



Free Income Tax Preparation (VITA) Update

Amos House and the other Providence-based volunteer income tax preparation (VITA) sites are sponsoring free income tax preparation at a joint drop-off location for the remainder of the 2019 tax season, which concludes on July 15, 2020. Taxpayers making \$56,000 a year or less may drop off their tax forms at Federal Hill House, 9 Courtland Street in Providence, from 9:00am to noon on Mondays and Wednesdays and from 6:00pm to 8:00pm on Tuesdays. Their returns will be prepared off-site, and they'll be notified to come back when the returns have been completed. Taxpayers are asked to wear face masks and gloves. Other free tax drop-off sites in Rhode Island may be found by calling the number 211.

What has Been Happening???

This past Monday we had our quarterly inspection of the Fire Alarm System in the Church and Chapel. So far so good. The workmen should have arriving to do the work in the bell tower for T-Mobil cleaning on the inside and replacing all of the screening in the openings.

I spoke with one of the Architects involved with the drawing of the plans for the Parish Center. He assures me that all will be ready for the July meetings and the presentation to the Parish at the PicNic in August.

In the meantime we will be repairing one of the ceilings in a 3rd floor bedroom and hallway. Since the roof was repaired there does not seem to be any further leakage. Because it is an insurance issue, we will also be repairing the damage due to age on the Church chimney. At the same time it may be possible to do the necessary re-pointing on the

bell tower. The garage roof must be replaced before it falls in. Please keep these items in your thoughts and prayers.

The bulletin and the Prayer List are both available on the Parish website.

I hope that all of you have had a very blessed Mother's Day and that you were able to celebrate Ascension Thursday with a religious commemoration in the home or a visit to a Church. In addition to Wednesday, the Chapel will be open on Ascension Thursday from 7:30 AM until 8:00 PM for people to visit our Eucharistic Lord present for us in the Tabernacle.

Thank you again for all of your prayers for Fr. Lazarus and myself. Let us continue always in this unity of Prayer. Pax, Fr. Joseph





Sermon on the Feast of the Ascension

Thus did the One ascend to Heaven Who held heaven within Himself. He who carries hell within himself will end up in hell, but he who bears heaven within his soul will ascend to heaven. And truly, no one can ascend to heaven other than those who have heaven within; and no one can end up in hell besides those who have hell within. The familiar is drawn to what is familiar and unites with the familiar; but it rejects what is not familiar. Matter submits to the spirit to the extent that the human soul is filled with the Divine Spirit; and the laws of nature are obedient to moral laws, which govern the world. Because the Lord Jesus Christ is the fullness of the Holy Spirit and the perfection of moral law, to Him is subject all matter—the entire physical world, with all the laws of na-

Any person, as a spirit, can be victorious in his life over a certain law of nature, with the help of another law of nature—that is, he can overcome it with his own spirit. Christ, as the God-Man, could subject the laws of nature to Himself through the law of the Spirit, which is the supreme law of the created world. However, this concept, just as any other spiritual concept, can be but partially explained by ordinary earthly conceptualizations and

reasoning—and that only by examples and comparisons.

Spiritual things only become clear beyond a doubt when the spirit sees them and perceives them. In order to see and feel the manifestations of the spiritual world, long and exhausting spiritual practice is needed, after which, by God's grace, spiritual vision may be opened in a person; this vision allows him to see what seems unbelievable and impossible to ordinary mortals. Nevertheless, a person must first believe those who have seen the unbelievable, and strengthen their faith from day to day, striving to see what is inaccessible to the common gaze.

Not in vain does the Lord say, "Blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed" [John 20:29]. The Lord God rejoices in their faith just as a father on earth rejoices that his children believe his every word. All the apostles were present at the Ascension of the Lord, gathered on the hill. This was their last collective meeting. However, this was not the last appearance of Christ. Later He appeared in a vision to the Apostle Paul on the road to Damascus, to the Apostle John on the island of Patmos, and to other apostles, as well as to martyrs, holy hierarchs, and confessors, over the course of the entire history of the Christian Church.

But the day will come—and that day is not far off—when all the righteous men and women who firmly believed in Him throughout their lives will see Him. And around Him in the heaven will gather all those who were baptized on earth in His name—not only with water, but also with the Spirit and Fire. And they will enter into His joy, which the Heavenly Father has prepared for all His chosen, and will inherit a joy that they have never known before. +St. Nikolai Velimirovic


