

Faithful Chronicles

This year I initiated a new custom. Each household in our three parishes was mailed a Christmas card from Father Barkin, Deacon Herb and myself. We send our best wishes and our prayers to you and yours. The card also lists the schedule of Masses for Christmas and the feast of the Solemnity of Mary (January 1, a holyday of obligation). Please share this schedule of Masses with family, co-workers, neighbors and friends. We want as many as possible to attend the liturgies of Christmas and the Solemnity of Mary (January 1). All are truly welcome!

(If you haven't received a card from your parish, it means you are not enrolled in one of the parishes and are not in our census. Call the parish office and the secretary will be glad to register you. It only takes a few minutes.)

I am grateful to St. Colman parishioner, and local artist, Marci Evancho Mason, for her watercolor original which graces our Christmas card, "A Child Is Born." To see more of her work, go to www.marciart.net .

St. John Fisher parishioners will be happy to know that Father Carl Gentile has accepted my invitation and agreed to return and preside at the 6:00 p.m. Mass on Christmas Eve.

The Christmas card also lists special times for the sacrament of reconciliation (confession). We have scheduled penance services and the opportunity of individual confession on Tuesday, December 18, beginning at 7:00 p.m. in St. Jude Church; Wednesday, December 19, 1:00 p.m. in St. Colman Church; and Thursday, December 20, 7:00 p.m. in St. John Fisher Church. These services will be brief (ten minutes or so) to help folks to prepare to receive the sacrament individually. You may go to confession behind the screen (anonymously) or face-to-face, as you choose. Both Father Barkin and I will be at all three penance services.

The season of Advent is an excellent time for us to receive the sacrament of forgiveness. Confessions are usually associated with the season of Lent. But as we approach the end of the calendar year, and the feast of the birth of our Savior, this is also a good time to take stock, appreciate our blessings, honestly face our faults and sins, and receive God's mercy sacramentally.

May I suggest that as you prepare to go to confession, focus not only on "what sins I committed" but also on "what kind of person does God want me to be, and what am I doing to block God's desire." Following my training in the spirituality of St. Ignatius of Loyola, I firmly believe that God wants to have a close, personal and loving relationship with each and every person, in and through his Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. What is preventing me from this close, personal and loving relationship? What am I doing wrong? What am I failing to do? What virtue or virtues can I build up in my life? These questions can lead to a "good confession."

In the season of Advent, truly a season of giving, many parishioners have already been generous contributors to the poor through each church's Giving Tree. Well done, good and faithful servants of Jesus. Carry that spirit of giving into the new year.

Safe Environment for The Protection of Children and Young People

"Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." – Matthew 19:14

We follow a Savior whose love for children was so great that he called all of us to become like them and warned that it would be better to drown than to cause harm to their souls. This is why for many years the Diocese of Pittsburgh has exceeded all child protection requirements of both civil law and the U.S. Catholic Bishops' Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. As Christian adults, we have a moral and legal responsibility and are entrusted by God with the spiritual, emotional and physical well-being of children as they participate in activities within or sponsored by our Diocese. It is our responsibility and commitment to provide an environment which is safe and nurturing and to ensure that children in the care of the Church come to no harm of any kind.

A little background on the **Protection of Children**. In June 2002 the Bishops of the U. S. passed the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. In 2004 all Priests, Deacons, Catholic school teachers and school volunteers, parish employees and CCD Catechists were required to complete the Code of Pastoral Conduct and attend the Protection of God's Children class. Then on May 28, 2007 new amendments to the *Child Protective Services Law* went into effect in Pennsylvania. These amendments, which apply to Catholic institutions, established important requirements for those who work with children, either in a paid or volunteer position who comes in contact with children under the age of 18.

Currently there are 63 Ministries defined by the Diocese which need Background Checks completed for employees or volunteers in order to create a **Safe Environment** for these ministries in our parishes.

I will explain in more detail in my next article the background/clearances steps necessary for your ministries. In the meantime, if you have any questions, please contact me at St. Colman Parish – (412)823-2564.
