## Pastors Note ~ 6th Sunday of Easter



The Gospel of John this Sunday is a small snippet from the lengthy Last Supper discourse: "Only one thing is necessary to receive the Holy Spirit, if you love me you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always. This is the Spirit of truth whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him. But you know him."

**The setting was the Last Supper.** He had announced His impending departure. The twelve were wiped out. The Christ had to lift His people off the floor and put them back on their soft cushions. He promised to continue His presence with them through a Helper. He would serve as their eternal Deus ex machina. The Helper would be the Holy Spirit. The Parakletos is summed up well in these lyrical words. Eternally the Holy Spirit is love between the Father and the Son but historically the Holy Spirit is love between God and the world. (*Fr. Daniel Durkin, OSB*)

The Church's historical record over two millennia shows that Jesus did not pull the legs of the apostles. He did not leave them orphans. Nor do people of faith accept that the promise has gone somewhere into limbo in the contemporary Church.

**One of our big challenges today is noted in the letter of I Peter:** Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope. Do it with gentleness and reverence, keeping your conscience clear...the same Spirit that is still inspiring us today. This is the way of Grace. Grace always begins with God's gifts of love. It reaches its goal when we respond by loving God in return. We have received grace. God has showered us with His love. Now He calls us to give witness to the world that His love is real. We can do this. We can proclaim Jesus Christ with our lives. We are good enough, plenty good enough. We are sons and daughters of God.

The courage to proclaim Jesus comes from the unconditional love God has for us. Reflect on all that God has done for us and is doing for us out of this great love. Who would not want to love in return, and thus follow his commandments?



### Consejo de Jerusalén: Scott Hahn Reflexiona Sobre el 6º Domingo de Pascua



Discurso de despedida a los apóstoles,  
Duccio, 1308-1311

Lecturas: Hechos 15,1–2.22–29 Salmo 67,2–3.5–6.8 Apocalipsis 21,10–14.22–23  
Juan 14, 23–29

El concilio de Jerusalén—primero de la Iglesia—del cual oímos en la primera lectura de este día, definió el perfil de la Iglesia como la conocemos hoy.

Algunos cristianos judaizantes querían que los conversos gentiles fueran circuncidados y se sometieran a las complicadas leyes de ritos y de pureza de los Judíos. El concilio consideró esto una herejía, mostrándonos que la Iglesia, según en el plan divino, es la familia de Dios extendida por toda la tierra, y no una alianza con una sola nación.

La liturgia de hoy nos ofrece una profunda meditación sobre la naturaleza y el significado de la Iglesia.

La Iglesia es Una, como vemos en la primera lectura cuando dice: "...los Apóstoles [obispos] y presbíteros [sacerdotes] de acuerdo con toda la Iglesia (laicos)".

La Iglesia es Santa, enseñada y guiada por el Espíritu que Jesús prometió a los Apóstoles en el Evangelio.

La Iglesia es Católica, o universal, pues enseña los caminos divinos de salvación a todos los pueblos, gobernándolos con equidad, como cantamos en el salmo de hoy.

Y la Iglesia, de acuerdo con la visión de Juan en la segunda lectura, es Apostólica, ya que está fundada sobre los doce Apóstoles del Cordero.

Estas características de la Iglesia se hacen hincapié en la narración sobre el concilio. Es notable que todos, incluyendo a San Pablo, miran hacia "Jerusalén [y]... los Apóstoles" para la decisión final sobre la verdadera enseñanza de la Iglesia. Los Apóstoles, por su parte, mencionan que los maestros cristianos necesitan su aprobación (un "mandato nuestro") para enseñar.

Y vemos al Espíritu guiando a los Apóstoles en toda verdad. Llama la atención como describen ellos su decreto: "...hemos decidido el Espíritu Santo y nosotros..." .

Al conocer estas verdades sobre la Iglesia, nuestros corazones nunca deberían turbarse. El mensaje que hoy nos da la liturgia es que la Iglesia es del Señor, y está custodiada y vigilada por el Abogado (el Paráclito), el Espíritu Santo enviado por el Padre en el nombre del Hijo.

Esto nos debería llenarnos de confianza y hacernos sentir libres para adorar rebosantes a Dios. Debería servirnos de inspiración para volver a ofrecer nuestras vidas a su Nombre; para demostrar nuestro amor a Jesús guardando su palabra; para regocijarnos de que Él y el Padre, en el Espíritu, han puesto su morada entre nosotros.
