3. The specific way that Jesus asks you to love him in return is to spend one quiet hour with him in the Blessed Sacrament. "Where your treasure is, there is your heart...." "Could you not watch one hour with me?" (Mt 6:21; 26:40)
4. When you look upon the Sacred Host, you look upon Jesus, the Son of God. "Indeed, this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks upon the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life. Him I will raise up on the last day." (Jn 6:40)
5. Each moment that you spend in His Eucharistic Presence will increase his divine life within you and deepen your personal relationship and friendship with him. "I have come that you may have life, and have it more abundantly." "I am the vine and you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him shall bear much fruit because without me, you can do nothing." (Jn 15:5)
6. Each hour you spend with Jesus will deepen his divine peace in your heart. "Come to me all of you who are weary and find life burdensome and I will refresh you..." "Cast all of you anxieties upon the one who cares for you..." "My Peace is My Gift to you." (Mt 11:28; Pt 5:7; Jn 14:17)


40 Days for Life - September 25 - Wednesday, September 25 following the noon time Mass at the Cathedral. There will be a procession to Planned Parenthood.


*Your angel is always with you all the time, even though you can't see him.

e-van' -gel-ize

Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life"

More than a year ago, our parish formed an Evangelization Team. We have spent much time and prayer, learning the reasons for the loss of faith in our society and the reasons why most of us Catholics don't do a very effective job of sharing our faith with others. We believe we have come up with an initiative to help with these two important situations .

While we know that the number of people who actively practice the faith in this region of the world is dwindling. In-fact we see some of our own numbers dwindle in our parish. But for those of us here today, our response is that of St. Peter to Jesus **"Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."**

Holy Name parish is 137 years old. It has a rich history and wonderful reputation, and that heritage belongs to all of us today as parishioners of Holy Name, no matter which Mass we attend. We have distinct worship communities that make up our regular weekend Mass attendees. We have the only Catholic Gospel choir in the state. We have two Masses offered in the Extraordinary Form, one with a Schola Cantorum. We have an African Catholic Community serving a diverse African population with a now-famous choir which has successfully launched a CD. But it is also necessary that we continue to find ways for our different Mass communities to interact with each other.

So how do we address these situations - the decline in the practice of the faith - and provide more opportunities for our parishioners to feel more connected to Holy Name parish?

We are instituting a parish-wide study program with a "back to basics" approach by using a program called "Symbolon" on FORMED. We've been promoting it over the past few weeks with pulpit announcements, features in the bulletin, and posters at the entrances of the Church and chapel. We invite you to look at it more closely.




Every Catholic Deserves to Know Their Story
