



FROM THE DESK OF DEACON DAVE

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus tells us that the Kingdom of God is like a persistent, generous landowner who continually seeks workers for his vineyard. Elsewhere in the Gospels, we learn that this vineyard—the Kingdom of God—is not in some far-off place, so that we might ignore it. It is not at some distant time, that we might put it on a back burner. And the work is not so difficult that we cannot handle it. No, the vineyard is here and now; and God generously equips us to accomplish the work and rewards us for our labor.

The vineyard is in our families and in our workplace; it is in our schools and places of work; it is wherever we go and includes whomever we meet. It is not just for those who are "good" enough; it is for all peoples. The responsorial psalm tells us, "it [the Kingdom of God] is near to all who call upon him [the Lord] in truth." We are His Church here in Wexford. We are called to be His workers for the kingdom. Whether we are inviting others to a parish function, such as Christ Life or ENDOW; instructing them in our Catholic faith in one of our Children Faith Formation programs or the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults; when we participate fully in the liturgy of the Mass, or serve our neighbors with a smile at the Harvest Home Festival or Fish Fry, we are disciples and living witnesses of Christ to all of our neighbors in His Kingdom.

If we were invited to work the vineyard years ago or just yesterday, praise be to God for His gracious and merciful invitation. If we know of others who are still in need of an invitation to go the vineyard, let us be the ones to invite them. We cannot afford to wait for "better opportunities" to share the Good News of God's salvation through Jesus Christ. St. Paul tells us, "Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. (2 Cor 2:6)" None of our family, friends, or neighbors should ever be able to say that we did not encourage them - either in word or deed - to love Christ and neighbor more. Jesus calls us all to become saints through his Church, and to help others to know the love and mercy of His Father as they journey to becoming saints. Dare I say, the rewards for working in the vineyard are out of this world.

MAKING OF THE "NEXT GENERATION" MEN'S FELLOWSHIP



CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD




ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS
