This is the account of the final appearance of Jesus to the disciples in the Gospel of John. The longer version in the lectionary also includes the words of Jesus to Simon Peter: 'Feed my lambs! Feed my sheep!' The scene is simple. The disciples seem disoriented, engaging in their previous occupation of fishing. Have they abandoned any idea of going out to preach the good news? The risen Jesus comes to them as a friend and provides for their needs: their need to make a living, their need for breakfast. The risen Christ retains his full humanity, including his concern for people in their day-to-day situations, however menial. The offering of bread and fish is a reminder of the miracle of the loaves and fishes, which pointed to the Eucharist, the memorial of his cross and resurrection to new life. Do I realize that in his resurrection Christ retains our humanity in all its ordinariness? We pray

for an appreciation of God's involvement in each present moment. We pray for the courage to let the gospel live through our daily lives.
