# Faithful Chronicles

As the parish priests and staff throw away their December calendars and hang up the new one, they instinctively ask two questions: When is Ash Wednesday? and What are we doing in Lent? That is true of St. Joseph the Worker Parish priests, deacons and staff too. We've already got our confession times set, as well as Masses and services for Holy Week and Easter.

What this does, however, is make us skip over some significant Catholic dates in January and February. Let me mention five.

The first day of the calendar year is the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God. It is also World Day of Prayer for Peace. This was established by Saint Pope Paul VI back in 1967. It is an occasion for us as church to pray for peace in all its ramifications. Pope Paul began the custom of issuing a brief letter each year on one or another aspect of peacemaking and peacebuilding, which was so close to his heart. These letters, now more than 50 written by four different popes, comprise a treasure of practical and moral teaching on peace. Pope Francis's message for 2022 is "Dialog Between Generations, Education and Work: Tools for Building Lasting Peace."

Though it is not a liturgical feast a second special day is the federal holiday honoring civil rights activist Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on the third Monday in January. The Christian principle of seeking justice through nonviolent acts was so eloquently proclaimed and lived by this assassinated prophet. As the years since his death in 1968 fly by, our awareness as citizens and as Christians of his impact on our nation only grows.

The third event, a sad commemoration, may be the one you are most familiar with. The annual March for Life in Washington, D.C., recognizes the tragic decision of the U.S. Supreme Court legalizing abortion on January 22, 1973. Tens of thousands, and some years, hundreds of thousands descend on our nation's capital to witness for protection for human life from conception to natural death. Some commentators are predicting that the most

recent march, the 49<sup>th</sup>, maybe the last one if cases currently before the Supreme Court overturn *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton*. I suspect however that Marches for Life will continue in cities and state capitals for a long time, until every citizen is able to understand and support the right to life of all innocent human beings, born and unborn.

I have often ruefully reflected on how little time I spend in my ministry reaching out to our sisters and brothers in other Christian churches, denominations and communities. It's not that we don't do it; we just give it little attention. There are over 30,000 different Christian churches across the globe, yet we ignore this scandal and affront to Jesus, who prayed "that all may be one." Way back in 1908 the Greymoor Fathers in New York set the days of January 18-25 as a week for ecumenical prayer and dialogue. The concluding day of this week is the feast of the conversion of St. Paul the Apostle. Who among us cannot work for a greater commitment to Christ in our hearts and minds, and to bring together churches which have been separated?

Finally, I'll mention a silly Hallmark Card date, Valentine Day, on which the national bishops conference and several lay organizations, such as Worldwide Marriage Encounter and Teams of Our Lady, have shrewdly piggybacked "World Marriage Day." This secular holiday provides the Catholic church and its parishes the opportunity to focus on the sacrament of marriage and celebrate the vocation to marriage, love and family life.

Throughout the year – calendar and liturgical – there are so many feasts, special Vatican events and local commemorations. Frankly there are too many to include in our bulletin. But all of them witness to the breadth and depth of Catholic teaching and practice. I hope through these you and our entire parish can grow in your understanding of the faith and come to know Christ better.

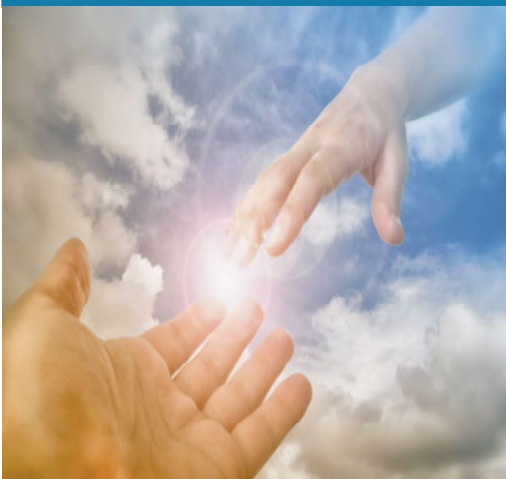

**ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT**  
**ST. JOSEPH THE WORKER PARISH**  
**July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021**

Every year all parishes of the Diocese of Pittsburgh are required to make an accounting of their finances to their people. Though we are a bit late, on the facing page you will see ours for the fiscal year July 1, 2020 – June 30 2021. This is the first full year as St. Joseph the Worker Parish, as we were founded on July 1, 2020. Let me offer a few remarks about our finances.

First I must commend all the parishioners of St. Joseph the Worker for their generosity, especially through the pandemic year 2020. We have had major struggles over the past two-plus years because of covid-19. Yet you, our parishioners, have been generous with your money, with your volunteering (when able) and your prayers. I cannot thank you enough. Please keep it up! As I like to repeat, God cannot be outdone in generosity.

Second, please note that our fiscal year ended in positive territory. Again, this was partially because of your generous stewardship and partially because of two rounds of Payroll Protection Loans from the federal government, which totaled for our parish more than \$300,000. Because of the diligence of business manager Kelley Rodgers these loans have all been forgiven.

We received several bequests during the fiscal year. You cannot plan for these, but there are surely welcome when they come. Let me remind you that “you can’t take it with you” and that gifting your parish with a bequest is a wonderful way of making a contribution to the future of our parish. If you need assistance in finding an attorney to help you with your will, let me know. The official title for us is “St. Joseph the Worker Parish, a Pennsylvania Charitable Trust.” However, if any of our parishioners have one of the seven former parishes named in their will, it is not a problem. The bequest will automatically be applied to St. Joseph the Worker, the successor parish.

You will note that our parish has considerable savings and no debt. We were blessed by several of the former parishes having savings, and no debt in any of the former parishes. I hope to keep it that way going forward!

Our one major negative in the fiscal report is that parishioners did not meet the (admittedly ambitious) goal set by the diocese for us for the Parish Share Program. At the end of the 2020 PSP period we had to take over \$120,000 out of savings to complete our PSP obligation. Your contribution to PSP is important, whether at the beginning of the campaign (which will be coming up shortly) or throughout the year. The diocese is working on adjustments to this program, but they are “not ready for prime time” and will probably only be publicized by the diocese in 2023.

Let me take this opportunity to thank the members of the finance council, who advise me in our business dealings. You can ask them any questions and I’m sure they will be more than willing to answer your questions. ## From the Church document "Sing To the Lord: Music in Divine Worship"

As a leader of congregational song, the cantor should take part in singing *with* the entire gathered assembly. In order to promote the singing of the liturgical assembly, the cantor's voice *should not* be heard above the congregation. As a transitional practice, (*like when learning a new hymn or mass setting*) the voice of the cantor might need to be amplified to stimulate and lead congregational singing when this is still weak. **However, as the congregation finds its voice and sings with increasing confidence, the cantor's voice should correspondingly recede.** [bold print & italics added for emphasis and clarity]
