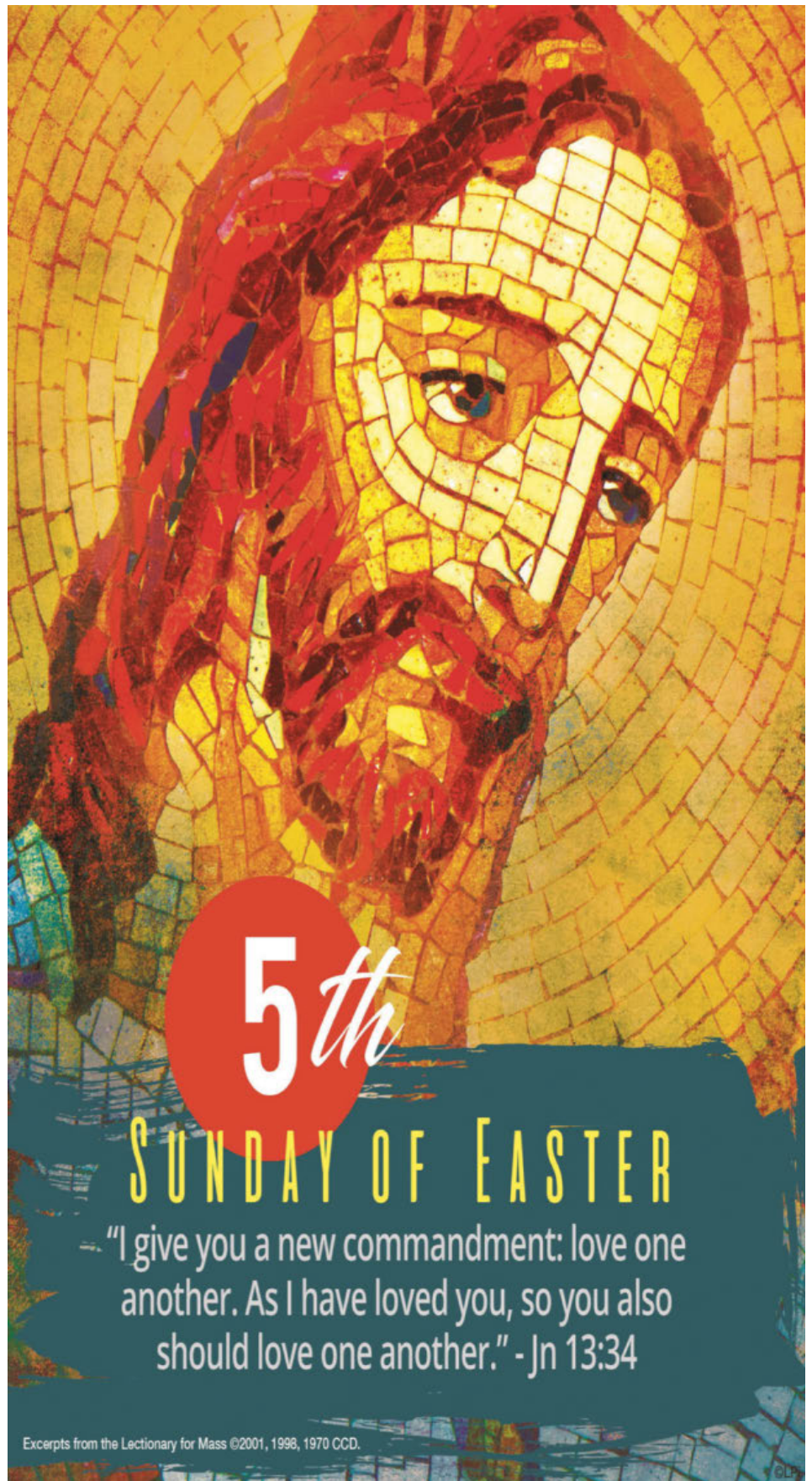

Our first-ever parish Mission Week was a big success. It began on our parish's patronal feast day, Sunday, May 1, with a festive Mass led by Bishop David Zubik and a "carpet picnic" in Beaufort Hall underneath St. John Fisher Church for over 250 smiling parishioners. What could have been a disaster, with rain and thunderstorms blanketing our planned outdoor liturgy and picnic at Westinghouse Lodge, was turned into a big success by moving all activities indoors to the St. John Fisher campus. Well done, everyone!

Our three talks in St. Colman Church on "St. Joseph the Worker and the Universal Call to Holiness" were so well attended. Many thanks to Fathers Boniface Hicks, O.S.B., and Cassian Edwards, O.S.B., and Deacon Keith Kondrich, for their thoughtful contributions to our reflection on the topic. Ending each talk with a period of Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction put a prayerful exclamation point on each talk. Thanks to all the folks who came out for these talks.

Newly-ordained Bishop Mark Eckman was the leader of our Mass of Confirmation on Wednesday evening. He surprised the 17 young people by not asking them questions (easing their anxieties) but asking their sponsors about which of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit they wished for their young protégés. So, which of these gifts do you wish to receive? Wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, or fear of God. This is a good question for all of us who have received the sacrament of Confirmation to ponder.

The theme which kept coming out of liturgies and talks was that of being human, that the ordinariness of life is where we have the possibility of being holy. St. Joseph was holy in his many roles: loving husband of Mary; foster father of Jesus; provider for the First Family of Nazareth by his hard work as a carpenter; teacher of prayer and practitioner of prayer as a faithful Jew; obedient to God through the dreams given him by the Holy Spirit. All of us can try to reach for "the perfection of charity" in our ordinary and everyday actions, just as Joseph did, when we carry out the specific vocation or vocations God has given us.

Once again, let me thank all the leaders of these liturgies and events for their hard work. I am grateful to the catechists of our 8th graders for Confirmation and 2nd graders for Holy Communion, our musicians, cantors and clergy team of deacons and priests.
