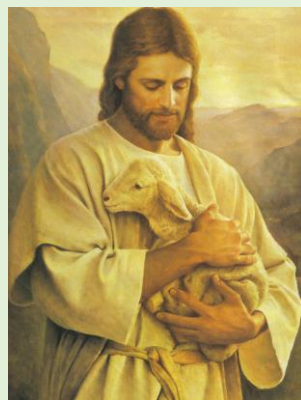

PASTOR'S CORNER

This Fourth Sunday of Easter is also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday". Jesus makes a promise in today's Gospel to those who hear His voice and follow Him will inherit eternal life. Jesus in the gospel today calls us together as the Good Shepherd. He overcomes the barriers we place between us by becoming the sheepgate, the way to gather through Him and with Him. Gathering together is something that we are sorely missing in this time of self-isolation. Jesus used the image of shepherd because shepherds were very familiar to the people of his time. At that time one of the most difficult jobs for the shepherds was to protect the sheep at night. They gathered the various flocks in one place to jointly keep them safe overnight. One shepherd would lay down to sleep over the entrance to the flock to be the guard. In a real way, the shepherd would literally lay down his life for the sheep. The next morning, each shepherd would call his flock and they would recognize his voice because they knew who cared for them and they would follow him to the pastures.

Amidst all the other voices that clamor for attention in their daily lives, the voices that make demands, give advice, seek to persuade, or like to gossip, good stewards listen for the Good Shepherd's voice. The other voices are legion, and we do not always recognize how contrary they are to the voice of the Good Shepherd. Good stewards know that it takes a compassionate heart, a habit of prayer, a hunger for the Eucharist and a love of neighbor for them to truly hear the voice of the Good Shepherd.
