THE EASTER VIGIL IN THE HOLY NIGHT


WHAT IS THE EASTER VIGIL?

Quite simply, it is the most important and most majestic Mass of the year. The Easter Vigil is the longest liturgy of the year and is quite different from a normal Mass, for good reason. It is filled with powerful scripture and beautiful liturgical traditions. It is also when the Church grows, since the Easter Vigil is the night when catechumens can receive the Catholic Sacraments of Baptism., Confirmation and Holy Communion on the same night. It is rich with meaning and symbolism, and tells a story, specifically the Story of Salvation History. It begins in darkness lit only by candles, recounts the history of God's promises from the creation of the world, through the Israelites, to when the Light of the World, Jesus, comes to fulfill them. He renews all who come to Him through the sacraments of this Holy Mass, inviting them to continue their story toward Heaven.

WHY MASS IS SO LONG?

The length of the Vigil reminds us that God works slowly, that even when we feel we are trapped in a time of endless waiting or wandering aimlessly in the desert like the Israelites, we are accompanied; that all of God's work ever so gradually replaces the darkness with light, silence with bells, dry wells with life — giving water. All emptiness eventually gives way to Alleluia, and Christ's joyous victory. And that is exactly why it is worth bringing your family there, however long it takes. "Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King, let all corners of the earth be glad, knowing an end to gloom and darkness. — the Exculter


