From the Pastor

A Reflection from the Solemnity of Peter and Paul, Apostles


On a July night in 64AD, a fire broke out in the city of Rome. The fire burned for six days, devastating 10 of the 14 districts of the city, killing hundreds and leaving thousands homeless. Historians have debated the cause of the fire for centuries – whether it was an accident or set by the Emperor Nero himself to make space for his new palace – but this we do know; the public outcry against Nero was so great that he shifted the blame to an obscure but growing religious sect in the city called Christians. According to the Roman historian Tacitus, hundreds of Christians were arrested and charged with “hatred of the human race”. They were put to death in a brutal spectacle in the city’s circuses to placate the angry Roman mob.

There is an ancient Christian tradition that tells us that Peter, who was in Rome at this time, was fleeing the city when the Lord appeared to him on the Appian Way, walking toward Rome. Peter fell at the Lord’s feet and asked, “Quo vadis, Domine?”, “Where are you going, Lord?”. Jesus answered him, “I am going to Rome to be crucified for a second time.” As suddenly as He appeared, Christ disappeared. Peter understood the message. Christ was going where Peter feared to go. Peter turned around and returned to Rome, where he was apprehended and put to death by crucifixion upside-down in Nero’s circus on Vatican Hill for the entertainment of the mob. Paul, who was already under house arrest in Rome, was beheaded a short time later. This was the beginning of the age of the martyrs, a time of brutal persecution for the Church by Imperial Rome, which would last for the next 300 years.

This legendary event on the Appian Way captures the moment when the words Jesus spoke to Peter once by the Sea of Galilee that “another would bind him and take him where he does not want to go” would be fulfilled (Jn.21:18). Peter once denied Jesus out of cowardice and now he was about to do it again. He remembered the charcoal fire by the seashore and the Lord’s questions to him, “Do you love me? Then tend my sheep”. Love would now triumph over fear in Peter. He would return to the city to accompany the flock being butchered in the public arenas because they were the Lord’s and he was their shepherd.

“Where are you going, Lord?” has implications for us as well. It asks whether we are willing to follow where Christ leads.

Both Peter and Paul, the apostolic foundations on which we stand, had their moments of weakness and doubt, as we do. Peter, the Rock, denied Him three times out of fear. Paul, the zealous and proud Pharisee, fiercely persecuted Christ’s body, the Church, until he met the Lord on the road to Damascus. But these were still the Lord’s chosen instruments. Christ still called both, transformed both, and sent both to be his witnesses to the ends of the earth. Both “finished the race and kept the faith,” and in this, we seek to model ourselves after them.



The Church is built on the grace that transformed Peter and Paul, a grace that finds us when we are running away, when we are afraid, when we are overwhelmed, or feeling lost. This grace asks us, “Quo vadis”? “Where are you going?” And then gently but firmly, the Lord answers, “For I am going to Rome. Come, follow me.”

In our world today, it can be tempting to flee from the demands of faith, to avoid the cross at all costs, to walk away from Rome—whether Rome means the duties we must keep, the truth we need to face, the sacrifices we need to make, or simply the next hard but holy step we must take to grow in faith and right living before God. Jesus is still walking toward the place of crucifixion, toward the city, toward the people who need us to accompany them through their trials and sufferings. He’s still asking us to follow Him to Rome.

We honor Peter and Paul today, the apostolic foundations on which the Church is built. But not just with words and ritual. We must honor them with lives shaped by the same question and the same response.

We must walk with Christ with courage and trust into Rome, whatever Rome may be for us, and accompany with true witness and care those in our families, our workplaces, our parish and community, who need us to do the hard thing, loving them may ask of us. For in following Jesus to the cross, we too will find our true mission, our peace, and, as Paul said, the crown of righteousness that the Lord has ready for all who long for His appearing.

Quo vadis, Domine? For where you go, Lord, we will follow.



Del párroco

Una Reflexión para la Solemnidad de San Pedro y San Pablo, Apóstoles


En una noche de julio del año 64 d.C., se desató un incendio en la ciudad de Roma. El fuego ardió durante seis días, devastando 10 de los 14 distritos de la ciudad, matando a cientos de personas y dejando a miles sin hogar. Durante siglos, los historiadores han debatido la causa del incendio —si fue un accidente o si el propio emperador Nerón lo provocó para hacer espacio para su nuevo palacio—, pero esto sí lo sabemos: la indignación pública contra Nerón fue tan grande que él desvió la culpa hacia una secta religiosa poco conocida pero creciente en la ciudad: los cristianos. Según el historiador romano Tácito, cientos de cristianos fueron arrestados y acusados de “odio al género humano”. Fueron ejecutados en un brutal espectáculo en los circos de la ciudad para calmar a la enfurecida multitud romana.

Existe una antigua tradición cristiana que nos dice que Pedro, quien se encontraba en Roma en ese momento, huía de la ciudad cuando el Señor se le apareció en la Vía Apia, caminando hacia Roma. Pedro cayó a los pies del Señor y le preguntó: “¿Quo vadis, Domine?”, “¿A dónde vas, Señor?”. Jesús le respondió: “Voy a Roma a ser crucificado por segunda vez”. Tan repentinamente como apareció, Cristo desapareció. Pedro entendió el mensaje. Cristo iba a donde Pedro temía ir. Pedro dio la vuelta y regresó a Roma, donde fue arrestado y ejecutado por crucifixión, boca abajo, en el circo de Nerón, en la colina del Vaticano, para entretenimiento del público. Pablo, que ya estaba bajo arresto domiciliario en Roma, fue decapitado poco tiempo después. Así comenzó la era de los mártires, un tiempo de brutal persecución de la Iglesia por parte de la Roma imperial, que duraría los siguientes 300 años.

Este evento legendario en la Vía Apia representa el momento en que se cumplirían las palabras que Jesús le dijo a Pedro una vez junto al mar de Galilea: “Otro te ceñirá y te llevará a donde no quieras ir” (Jn 21,18). Pedro había negado a Jesús una vez por cobardía y ahora estaba a punto de hacerlo de nuevo. Recordó el fuego de carbón en la orilla del mar y las preguntas del Señor: “¿Me amas? Entonces apacienta mis ovejas”. El amor triunfaría ahora sobre el miedo en Pedro. Regresaría a la ciudad para acompañar al rebaño que estaba siendo masacrado en las arenas públicas porque eran del Señor, y él era su pastor.

“¿A dónde vas, Señor?” también tiene implicaciones para nosotros. Nos cuestiona si estamos dispuestos a seguir adonde Cristo nos conduce.

Tanto Pedro como Pablo, los fundamentos apostólicos sobre los que estamos edificados, tuvieron momentos de debilidad y duda, al igual que nosotros. Pedro, la Roca, lo negó tres veces por miedo. Pablo, el fariseo celoso y orgulloso, persiguió ferozmente el cuerpo de Cristo, la Iglesia, hasta que encontró al Señor en el camino a Damasco. Pero aún así, fueron instrumentos escogidos por el Señor. Cristo los llamó, los transformó y los envió a ser sus testigos hasta los confines de la tierra. Ambos “combatieron el buen combate, terminaron la carrera y conservaron la fe”, y en esto, buscamos modelarnos según ellos.



La Iglesia está edificada sobre la gracia que transformó a Pedro y a Pablo, una gracia que nos encuentra cuando huimos, cuando tenemos miedo, cuando nos sentimos abrumados o perdidos. Esta gracia nos pregunta: “¿Quo vadis?” “¿A dónde vas?” Y entonces, suave pero firmemente, el Señor responde: “Voy a Roma. Ven, sígueme”.

En nuestro mundo de hoy, puede ser tentador huir de las exigencias de la fe, evitar la cruz a toda costa, alejarse de Roma —ya sea que Roma represente los deberes que debemos cumplir, la verdad que debemos enfrentar, los sacrificios que necesitamos hacer, o simplemente el próximo paso difícil pero santo que debemos tomar para crecer en la fe y vivir rectamente ante Dios. Jesús aún camina hacia el lugar de la crucifixión, hacia la ciudad, hacia las personas que necesitan que las acompañemos en sus pruebas y sufrimientos. Él sigue pidiéndonos que lo sigamos a Roma.

Hoy honramos a Pedro y a Pablo, los fundamentos apostólicos sobre los que se edifica la Iglesia. Pero no solo con palabras y ritos. Debemos honrarlos con vidas moldeadas por la misma pregunta y la misma respuesta.

Debemos caminar con Cristo con valentía y confianza hacia Roma, cualquiera que sea nuestra Roma, y acompañar con verdadero testimonio y cuidado a aquellos en nuestras familias, nuestros lugares de trabajo, nuestra parroquia y comunidad, que necesitan que hagamos lo difícil que el amor por ellos nos exige. Porque al seguir a Jesús hasta la cruz, también encontraremos nuestra verdadera misión, nuestra paz y, como dijo Pablo, la corona de justicia que el Señor tiene preparada para todos los que anhelan su venida.

¿Quo vadis, Domine? Porque adonde vayas, Señor, te seguiremos.


