


STATEMENT OF MISSION

As we journey together *On Mission for the Church Alive*, the Catholic Community of Greenfield, Hazelwood and Oakland seeks to proclaim, witness and share the Good News of Jesus Christ with everyone. Empowered by the Holy Spirit and nourished by the Eucharist, our parish communities welcome all to come and to join us on our mission to deepen our faith and holiness, grow in our love for God and others, and extend charity to all, especially the poor and those in need.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

In his apostolic letter that ushered in the new millennium thirteen years ago, Blessed Pope John Paul II called to mind the scene from today's Gospel. He invited the Church to take to heart the words of Jesus to Simon Peter after they had been fishing all night with no success. In Latin the words are "Duc in altum!" Put out into the deep. Despite their hard work and tired bodies, Simon Peter and the disciples trusted in the command of Jesus and we read in today's Gospel that they "caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing...the boats were in danger of sinking." Blessed Pope John Paul II reflected: "*Duc in altum!*" These words ring out for us today, and they invite us to remember the past with gratitude, to live the present with enthusiasm and to look forward to the future with confidence: Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."

The readings today speak to us in a particular way of the task that has been entrusted to us in faith. Saint Paul reminds the early Christians of the treasure they have received through the preaching of the apostle. The Gospel we have received speaks to us with certainty that Jesus Christ died for our sins and was raised up through the power God and continues to be present through the grace of the Holy Spirit in the Church. As Saint Paul says: "Through (this Gospel) you are also being saved, if you hold fast to the word, I preached to you." Our faith in Jesus Christ leads to conversion of heart and the salvation of our souls. There could be nothing for which we long than to know the Lord and to embrace his way. The prophet Isaiah speaks of that transforming experience: "See now that this has touched your lips, your wickedness is removed, your sin purged." Is it no wonder that the people of God could cry out with one voice the great song of praise: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!" It is this same act of praise that we continue to proclaim at every Mass as we begin the Eucharistic prayer.

But the readings remind us that this treasure of faith that has made us God's own in Jesus Christ must be shared with others. Like Saint Paul, each of us through baptism shares in the task of proclaiming the Gospel so that others may come to believe in the Truth of God's saving Word and experience his love and mercy. As Jesus reminded Peter, "Do not be afraid. From now on you will be catching men." So, it has been the perennial task of the Church to evangelize, to share the good news, to lead others to the Gospel by word and deed. Pope Francis has called each

of us to reflect on the gift of faith we have received through the preaching of others and to commit ourselves more deeply to the work of passing on what we have ourselves received. Saint Paul expressed that work beautifully in his letter to the Romans: *How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? And how can they preach unless they are sent?* As it is written, "*How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!*"

Duc in altum! Put out into the deep. From now on we must all be catchers of men and women, leading them to the new life of grace by our efforts to share the Good News. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever.

PASTOR'S REFLECTION

1. On Sunday afternoon, January 27, the parish community of Saint Rosalia came together in a great and beautiful way in sponsoring a Spaghetti Dinner – and a whole lot more – in support of three-year-old Madison Welsh who has been diagnosed with pediatric multiple sclerosis – a very rare condition. The social hall was transformed into a beautiful and uplifting environment in a show of loving support for Madison. Her parents and grandparents were there – along with Madison – and many other family members and friends. More than 800 people came through. There were raffles, auctions, a 50-50 raffle, balloon making, face painting and some really delicious spaghetti and meatballs. It was a proud and happy day for our parish family to see so many people come together and make this magical afternoon a reality. Thanks to everyone who worked so very hard and for many hours! It speaks to the deep faith, compassion and care we have for our neighbors and for those in need. This is truly what it means to be a faith community. Please continue to pray for Madison and her family. If you want to make a contribution to this important effort you can do that through the parish rectory at Saint Rosalia.
2. Once again, some people have fallen victim to an email scam seeking money under false pretenses. Someone created a false email using my name and sending it out to a number of people on my contact list (these things happen regularly I have been told). The issue is that while my name was used, the email was not my email. Always check the email address, not just the name, to be sure the email is correct. And never fall for a plea for

money without picking up the phone and calling the person. Always seek to verify the authenticity of the email before doing anything. We did report the scam to the various authorities. I was informed this happens often and that people like to use the name of the clergy person to elicit a response. If you get any email asking for money, your telephone number or asking you to send it to a different address – please do not respond! These are sure signs you are being scammed.

3. Sadly, the votive boxes at the Cathedral were broken into again this past week. It happens from time to time. It is a reminder that everyone in our parishes needs to be vigilant in watching for suspicious behavior and to respond immediately by calling 911. The police have asked us to call if we see anything suspicious so they can come immediately to investigate and have a better chance to catch the people involved. If you see any signs of damage to anything, please contact the rectory immediately. We have a 24-hour answering service that contacts me and the other priests immediately. There were some people who saw that the boxes were damaged but never said anything – that isn't a big help to us as we need to narrow down the time that it occurred and as soon as you see something report it! We all need to be vigilant in caring for our Churches.

ANNUAL WHITE MASS, sponsored by the Catholic Medical Association, will be celebrated today at the 12:00 Noon Mass. We welcome all healthcare professionals, students, and their families who are attending this special Mass with Bishop Zubik presiding. A reception will follow in the social hall.

A MASS OF REMEMBRANCE AND HEALING will be celebrated by Bishop Zubik at the Cathedral today, Sunday, February 10 at 2:30 pm. At this Mass we will remember and pray for all those who have died from drug addiction and to seek healing for those who have survived the death of a loved one due to drug addiction. All are welcome to participate.

THE NATIONAL CELEBRATION OF WORLD MARRIAGE DAY is today, Sunday, February 10. World Marriage Day is an annual event, sponsored by Worldwide Marriage Encounter, the largest Catholic pro-marriage and family movement in the world. It honors and affirms the vocation of husbands and wives and the positive impact of their dedicated example on our society, families, communities, Church, and nation. It is an opportunity to affirm our married couples for their faithful witness to the Church in living out their vocation, and to pray for them and their families. We will offer a special blessing to all married and engaged couples at each of the Masses. May God bless you.

THE WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE SICK will be celebrated next Monday, February 11 - the day on which the Church commemorates the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. World Day of Prayer for the Sick has three consistent themes. First, it reminds the faithful to pray intensely and sincerely for those who are sick. Second, the celebration invites Christians to reflect on and respond to human suffering. And third, this day recognizes and honors all persons who work in health care and serve as caregivers. In his message for the 2019 World Day of the Sick, Pope Francis wrote that "the Church sees in the sick the special presence of the suffering Christ." He offers encouragement and hope to all who suffer in anyway as the sick are joined closely to the sufferings of Christ. Our Holy Father also reminds each of us that "by baptism and confirmation we are called to be the Good Samaritan to all who suffer. When we come close with tenderness to those in need of care, we bring the hope and the smile of God amid the contradictions of the world." We will remember all the sick of our parish in a special way at all the Masses celebrated on February 11.

BIRTHDAY BLESSINGS to our pastor and rector, **FATHER KRIS STUBNA**, as he celebrates his birthday on Wednesday, February 13. May God continue to shower his blessings upon him.

WHO WAS THE REAL SAINT VALENTINE? He was a Roman Priest at a time when there was an emperor called Claudius who persecuted the church at that particular time. The emperor also had an edict that prohibited the marriage of young people. This was based on the hypothesis that unmarried soldiers fought better than married soldiers because married soldiers might be afraid of what might happen to them or their wives or families if they died. Remember as well, it was a very permissive society in which Valentine lived. Polygamy would have been much more popular than just one woman and one man living together. And yet some of them seemed to be attracted to Christian faith. But obviously the church thought that marriage was very sacred between one man and one woman for their life and that it was to be encouraged. And so, it immediately presented the problem to the Christian church of what to do about this.

The idea of encouraging them to marry within the Christian church was what Valentine was about. And he secretly married them because of the edict. Valentine was eventually caught, imprisoned and tortured for performing marriage ceremonies against command of Emperor Claudius the second. There are legends surrounding Valentine's actions while in prison. One of the men who was to judge him in line with the Roman law at the time was a man called Asterius, whose daughter was blind. He was supposed to have prayed with and healed the young girl with such astonishing effect that Asterius himself became Christian as a result. In the year 269 AD, Valentine was sentenced to a three-part execution of a beating, stoning, and finally decapitation all because of his stand for Christian marriage. The story goes that the last words he wrote were in a note to Asterius' daughter. He inspired today's romantic missives by signing it, "from your Valentine." Whitefriars Street Church in Dublin, Ireland houses the remains of St. Valentine where many people make the pilgrimage to honor the courage and memory of this Christian saint.

True devotion to St. Valentine is about what true love means. There comes a time where you have to lay your life upon the line for what you believe. And with the power of the Holy Spirit we can do that - even to the point of death. Valentine has come to be known as the patron saint of lovers. Before you enter into a Christian marriage you want some sense of God in your life - some great need of God in your life. If Valentine were here today, he would say to married couples that there comes a time where you're going to have to suffer. It's not going to be easy to maintain your commitment and your vows in marriage. Don't be surprised if the 'gushing' love that you have for someone changes to something less 'gushing' but maybe much more mature. And the question is, will you be ready for that? Will your love be strong enough to lay down your life for the other?

PASTOR VERIFICATION FORMS are required for each family who has students attending a Catholic school. This form needs to be signed by me as the administrator/pastor of the four parishes in our grouping. It is important for parents to understand that I am signing a form that indicates you are a registered, active member of your parish – that means that you are attending Mass regularly and contributing to the life of the parish with your time, talent and treasure. If this is not true, I am not able to sign the form. It is important that as parents you are taking your faith responsibility seriously by bringing your children to Mass and getting involved in the life of the parish.

WE OFFER A SPECIAL WORD OF RECOGNITION, THANKS AND PRAYER FOR ALL THE MEN AND WOMEN FROM OUR PARISHES WHO ARE SERVING IN THE ARMED FORCES OF OUR COUNTRY. Let us never forget to keep these brave men and women in our prayers as they put their lives at risk every day in defense of our freedoms and our nation. I came across this prayer that can be offered for all those in the armed forces: "Heavenly Father, we commend to your gracious and protective care, all the men and women of our Armed Forces at home and abroad. Defend them day by day with your guiding hand and heavenly grace; encourage them and strengthen them in their trials, temptations, and discouragements; grant them your abiding presence wherever they may be. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen."

SAINTS OF THE WEEK. On February 14 the Church honors **SAINT CYRIL AND SAINT METHODIUS**, two brothers who introduced the Christian faith to Eastern Europe. Both were destined for political leadership but choose instead the life of prayer as monks. The emperor sent both of them to Moravia where the local ruler had been given permission to teach and to practice the Catholic faith in the vernacular language. These two brothers translated the Bible and the liturgy into the Slavic language, in the process developing what is known as the Cyrillic alphabet which laid the foundations for all Slavic literature. This drew the anger of many of the German bishops and priests and the brothers appealed directly to Rome. They had the joy in visiting Pope Adrian II to see the new Slavic liturgy approved but Cyril died shortly thereafter. Methodius continued the mission work for another 16 years and became a bishop to the Slavic peoples. Both of them faced a great deal of opposition and suffering but they remained faithful to the work of bringing the Scriptures and the liturgy to the Slavic people in a way that they could participate and understand. Pope John Paul II called them the "spiritual bridge between the Eastern and Western traditions of the Catholic Church." Along with Saint Benedict, they are the patrons of Europe and patron saints of Christian unity.

A NEW PROCEDURE IS IN PLACE FOR THE REST ROOMS IN THE CATHEDRAL. Effective immediately, the restrooms will only be open and operative during the Mass times. This is a security measure that we have been asked to take by our security committee that involves a number of people from law enforcement, the FBI, FEMA, Homeland Security, the Diocese of Pittsburgh and our parish. There will be additional steps taken as we seek ways to make our Cathedral plant more secure and safe for all those who come for prayer and worship. This may be an inconvenience to some who have been using the rest rooms in off hours, but the risks are too great, and we need to be more diligent in securing our facilities.


