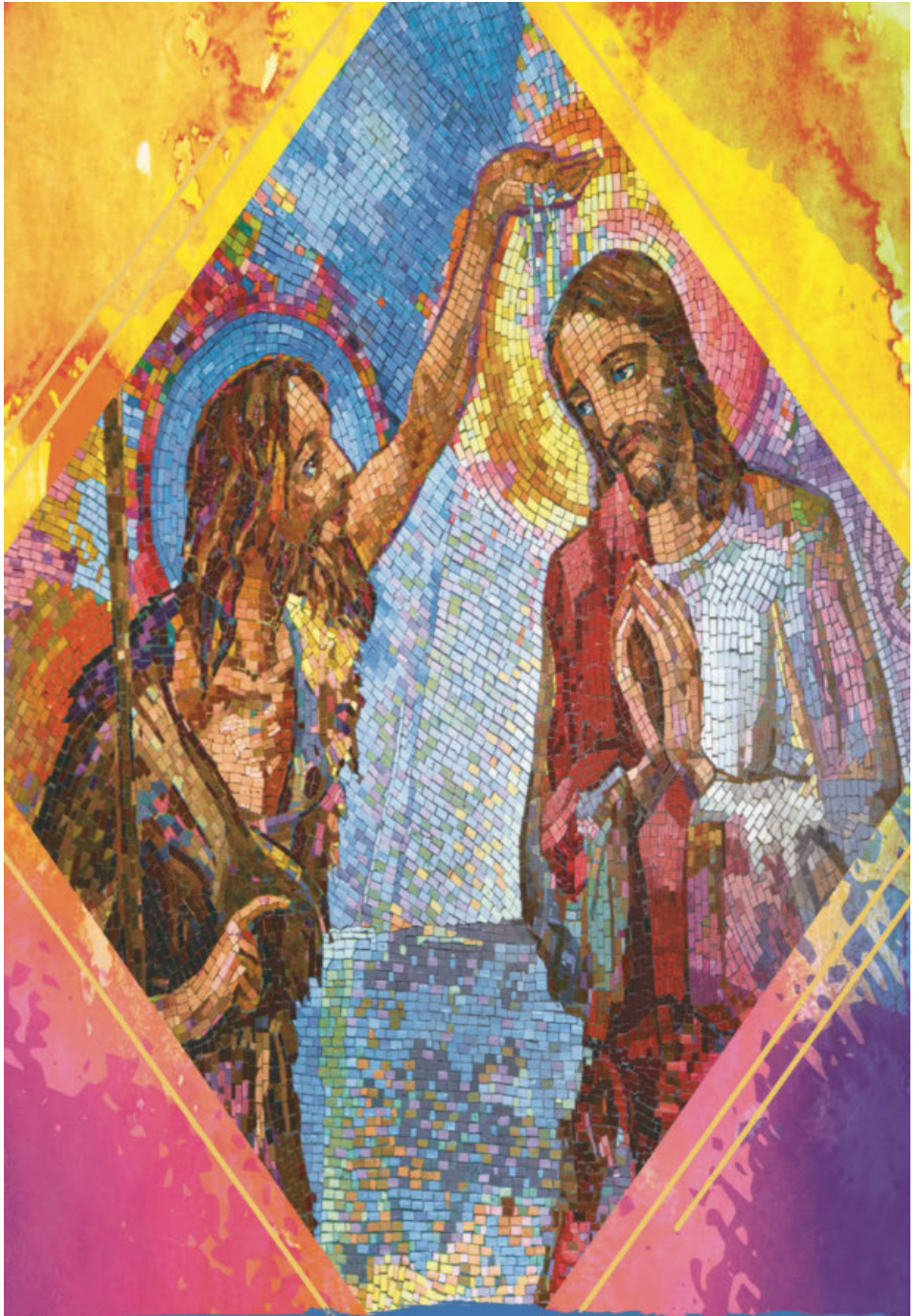

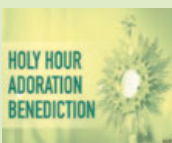

ST. ANTHONY/DEPAUL SCHOOL COLLECTION—JANUARY 14 & 15

The Pittsburgh Diocese is home to two nationally recognized educational programs for children with special needs: St. Anthony School Programs and DePaul School for Hearing and Speech (formerly known as The DePaul Institute). A special collection to benefit these two organizations will be taken this weekend. St. Anthony School Programs provides Catholic special education to children with development delays and autism in five elementary/intermediate classrooms, two secondary classrooms and two college-age programs located on the campuses of Duquesne University and the University of Pittsburgh. St. Anthony's has also partnered with Carlow University to add an academic component to the curriculum for qualified post-secondary students. DePaul School for Hearing and Speech provides Listening and Spoken Language (LSL) education to children who are deaf or hard of hearing. Without the use of sign language, DePaul students learn to listen and speak and successfully transition to their neighborhood schools alongside their peers with typical hearing. Your donation will help St. Anthony School Programs and DePaul School for Hearing and Speech to further their goals of providing quality educational programs and services to their students. 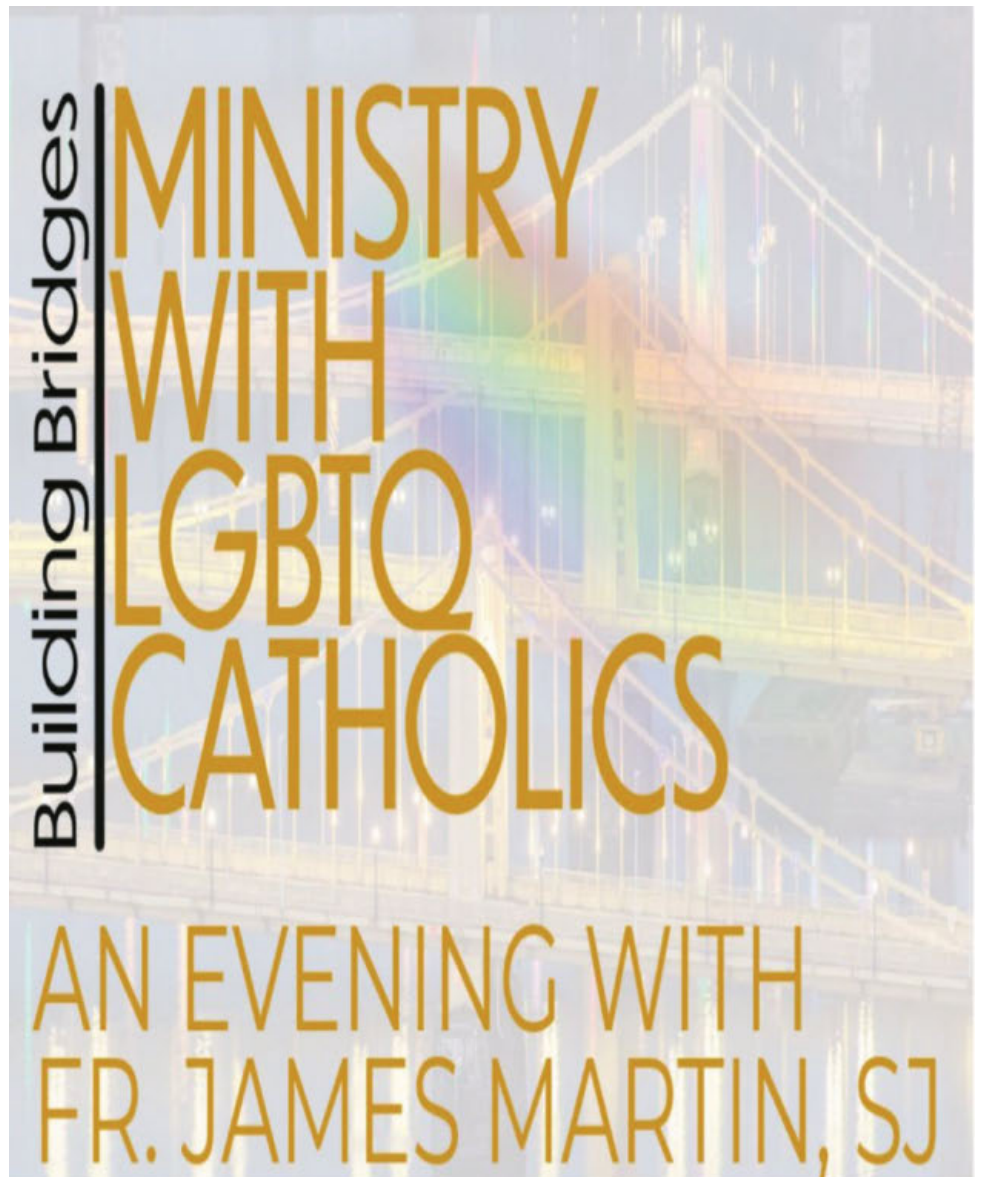

Due to the way the holidays fall this year and the date of the Super Bowl, the Knights can not get the Super Bowl Pool board to each Mass 2 times before the Super Bowl. In an attempt to not offend any parishioners, the board will be brought to each Mass time once. The schedule is below. Please **NOTE** on January 8th the board will be at St. Maurice **BEFORE MASS ONLY from 9:30 to 10:00 AM** and at Word of God it will available **ONLY AFTER MASS** from 11:00 to 11:30 AM. At all other Masses, the board will be available before and after Mass.

During the week, the board will be in the Parish Office on the St. Maurice Campus. You can come to the office to select your square or you can mail your check to the office and a square will be selected for you. Please put "Super Bowl" on the outside of the envelop. All checks should be made payable to "KofC #11391". Please don't mail cash to the office. At the churches, the Knights can only accept checks or cash, no credit cards at this time. After you put your name in a square on the front, turn the board over and print your name and phone number so we can contact you.

Please remember the board sold out very quickly last year. So get your square(s) early! You may not want to wait until the board gets to "Your Mass."

When the board is completely filled in, we will select two single digital numbers at random and put them along the top and side representing the last digit of the score for the first half and another, new number, for the second half for the NFC & AFC. The completed board will be copied and you can pick up a copy at the Parish Office or at the help desk at all Churches.

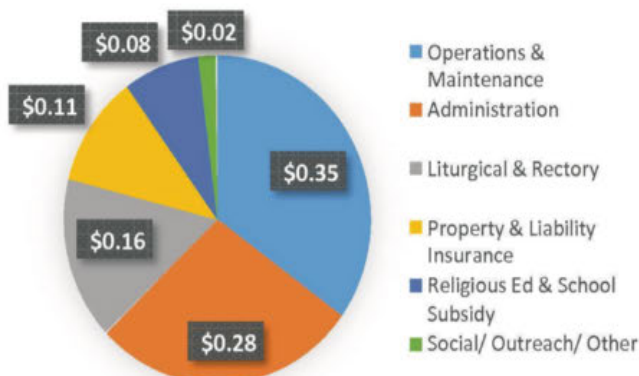
