Aware that October is Respect Life Month, we pray for a greater respect for the God-given gift of life. It is important for us to continue to read

and often times to reread inspirational writings and talks that address this important issue. We usually tend to read something on the topic that once inspired us at the time and don't find ourselves going back and rereading them. We do this also with some videos that have inspired us but we don't revisit them. What is important about inspirational writings and talks, if they are true, they will continue to ring true long into the future. Truth always remains true. Truth passes the test of time. It is also important to remember, we have changed. Because we have changed, our insights tend to be greater and more in depth. I would say that the seed of truth has been growing in our minds and hearts. This is a great thing.

A great example is a talk given by Mother Teresa of Calcutta at the National Prayer Breakfast in Washington, D.C. in 1994. The now Saint Teresa spoke on a number of Life Issues. What she said in her talk still rings true twenty-eight years later. Truth is truth!! In her talk she reflected on many life issues; two particular reflections she offered caught my attention then and today. These two issues had to do with love for elderly and love for the unborn.

She told the story about a time when she visited a nursing home in the United States. She reflected in her talk... "I can never forget the experience I had in visiting a home where they kept all these old parents of sons and daughters who had just put them into an institution and, maybe, forgotten them. I say that in the home these old people had everything: good food, comfortable place, television – everything. But everyone was looking toward the door. And I did not see a single one with a smile on his/her face."

She continued, "I turned to Sister and I asked, 'Why do these people, who have every comfort here – why are they all looking toward the door? Why are they not smiling?' (I am so used to seeing the smiles on our people, even the dying smile.) And Sister said, 'This is the way it is, nearly every day. They are expecting that a son or daughter will come visit them.'"

"See, this neglect to love brings spiritual poverty. Maybe in our family we have someone who is feeling lonely, who is feeling sick, who is feeling worried. Are we willing to give until it hurts, in order to be with our families? Or do we put our own interests first?"

Over the years I have visited numerous nursing homes. I find the words of St Teresa to ring true. When entering many of our nursing facilities, I find numerous people gathered in the common areas watching those who come into the facility. You get the impression that they are looking for someone who is looking for them.

Among many of the things that I am grateful here at St. Nicholas is the fact that we have a good number of extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion who visit those who are in our nursing homes. We have thirteen such facilities in our parish. Just the same, I am sure that all of them can attest to this observation of St. Teresa. As they visit the residents they are welcomed and become a great source of comfort and joy. This is especially true for all our parishioners who are in our continuous healthcare facilities and those who are homebound. This ministry expresses the point made by St. Teresa of

Calcutta: the active virtue of love. They will also agree that this is a great source that alleviates spiritual poverty.

Speaking on the very topic about spiritual poverty in the lives of individuals as well as our country that experiences great physical wealth, St. Teresa addresses a very basic point about abortion and the respect for the life of the unborn. Mother Teresa said..." *How do we persuade a woman not to have an abortion? As always, we must persuade her with love. The father of that child, whoever he is, must also give until it hurts. By abortion, the mother does not learn to love, but kills even her own child to solve her problems. And by abortion, the father is told that he does not have to take any responsibility at all for the child he has brought into the world.*"

"Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching the people to love, but to use any violence to get what they want. This is why the greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion." This is spiritual poverty!

Mother St. Teresa's keen eye on the issue goes to the very root: there is the lack of love and the desire to grow in the virtue of love. This is spiritual poverty. This connection between spiritual poverty and the lack of love is the absence of God in our society. From the First Letter of St. John, we know that "God is Love". Simply put, if God is not in our lives, we are spiritually impoverished. We are incapable of the living the virtue of love. This is true for the self as well as for society. If we are spiritually impoverished then we are unable to truly love. Sure, people will argue that they love and at the same time also say that God is not an important part of their lives. In reality they are only kidding themselves. Without God, even as they love, it will fall short because humanity is imperfect and limited. Without God we are incapable of loving in a more perfect manner. *Grace builds on nature; elevates it and brings it to perfection.* We are unable to love others in the most profound way: self-sacrificing love. Abortion reveals the limitation and fallibility of mere human love.

We are given the perfect model of Love: Jesus Christ. Jesus is the Incarnate faithful love of God. We will not experience great peace and joy apart from God. All we have to do is look around our society and witness the lack of peace and joy. At the heart of it all is a lack of love and respect for life and the author of life. Abortion is a manifestation of this sadness.

One of the current agendas in our society is the elimination of God in the public square. More to the point, this is an attack on Christianity. This points to the spiritual poverty in our society. We live in a country that has been blessed with so many goods and comforts that we find it difficult to make sacrifices. Love, in a sinful world, implies that we make sacrifices. Mother Teresa points out that the wealthy find it particularly difficult to make the necessary sacrifices that love demands.

Our Christian faith also tells us; according to St. Paul, that left to ourselves we are incapable of any good work. It is the grace of God that moves us to do good works. Grace always precedes any good works. This is particularly true for the sacrifices we make as an expression of our love: for God and for neighbor. Thus, in a secular (graceless) society we find love to be the most difficult work. In a world that seeks comfort we are not accustomed to sacrifice. This is particularly evident in the way our society thinks about and treats the elderly and the unborn. For many people they are thought to be an inconvenience. It becomes burdensome to extend oneself, out of love, to attend to them and their potentially open-ended needs. This is particularly the case when a child is not conceived

in love but rather in an act of selfishness and lust. That in itself is spiritual poverty.

Again, we are blessed to live in a country with wealth and many comforts. It is all too easy to be lulled into complacency and indifference when it comes to living the virtue of love. Worldly speaking, love is usually measured to *what I want to give*. Instead, Christian Love is dependent on *what the other needs*. In fact, pressed further, the practice of the virtues of faith and hope also to become just as difficult. These virtues are always challenged in a sinful world.

During this Right to Life month, we need to take inventory of our lives and challenge ourselves in the practice of the theological virtues of faith, hope and love, knowing that the greatest of these is love.
