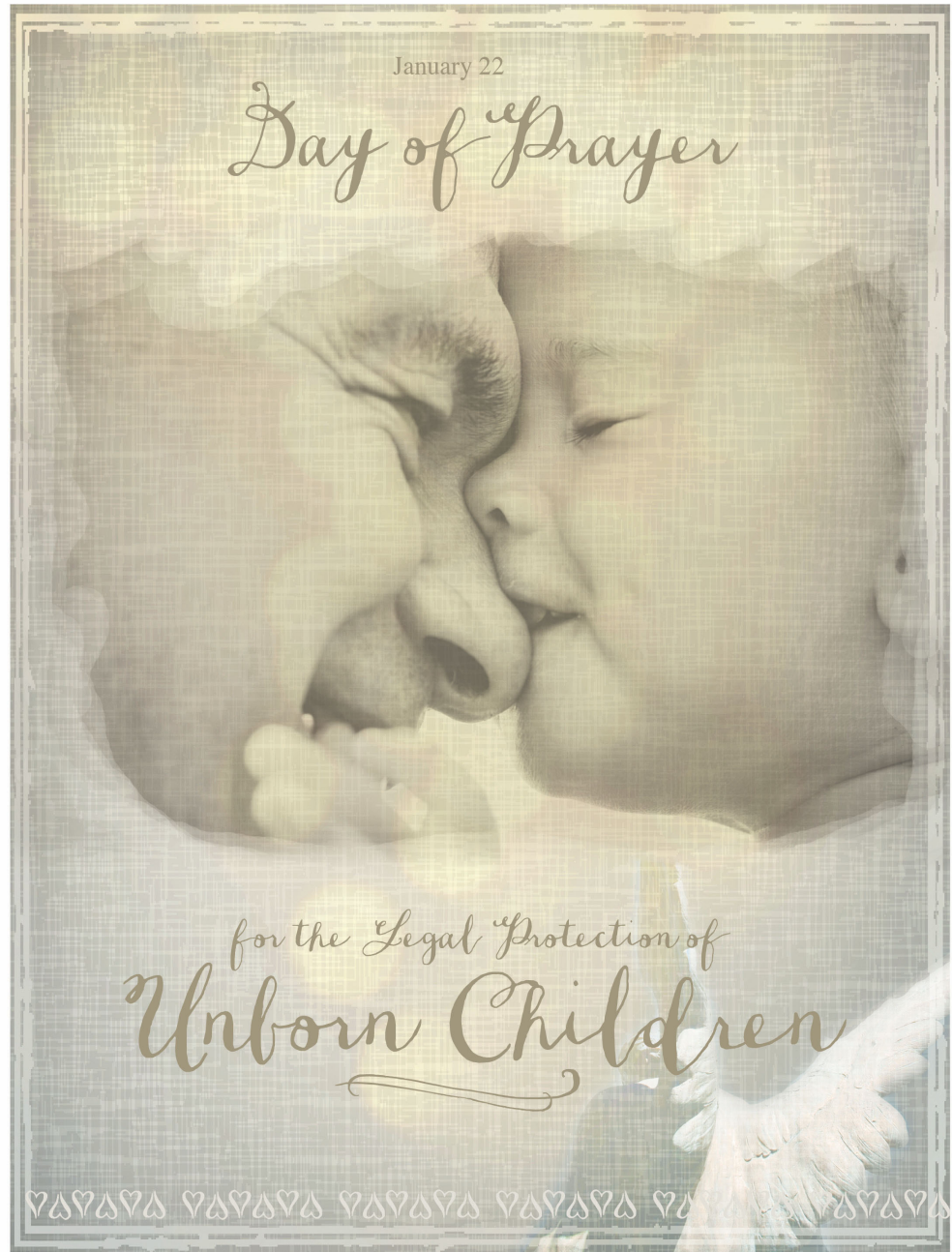

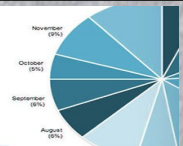

We are accepting Mass Intentions for 2020. Please keep in mind that we will only allow 3 Mass intentions, per recipient, per year.

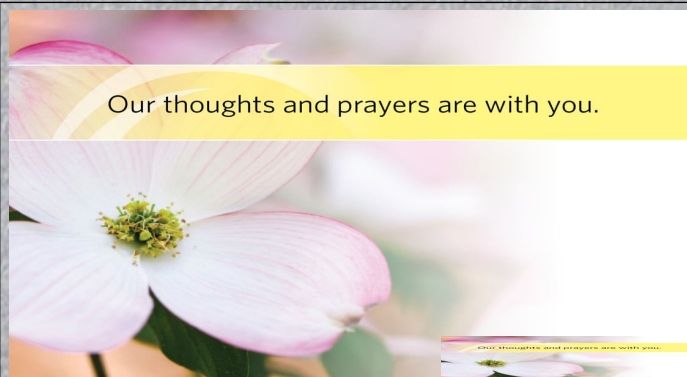
There will be no Mass intentions on holidays or holy days of obligation.

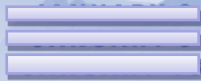

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SHARING A FEAST

One of the most fundamental ways that human beings offer love, respect, and compassion to one another is through the sharing of food and drink.

Certainly, Jesus did that during the wedding feast at Cana. As Catholics, we believe that Jesus' love for us is most fully expressed when he feeds us with his own body and blood in the Eucharist. Jeannie, who lived in an affluent city suburb, offered her services as a nurse on a Catholic medical mission. The

team travelled to a remote location in the hill country of eastern Haiti, setting up a temporary clinic next to the local church. For two weeks the volunteers worked long hours with limited supplies in a make-shift clinic serving hundreds of people with medical problems. As the day came for the clinic to close, the local people invited the medical team to a feast.

Knowing the great poverty of the Haitian people, Jeannie wondered what would be served. As the food was placed before her, she was amazed at the variety and quantity—sweet potatoes, fried goat with hot sauce, fried plantains, bread, cornmeal porridge, beans and rice, and a special pineapple drink. “How,” Jeannie asked the local pastor, “could the people manage to give us this good meal?” “Jeannie,” he said, “they believe that God sent you all to us to bring healing, and this feast is their way of thanking God with the best they could find. They each gave a little so that we could all share a lot.” Everyone, including the servers and the cooks, ate until it was all gone. Jeannie thought that no food had ever tasted so good to her. She went home with a profound respect for the generosity of people who “have nothing” but shared so much.

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COMPARTAMOS EL FESTÍN

Una de las maneras fundamentales en que los seres humanos ofrecemos amor, respeto y compasión entre nosotros es por medio de compartir comidas y bebidas. Jesús ciertamente hizo lo mismo en la fiesta de la boda de Caná. Como católicos, nosotros creemos que la manera más explícita y total en que Jesús nos alimenta es con su propio cuerpo y sangre en la

Eucaristía. Juanita, que vivía en un lugar opulento de una ciudad, ofreció sus servicios de enfermera en una misión católica de asistencia médica. El equipo se dirigió a un lugar remoto y montañoso de la región oriental de Haití donde establecieron una clínica temporal junto a la iglesia local. Durante dos semanas las personas voluntarias trabajaron largas horas con recursos limitados en una clínica improvisada para atender a cientos de personas con problemas de salud. Al acercarse el día en que se cerraría la clínica, las personas de la localidad invitaron al equipo médico a una fiesta. Conociendo la pobreza tan grande de los haitianos, Juanita se preguntaba qué servirían. Pero a medida que iban poniendo la comida sobre la mesa ella no salía de su asombro al ver la variedad y cantidad de alimentos—batata, cabrito frito en salsa picante, plátanos fritos, pan, guiso de maíz, arroz con frijoles y una bebida especial de piña. “¿Cómo se las han arreglado estas personas para ofrecernos una comida tan buena?”, le preguntó ella al párroco. Éste le contestó así: “Juanita, ellos creen que Dios los envió a ustedes para sanarlos y con este festín le dan gracias a Dios con lo mejor que pueden encontrar. Cada uno de ellos da un poco para que nosotros podamos compartir mucho”. Todos, incluso los sirvientes y cocineros, comieron hasta que todo se acabó. Juanita pensó que nunca antes había probado alimentos que le supieran tan sabrosos y regresó a casa con un profundo respeto por la generosidad de personas que “no tienen nada”, pero ofrecen mucho.

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CALLED TO BE HOLY

With this Sunday we begin Ordinary Time. The readings tell us about God's relationship with Israel and John the Baptist's relationship with Jesus. Israel's relationship with God is so close, so intimate, that it is through Israel that God's “salvation [will] reach to the ends of the earth” (Isaiah 49:6). But we know from John the Baptist that for Israel to accomplish God's will, it must also recognize that Jesus is the Son of God. During these weeks we also get to know Jesus. We begin to understand more deeply our relationship to Jesus and what that relationship means for us, who are “called to be holy”

SAN VICENTE (Siglo III)

22 de enero

San Vicente nació en Zaragoza, España y, debido a su buen uso de la palabra y formación académica, fue nombrado como coadjutor del obispo Valerio para que le ayudara en la predicación, pues el obispo era tartamudo. Una vez ordenado diácono se distinguió por la predicación elocuente y la defensa de la fe. Fue arrestado mientras visitaba a su obispo, preso a causa de la persecución impulsada por el emperador Daciano quien, al saber que visitó a su obispo mandó que lo apresaran, haciéndolo caminar desde Zaragoza hasta Valencia. Una vez preso se le sometió a la tortura, no obstante, la tortura no lograba nada y el emperador, lleno de ira, mandó que golpearan a los torturadores. Posteriormente le hizo encerrar en una celda oscura, llena de tientos filosos para que se cortara sus pies, pero no renunció a su fe cristiana, convirtió al carcelero y cantó himnos de alabanza. Finalmente, puesto que nada lograba contra él, lo encarceló de por vida y ahí, en la soledad de su celda y sus enfermedades encontró la muerte.

PARA REPORTAR EL ABUSO SEXUAL DE UN MENOR
