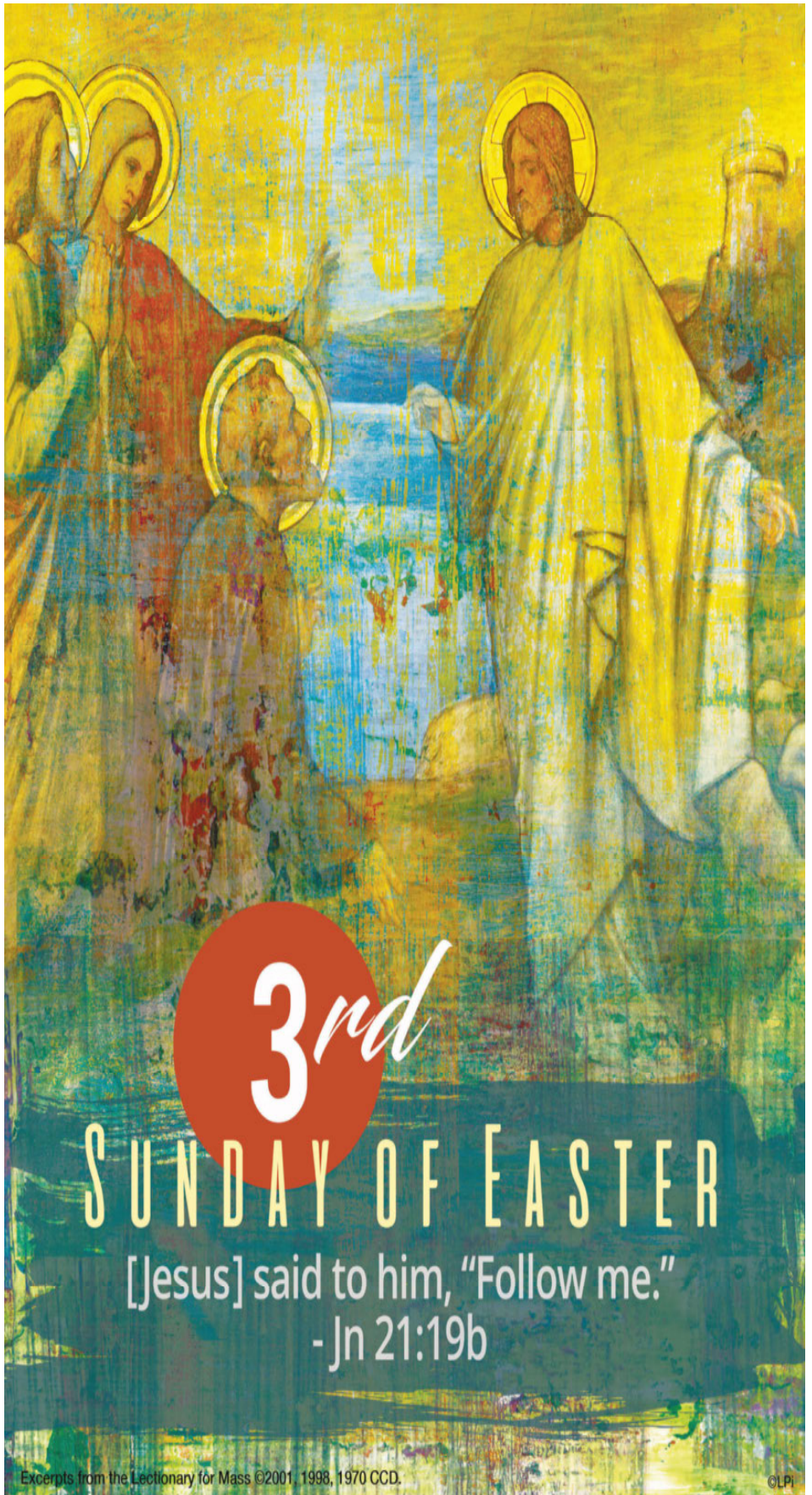

Faithful Chronicles

In 1889 Pope Leo XIII wrote an encyclical, “*Quamquam Pluries*,” on devotion to St. Joseph. He urged all in the Church who had devotion to Mary, Mother of God, to appreciate the closeness within marriage of her husband, St. Joseph. Here is a short description of the virtues of St. Joseph:

“In giving Joseph the Blessed Virgin as spouse, God appointed him to be not only her life's companion, the witness of her maidenhood, the protector of her honor, but also, by virtue of the conjugal tie, a participator in her sublime dignity. And Joseph shines among all mankind by the most august dignity, since by divine will, he was the guardian of the Son of God and reputed as His father among men. Hence it came about that the Word of God was humbly subject to Joseph, that He obeyed him, and that He rendered to him all those offices that children are bound to render to their parents. From this two-fold dignity flowed the obligation which nature lays upon the head of families, so that Joseph became the guardian, the administrator, and the legal defender of the divine house whose chief he was.

“During the whole course of his life he fulfilled those charges and those duties. He set himself to protect with a mighty love and a daily solicitude his spouse and the Divine Infant; regularly by his work he earned what was necessary for the one and the other for nourishment and clothing; he guarded from death the Child threatened by a monarch's jealousy, and found for Him a refuge; in the miseries of the journey and in the bitternesses of exile he was ever the companion, the assistance, and the upholder of the Virgin and of Jesus.”

In the midst of the pandemic in 2020, Pope Francis wrote an apostolic letter on the 150th anniversary of the naming of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. Entitled “*Patris Corde*,” the Holy Father offered personal reflections on aspects of Joseph as a father: beloved, tender and loving, obedient, accepting, creatively courageous and “a father in the shadows.”

Under the section of Joseph as a working father, the Pope wrote:

“An aspect of St. Joseph that has been emphasized from the time of the first social Encyclical, Pope Leo XIII's ‘*Rerum Novarum*,’ is his relation to work. St. Joseph was a carpenter who earned an honest living to provide for his family. From him, Jesus learned the value, the dignity and the joy of what it means to eat bread that is the fruit of one's own labor.

“In our own day, when employment has once more become a burning social issue, and unemployment at times

reaches record levels even in nations that for decades have enjoyed a certain degree of prosperity, there is a renewed need to appreciate the importance of dignified work, of which St. Joseph is an exemplary patron.

“Work is a means of participating in the work of salvation, an opportunity to hasten the coming of the Kingdom, to develop our talents and abilities, and to put them at the service of society and fraternal communion. It becomes an opportunity for the fulfillment not only of oneself, but also of that primary cell of society which is the family. A family without work is particularly vulnerable to difficulties, tensions, estrangement and even break-up. How can we speak of human dignity without working to ensure that everyone is able to earn a decent living?

“Working persons, whatever their job may be, are cooperating with God himself, and in some way become creators of the world around us. The crisis of our time, which is economic, social, cultural and spiritual, can serve as a summons for all of us to rediscover the value, the importance and necessity of work for bringing about a new “normal” from which no one is excluded. St. Joseph's work reminds us that God himself, in becoming man, did not disdain work. The loss of employment that affects so many of our brothers and sisters, and has increased as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, should serve as a summons to review our priorities. Let us implore St. Joseph the Worker to help us find ways to express our firm conviction that no young person, no person at all, no family should be without work!”

Pope Francis concluded by offering us the following prayer to St. Joseph:

*Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.*

*Blessed Joseph, to us too,
show yourself a father
and guide us in the path of life.
Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage,
and defend us from every evil. Amen.*

Our unified parish is blessed to have St. Joseph the Worker as our patron. On this, his feast day, let us appreciate his intercession for all working people, for those who seek work, and for all the Church as we work to bring our world closer to the peaceful kingdom of God proclaimed by Jesus our Risen Lord.
