From the Pastor

A Reflection from the Fifth Sunday of Easter

Early in the Acts of the Apostles, St. Luke, who is the author, tells us that the community of believers was "... of one heart and soul...there was not a needy person among them, for as many as were owners of lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold and laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need." It appears that this did not last long. Luke will also tell of the divisions that developed in the church between Jews and non-Jews, with the non-Jews complaining that their people are being neglected in the distribution of food. You can almost hear the exasperation in the apostles' voices, "...it is not right that we neglect the Word for waiting on tables."

Of course, the solution to the problem is found in the community itself. The apostles ask that 7 men be identified whom they would charge with the ministry of serving the everyday needs of the people. These men would be "diakonoï", servants, or as we would say today, "deacons", whose ministries freed the pastors of the church to do what they were charged to do, to preach, to lead, and to pray. This principle of empowering others to do as their competency and authority permit them is the principle of subsidiarity, a foundational element of Catholic social doctrine.

One Catholic commentator I read recently posed the question, "Is the Church a cruise ship or a battleship?" I found both the analogy and his commentary on the state of most US parishes to be striking. By posing the question in this way, he wanted to provoke this reflection: Do we look at the church as a place where we come to be served or where we serve according to the command and example of Jesus? The Church, of course, is not a cruise ship. This is not where we come to be "entertained" for one hour a week, or to be lavishly fed on a buffet where we can pick and choose what we want, or where we can avoid stormy seas by not engaging our time with the human and Christian values meant to transform it. We are and must be "all hands on deck", where we do not complain that "somebody ought to do something about... fill in the blank for yourself" but where each member of the Body of Christ learns how to put their gifts and resources in service to the mission of Christ and the needs of the community.

We live in a time when we priests are becoming fewer and fewer. Thankfully, we're seeing an upswing of men in our diocese responding to the call of God to be priests. But there are still many priests in our diocese and throughout the country who are alone in their parishes and must carry heavy burdens with little to no assistance.

The church is not a cruise ship where a handful of people serve everyone else who is relaxing.




No, the church is a battleship where it's "all hands on deck" and everyone serves the mission.



Our parishes have many needs. Contrary to what many believe, most parishes, including our own, are not sitting on vast financial reserves. Many parishes struggle to meet their obligations and grow their ministries. Ministry cannot happen unless we provide the resources needed for it, which in the first place, is our faith and active participation in the life of the parish, even if that participation is interceding for me, our clergy, and the needs of our people. Christ calls us to put our gifts in service to one another, even if they seem little in our own eyes. If we're looking for someone else to take up the call to serve, then, according to our commentator, we're on the cruise ship looking to *be served*.

Jesus tells Thomas that He is the way, and what is that way if it is not what He said of Himself that He comes, not to be served, but to serve? Our greatness is found in this call to humble service. We cannot wait for another to answer it for us. This is what the apostles did by calling forth the first deacons of the Church so that they would not be neglectful of the apostolic charge Christ laid on them. This is what every parish and Christian community must do; identify and form servants who, under their pastors, are empowered to use their gifts in service to the mission and in care for the community, which is another way of saying we must constantly seek to turn the cruise ship mentality into the battleship mentality. Our times call for "all hands on deck!"

Bishop's Annual Appeal Update

I am pleased to inform you that, once again, we have exceeded our goal for the 2025 Bishop's Annual Appeal. To date, \$187,726 has been pledged toward our \$181,000 goal, with \$144,830 received in actual revenues. This means that, although we have exceeded goal in pledges, we are still \$36,169 short of achieving/exceeding goal in collected revenues. Once we achieve goal, 50% of the revenues generated over goal are returned to the parish so that we can better provide for our needs.

Del párroco

Una Reflexión del Quinto Domingo de Pascua

Al principio de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, San Lucas, su autor, nos dice que la comunidad de creyentes estaba "...unida de corazón y alma... no había ningún necesitado entre ellos, porque todos los que poseían tierras o casas las vendían, llevaban el dinero de lo vendido y lo ponían a los pies de los apóstoles, y se repartía a cada uno según su necesidad." Parece que esto no duró mucho. Lucas también relata las divisiones que surgieron en la Iglesia entre judíos y no judíos, con los no judíos quejándose de que su gente estaba siendo descuidada en la distribución de los alimentos. Casi se puede oír la exasperación en las voces de los apóstoles: "...no es justo que abandonemos la Palabra para servir a las mesas."

Por supuesto, la solución al problema se encuentra en la misma comunidad. Los apóstoles piden que se identifiquen siete hombres a quienes encomendarían el ministerio de atender las necesidades diarias del pueblo. Estos hombres serían "diakonoí", siervos, o como diríamos hoy, "diáconos", cuyos ministerios liberaban a los pastores de la Iglesia para que pudieran cumplir con lo que se les había encomendado: predicar, guiar y orar. Este principio de facultar a otros para actuar según sus capacidades y autoridad es el principio de subsidiariedad, un elemento fundamental de la doctrina social católica.

Un comentarista católico que leí recientemente planteó la pregunta: "¿Es la Iglesia un crucero o un buque de guerra?" Encontré tanto la analogía como su comentario sobre el estado de la mayoría de las parroquias de EE. UU. muy impactantes. Al formular la pregunta de esta manera, quería provocar esta reflexión: ¿Vemos la Iglesia como un lugar al que venimos para ser servidos o como un lugar en el que servimos, siguiendo el mandato y el ejemplo de Jesús? Por supuesto, la Iglesia no es un crucero. No venimos aquí para ser "entretendidos" durante una hora a la semana, ni para ser alimentados en un buffet donde podemos escoger lo que nos gusta, ni para evitar los mares tormentosos sin involucrarnos con los valores humanos y cristianos que están llamados a transformarlos. Somos y debemos ser "todos manos a la obra", sin quejarnos de que "alguien debería hacer algo sobre... complete usted mismo la frase", sino donde cada miembro del Cuerpo de Cristo aprenda a poner sus dones y recursos al servicio de la misión de Cristo y de las necesidades de la comunidad.

Vivimos en un tiempo en que los sacerdotes somos cada vez menos. Afortunadamente, estamos viendo un aumento de hombres en nuestra diócesis que responden al llamado de Dios al sacerdocio. Pero aún hay muchos sacerdotes en nuestra diócesis y en todo el país que están solos en sus parroquias y deben cargar con grandes responsabilidades con poca o ninguna ayuda.



Nuestras parroquias tienen muchas necesidades. Contrario a lo que muchos creen, la mayoría de las parroquias, incluida la nuestra, no cuentan con grandes reservas financieras. Muchas parroquias luchan por cumplir con sus obligaciones y hacer crecer sus ministerios. El ministerio no puede llevarse a cabo si no proporcionamos los recursos necesarios, que en primer lugar, son nuestra fe y nuestra participación activa en la vida parroquial, incluso si esa participación consiste en interceder por mí, por nuestro clero y por las necesidades de nuestro pueblo. Cristo nos llama a poner nuestros dones al servicio de los demás, incluso si nos parecen pequeños. Si estamos esperando que otro responda al llamado al servicio, entonces, según nuestro comentarista, estamos en el crucero esperando ser servidos.

Jesús le dice a Tomás que Él es el camino, ¿y qué es ese camino sino lo que Él dijo de sí mismo, que vino no para ser servido, sino para servir? Nuestra grandeza se encuentra en esta llamada al servicio humilde. No podemos esperar que otro responda por nosotros. Esto es lo que hicieron los apóstoles al llamar a los primeros diáconos de la Iglesia, para no descuidar el encargo apostólico que Cristo les había confiado. Esto es lo que cada parroquia y comunidad cristiana debe hacer: identificar y formar servidores que, bajo sus pastores, estén facultados para usar sus dones en servicio de la misión y en el cuidado de la comunidad. Es otra forma de decir que debemos buscar constantemente transformar la mentalidad del crucero en la del buque de guerra. ¡Nuestros tiempos reclaman "todos manos a la obra"!


