TRANSITIONAL HOUSING RESOURCES

Quinte West Transitional Units

Available to families; can stay for up to 30 days while transitioning to permanent housing. Individuals will be referred to meet with an Intensive Case Manager at the Hastings Housing Resource Centre, with the goal of securing permanent housing/accommodation before the end of their 30-day stay.

Note: After Hours service is not available - must be referred during regular business hours.

Enrichment Centre for Mental Health

Vacancies are filled on a first come first serve basis and the length of stay is conditional upon the individual's efforts to achieve their goals. Rent is charged according to Ontario Works (OW) or Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) rental allowance rates. Individuals in the transitional housing program will be provided with the opportunity to work with a Enrichment Centre Counsellor, bi-weekly, on goals such as securing safe affordable housing, obtaining personal documents and finding employment. There are a total of 20 beds in designated seniors, male and female houses.
