Independence Prayer

O God you willed that the Jewish people be free from slavery by their Egyptian captors. You will that all people should be free to worship you without fear and to celebrate their religious beliefs freely, even if they have not yet found you. Grant that those of us who live in this great nation will thank you daily for our freedom, and work for the freedom of others around the world that do not yet have the freedom to practice their faith openly and proudly.

We seek your wisdom where hatred abounds, and ask for humility to offer our good works to others who live in fear and bondage.

We ask this through Christ our Lord, who frees us from sin and death through the wood of the cross. Amen.

Can Saints Hear Us?

Catholic Life Explained

One charge made against it is that the saints in heaven cannot even hear our prayers, making it useless to ask for their intercession. But as Scripture indicates, those in heaven of the prayers of those on earth. This can be seen, for example, in Revelation 5:8 where John depicts the saints in heaven offering our prayers to God under the form of "golden of incense" which are the prayers of the saints." But if the saints are offering our prayers to God, then they must be aware of our prayers.

Some might try to argue that in this passage the prayers being offered were not addressed to the saints in heaven, but directly to God. Yet this argument would only strengthen if those in heaven could hear our prayers, for then the saints would be aware of our prayers even when they are not directed to them!

One Mediator Between God and Men

Another charge commonly levelled against asking the saints for their intercession is that this violates the sole mediatorship of Christ, which Paul discusses: "For there is one God and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus" (1Tim. 2:5).

But asking one person to pray for you in no way violates Christ's mediatorship, as can be seen from considering the way in which Christ is a mediator.

First, Christ is a unique mediator between man and God because he is the only person who is both God and man. He is the only bridge between the two, the only God-man. But the role as a mediator is not compromised in the least by the fact that others intercede for us.

Furthermore, Christ's uniqueness as a mediator between God and man is because he is the mediator of the New Covenant (Heb. 9:15 12:24), just as Moses was the mediator of the (Greek mesitas) of the Old Covenant (Gal. 3:19-20).

The intercession of fellow Christians — which is what the saints in heaven are — also clearly does not interfere with Christ's unique mediatorship because in the four verses immediately preceding 1 Timothy 2:5, Paul says that Christians should intercede: "First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all men, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life, godly and respectful in every way.

This is good, and pleasing to God our Savior, who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth." (1 Tim. 2:1-4). Then, intercessory prayers offered by Christians on behalf of others is something "good and pleasing to God," not something infringing on Christ's role as mediator.
