## Success beyond graduation


The Catholic high school graduation rate is 98% with 85% of graduates attending four-year colleges compared to 43% of public-school students enrolling in college. Catholic high school graduates who enter college are twice as likely to graduate from college as students who attend public high schools; and 62% of Catholic high school graduates earn a bachelor's degree or higher within eight years of graduating high school.<sup>2</sup>

# Understanding Texas Education Freedom Accounts



## What is it?

Texas Education Freedom Accounts (TEFA) is the name of the school choice program that provides parents of students an opportunity to apply for a publicly funded, government-authorized savings account to pay for their children's education at a private institution, including a Catholic school. The Texas legislature has designated \$1 billion in funding for the TEFA program for the 2026-2027 school year.

## How will the funds be used?

Parents may use the funds to pay for eligible expenses for their children in PreK – 12th grade, including school tuition, school breakfasts and lunches, uniforms, tutoring, online education programs, therapies for students with special needs, textbooks, or other instructional materials.

## How much is available?

- The Texas Education Agency (TEA) has determined funding for the first year of the program will be \$10,474 per student.
- Students with disabilities who have an individualized education plan (IEP) on file with their school district may receive up to an estimated \$30,000 per year.
- Home-schooled students may receive up to \$2,000 per year.

## Who is eligible?

Student must be a U.S. citizen, national, or lawful resident eligible to attend a Texas public school.

If applications exceed available funding, a lottery will decide one's placement based on:

- Children with a disability whose family income is at or below 500% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (FPG)
- Children whose family income is at or below 200% of the FPG
- Children whose family income is between 200 – 500% of the FPG
- All other children, depending upon available funds. Students who move from public schools will be prioritized over currently enrolled private school students in this category only (capped at 20% of the total appropriation of the TEFA program)

## When do I apply?

The application period is Feb. 4 - Mar. 17, 2026, for funding during the 2026-2027 academic school year.
