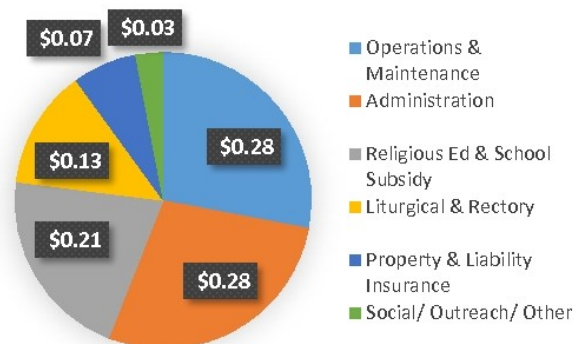
