

31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



October 30, 2022

There are a couple of things happening over the next couple of weekends that I need to bring to your attention. First off, since this is the fifth weekend of the

month, we will be taking up our traditional collection for the St. Vincent de Paul Society. I know that we just had an extra collection for Catholic Charities U.S.A. for Hurricane Ian relief. Your generosity was greatly appreciated in that endeavor. This present collection is the last St. Vincent de Paul for 2022. You can breathe a sigh of relief.

A little history about this collection; it was known as "Holding the Hat." This little phrase comes from the notable trait of St. Vincent. St. Vincent was always the gentleman. He was recognized for wearing a top-hat. He was notorious for using his hat as a collection plate. Acknowledging this gesture, the members of the St. Vincent society would station themselves on the streets or at the doors of a church "Holding the Hat." We used to do the same here, but after several bumps in the road over the past few years and with fewer members in the St. Vincent de Paul Society we found ourselves returning to a second collection after communion. The results have been the same and as always, your generosity continues to be appreciated. Your charitable donations go a long way in helping provide essentials for some of our local citizens. We are all aware that the times are bad and the need is great for many of the people are living in this crushing times. Please be assured that the needs presented are properly vetted and verified. The St. Vincent de Paul Society has proven to be good stewards of the charitable contributions made by the good people of St. Nicholas.

It should also be noted that some of these funds are also used to assist the various local outreach centers in the area.

The anticipated work on our entranceways on the Main Street and Silliman Street sides of the church have been delayed. At this writing I am hoping that the work will begin at the end of the week. If not, I hope that it will begin this week. However, Murphy's Law will come into play since we will be busy in the church this week. Tuesday, November 1, is the Holy Day: The Feast of All Saints Day. The Holy Day masses will be celebrated at 8:10 a.m., with the students from both Bishop Fenwick and Bishop Rosecrans in attendance. The 8:10 a.m. mass will be very well attended. There is also an evening mass at 7:00 p.m. **Note Well.**

On Wednesday we observe *The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed* (All Souls' Day). On this occasion we will remember and pray for the Faithful Departed and most especially for those who have died over the past year. Again, the morning mass will be at 8:10 a.m. with the students of both Bishop Rosecrans and Bishop Fenwick in attendance since this is the normal day on which they attend morning mass during the week.

Looking forward to next weekend, November 5-6, Daylight Saving Time comes to an end. Do not forget to turn your clocks back one hour. An extra hour of sleep is a blessing. After the celebrations of All Saints Day and All Souls' Day, I hope to get away for a few days. With that in mind, Fr. Tom Kessler has offered to come and take the Saturday Evening confessions and mass. Sunday morning, Fr. Sean Dooley was available to cover the masses. He had the weekend off (I did not ask questions)

and offered to take one or two masses. Shamelessly I jumped on that and said two! Like me he was planning on being with his family on the weekend and then go off for a retreat. This was and is what I had been hoping to do. I love it when a plan comes together.

So, with that in mind, my plan is to leave on Thursday (11/3) and return the following Friday (11/11). Friday (11/4) is the first Friday of the month and we usually have Eucharistic Adoration. Since I will not be here Friday morning mass and Eucharistic Adoration are cancelled this week. Next week there will not be a morning mass on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. Wednesday (11/9) there will be a morning mass at 8:10 a.m. This is the regular weekly mass that the schools attend. Fr. Sullivan will have the school mass next week. I am sorry for this inconvenience. In a way this can be a foretaste of the times we live in and a glimpse into the future concerning the Catholic Community in Muskingum County.

With the Feast of All Saints this week we reminded that we are all called to be saints. It would be a shame if we did not have this desire. Saints are real examples of living as followers of Christ. They are noted for their holiness of life. In contrast we may hear of someone who says they are a spiritual person and do not belong to a formal religion (not church people). They believe that they do not need to be a member of a religion or a church. It is more important to be a spiritual person. There is something true about this but it is not the complete truth. God does not call us to be spiritual people. God does not call us to be angels. It should also be noted that the devil is also an angel! This thinking has its roots in ancient heresy. It is a manifestation of dualism which says, "Spirit good, body bad." It is a form of Gnosticism. This heresy denies the goodness of the material world. This is not taught in the Scriptures that tell us that God created all things and declared His creation to be "very good." What God has declared good we cannot say that it is not good. Secondly, God created us body and soul. God does not call us to be spiritual people, God calls us to "Be holy as I the Lord your God is holy." Holiness is different from being a spiritual person. We are called to be holy in Body and Soul, just as God created us. This is characteristic of saints. The saints lived holiness in body and soul. They extended the goodness/holiness of God bodily to others. They touched the lives of others revealing the goodness of God to others. Just as creation reveals the goodness of God naturally, so to the saints by free will reveal the goodness of God to others.

The goodness of God does nothing unless it touches the lives of human beings. The goodness/holiness of God is manifested in community and more explicitly in the Church. Jesus called a community by calling his Apostles and Disciples. They in turn were to go out and proclaim the Good News, the Word of God to others. It is in the community of believers where we come to know God. Properly understood, Jesus gave us the Church and not a book. From the Church we have the Scriptures. Jesus' eyewitnesses were the ones who continued his work of revealing God to the world. Therefore, we need the Church. We need the Church to keep us from going off the right track.

God calls all to holiness. This is our common vocation: holiness. The Church supports us in our calling. If you think about it, the proclamation of the Word of God, the celebration of the Sacraments, the prayers of the Church, the mutual support of the people support our call to grow in holiness. This

is tangible as well as spiritual: Body and Soul.

On the feast of All Saints, we are reminded that we are members of a great Communion of Saints. The Church has a great heritage of individuals who lived the holiness of God and communicated that to others. They are our heroes; the champions of the faith. They are our models of faith. In a way, inspired by the saints, we are reminded that we are called to be saints.

It would be a shame if we did not desire to be saints. This should be the desire of every Christian: The desire to be a saint. As we celebrate All Saints Day, we are aware that we have numerous examples of heroic goodness and holiness.

At the individual level, it has been part of our Catholic Tradition to identify a Saint who is personally inspirational. We are always encouraged to read about the lives of the saints and possibly befriend one or another. We have libraries of books, along with the internet with numerous Catholic web pages making it easy to research the Saints of the Church. As a pious devotion we are encouraged to pray to a "Patron Saint" seeking their inspiration, intercession, assistance, and guidance for our lives. We can be assured that the Saints will always lead us to their heart's desire: our Lord Jesus Christ.
