CANDLEMAS

Today we hear how Jesus is presented in the temple for ceremonies proper to a firstborn son. He is recognized as “a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel” by the prophet Simeon (Luke 2:32), and his power is proclaimed by the prophetess Anna. (The prophetic role is not to predict the future, but to proclaim God’s truth.) This day is also known as Candlemas. Many Americans have never heard of Candlemas, but know it as Groundhog Day. German immigrants to Pennsylvania were accustomed to looking for bears or badgers appearing from hibernation around this date, and observed the animals’ shadows as a weather predictor. The custom changed on this side of the Atlantic where groundhogs are more plentiful and less dangerous to handle. Also from Germany comes this rhyme:

*Storms and snow on Candlemas Day,
Spring is not very far away.
If it’s sunny, bright, and clear,
Springtime is not yet near.*

Candlemas acquired its name because of the church custom of blessing candles on this date, candles to be used in church during the coming year and candles brought by ordinary people for use in their homes and places of work. For many centuries candles were the only source of light, and a much weaker light than we are used to. People who lived in earlier times were therefore only too well aware of the powers of darkness, both literally and symbolically. For us, who can turn on bright light with the flip of a switch, the most compelling experience we have of light transforming darkness comes at the Easter Vigil when the lighted Easter candle is brought into a darkened church, “Christ our Light” is proclaimed three times, and then the light is passed candle to candle among the assembled people. LA CANDELARIA

Hoy escuchamos cómo Jesús es presentado en el templo con las ceremonias propias de un hijo primogénito. El profeta Simeón lo reconoce como la “luz que alumbra las naciones y gloria de tu pueblo, Israel” (Lucas

2:32), y la profetisa Ana proclama el poder del Niño. (El papel profético no es el de predecir el futuro, sino el de proclamar la verdad de Dios). Este día también se conoce como la Candelaria. Muy pocos estadounidenses saben de la Candelaria, pero muchos sí conocen el Groundhog Day o Día de la Marmota. Esto se deriva de una costumbre que tenían los inmigrantes alemanes en Pennsylvania de buscar osos o tejones, que salían de sus madrigueras alrededor de esta fecha, y observaban las sombras de estos animales con el propósito de pronosticar el tiempo. La costumbre cambió en Norteamérica debido a que las marmotas son más abundantes y menos peligrosas. De Alemania también nos llega esta rima, traducida aquí libremente al español:

*El Día de la Candelaria, tormentas y nieve,
La primavera ya viene.
Si brilla el sol y está claro el día
El tiempo primaveral aún no tiene cercanía.*

El nombre de la Candelaria tiene su origen en la costumbre de la Iglesia de bendecir velas en este día, ya sean las velas que se usarán en la iglesia durante ese año así como también las que traen las personas para después usarlas en sus respectivos hogares o centros de trabajo. Durante muchos siglos las velas eran las únicas fuentes de luz y una luz mucho más débil de la que estamos acostumbrados hoy. Por tanto, las personas de la antigüedad conocían muy bien el poder de las tinieblas, tanto en su sentido literal como simbólicamente. Para nosotros, que podemos encender la luz con sólo tocar un interruptor, la experiencia más convincente que tenemos de cómo la luz transforma la oscuridad es en la Vigilia Pascual al entrar en la iglesia el cirio pascual. “Cristo, luz del mundo” se proclama tres veces y entonces se va pasando la luz del cirio, de vela en vela, entre toda la asamblea.

SAN FELIPE DE JESÚS (1572-1597)

5 de febrero

Felipillo, como era conocido, nació en la Ciudad de México en una familia de comerciantes.

Dado que su vida era un desastre, una de las africanas que cuidaba dijo que la higuera seca del patio “florecería cuando Felipillo fuera santo”. Luego de explorar la vida franciscana y huir de ella, su padre lo envió a Filipinas para que probara suerte en los negocios, pero esta vida tampoco le llenó. Ingresó nuevamente a la Orden Franciscana en Filipinas y, con el paso de los años fue enviado a México para ser ordenado sacerdote. Su barco naufragó en Japón durante un período de persecución contra los cristianos liderado por el emperador Taicosama. En su calidad de extranjero, Felipillo podía evitar el martirio, pero decidió unirse a sus compañeros franciscanos y jesuitas y sufrir con ellos la muerte por Cristo. Lo colgaron de una cruz, lo sujetaron con argollas y dos lanzas lo traspasaron. En su agonía repetía una y otra vez: “Jesús, Jesús, Jesús”, de ahí que se le venere como Felipe de Jesús. El día de su muerte, la higuera floreció.

Ang background sa Ebanghelyo Ngayon ipinagdiriwang ng Simbahan ang Pista ng Pagtatanghal ni Jesus sa templo. Ang Pagtatanghal, na ipinagdiriwang 40 araw pagkatapos ng Pasko, ay hindi nabanggit sa iba pang mga Ebanghelyo. Si Lucas lamang ang nagsasabi ng kuwento, malamang dahil sumulat siya para sa mga Hentil na Kristiyano na hindi pamilyar sa Hudong seremonya ng pagtatanghal at paglilinis. Bilang karagdagan, ang hangarin ng Ebanghelyo ni Lucas ay upang ipakita na ang pangako ng Diyos sa Israel, na natutupad kay Jesus, ay umaabot sa mga Hentil. Kinilala ni Lucas si Jose at Maria bilang tapat na mga Hudyo na nagdala kay Jesus sa Templo sa Jerusalem. Dito ipinakita ang kanilang panganay na anak sa Panginoon. Sa gayon si Jesus ay inilaan ayon sa hinihiling ng Batas ni Moises. Kasalukuyan sa templo sa oras na ito ay sina Simeon at Anna. Parehong naghihintay sa pagpapanumbalik ng pamamahala ng Diyos sa Israel. Ipinangako ni Simeon ng Banal na Espiritu na makikita niya si Kristo na Panginoon, ang Mesiyas, bago siya namatay. Agad na kinilala ng banal na bata ang sanggol na si Jesus bilang ipinangakong Tagapagligtas, isang "ilaw para sa pagpapahayag sa mga Hentil, at luwalhati para sa iyong bayang Israel." Kinilala din ni Anna si Jesus bilang katuparan ng pangako ng pagtubos at binanggit ang tungkol sa kanya sa lahat.

Live Mercy – Be Holy

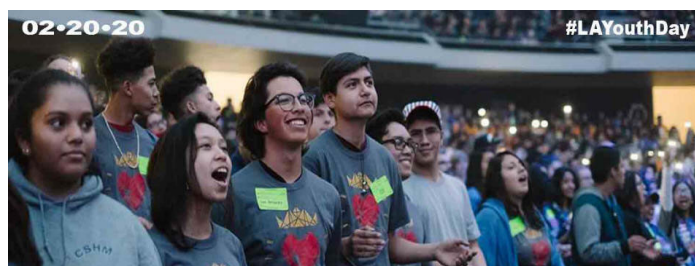
Mercy and Holiness are two aspects of God's essence, and God's invitation for us to live out in turn.

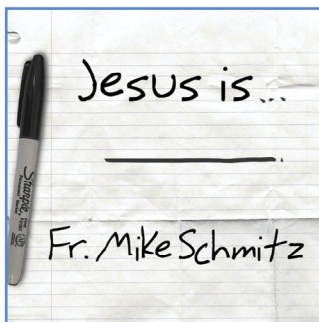

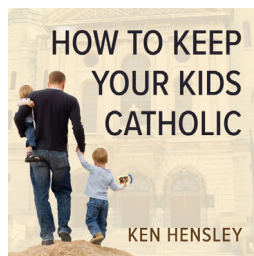

A CHRISTMAS REPRISE

The Church's celebration three weeks ago of the Baptism of the Lord signaled the "official" end of the Christmas season. Today's feast of the Presentation of the Lord seems to extend the Incarnation celebration a bit longer. In fact, some have called this feast a "second Epiphany." The first reading recalls the anticipation of Advent, as Malachi writes, "Lo, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me." The reading from Hebrews reminds us of the Incarnation, proclaiming that Jesus had a "share" in our own "blood and flesh." The Gospel finds the infant Jesus on his first visit to Jerusalem and his human parents once again surprised and in awe over the events surround his birth. In the simplicity of the manger, in the grandeur of the temple, in the domesticity of Nazareth, Jesus comes. May we come to know him and so be filled with "wisdom" and the "favor of God."
