



**STATEMENT OF MISSION**

As we journey together *On Mission for the Church Alive*, the Catholic Community of Greenfield, Hazelwood and Oakland seeks to proclaim, witness and share the Good News of Jesus Christ with everyone. Empowered by the Holy Spirit and nourished by the Eucharist, our parish communities welcome all to come and to join us on our mission to deepen our faith and holiness, grow in our love for God and others, and extend charity to all, especially the poor and those in need.

## SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Lent begins with the recounting of the temptations faced by Christ. Even Jesus, the Son of God, “was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil.” Jesus faces the power of Satan as he promises him the pleasures of the material world, the lure of power and glory, and the great temptation of self-centered pride that can lead to an abandonment of our total dependency on God and his grace. But Jesus responds powerfully to these temptations: “You shall not put the Lord your God to the test.” As Jesus affirms his identity as the Son of God, and sets the power of God before the devil, we hear that “Satan departed him for a time.”

In the first reading, Moses reminds the Israelites of the power of God in overcoming every evil and difficulty. He calls to mind that great tribulations and difficulties of their life in slavery to the Egyptians and they ultimately sought the refuge of their God. Moses recounts that “when he heard our cry and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression, he brought us out of Egypt with his strong, hand, his terrifying power, with signs and wonders.” God’s saving love is more powerful than the devil and the presence of evil. God’s divine mercy can wipe away any human failure, sin or weakness. God’s sanctifying grace will overcome any temptation that is encountered.

What is needed on our part, however, is the recognition of our need for God. Moses instructs the Israelites on showing them the goodness of God that “you shall bow down in his presence.” Human pride can all too often block the efficacy of God’s mercy and compassion. As Saint Paul writes to the Romans in today’s second reading: “If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.” He says again, “everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

Lent is an opportunity for us to strengthen our faith. Through the three-fold discipline of prayer, fasting and works of mercy, Lent invites us to set aside our pride and grow in humility and trust in the power of God. The temptations of the devil that so often get the best of us, causing us to sin and fall away from the life of grace, can only be overcome and defeated, in the end, when we allow God’s grace to take root in our heart. Lent beckons us to recognize our total need for God in this journey towards heaven; we will never make

it alone. The Scriptures assure us that when we call upon the name of the Lord, when we seek his help, when we through ourselves at the feet of Jesus, we will find the strength, courage, help and grace needed to lead a life of fidelity to God and his way. As the Psalmist in today’s readings promises: “Because he clings to me, I will deliver him; I will set him on high because he acknowledges my name. He shall call upon me and I will answer him; I will be him in distress; I will deliver him and glorify him.” As Saint Paul promises, the same Lord is Lord of all, enriching all who call upon him in faith.

## ON MISSION CORNER WITH FATHER STUBNA

1. We must continue to remember that we are moving towards creating one parish community in our grouping of four parishes. This is not an easy journey but one that we must take. With the changing demographics in our neighborhoods, the economic realities confronting us, and the fact that we have too many buildings and facilities for the size of our community, there are a number of hard decisions that need to be made in the near future. We have an interim Mass schedule in place that has reduced the overall number of Masses in our grouping and we may continue to need to reduce Masses that are not necessary for the numbers attending. We have three priests and one deacon working hard to provide leadership and spiritual care for four parishes. That is no easy task. With the significant number of funerals each week, the number of elderly shut-ins, and the demands of administration that are being served by a very small number of staff (we don’t have the financial resources for more), there are pastoral priorities that need to be established as essential and others that just are not able to be accomplished. We have begun conversations with the parish pastoral and finance councils and the clergy team meets regularly. It is important that everyone understand that it is not “business as usual.” There will continue to be changes as we work towards creating one single parish family and making decisions about how many Masses we really need, and which buildings are necessary for our future. There will not always be Masses celebrated in every Church building for every holyday or special occasion. The faithful must look beyond their own parish and see what is taking place in the grouping. We had five Masses on Ash Wednesday but not a Mass in every Church. This is the way of the future. Our facilities are

geographically very close together which is a blessing. We need people to consider driving their neighbors to Church, helping to bring Holy Communion to our shut-ins, offering to serve as lector or extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion in the other Church buildings in our grouping. We cannot sustain four different Church buildings and rectories as we move forward. This will simply not be possible. So, we need everyone to work together for the good of our parish grouping as we seek to plan for the future of our parish with the resources and the means we have available to us. And we do this always in a spirit of prayer, knowing and trusting that God's Holy Spirit will guide and lead us where we need to go.

2. We are now asking for feedback on the interim Mass schedule beginning this week until the end of March. A survey can be accessed online from the parish website and on our parish Facebook. Copies of the survey will also be located by the entrances of the Church. Please take a few minutes to offer your feedback on the interim Mass schedule for our parish grouping.

### **THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION**

provides us with an opportunity to approach God in the confessional with our sins and seek God's forgiveness and mercy for the ways we have been unfaithful. Lent is a perfect time to come to confession, particularly those who may not have been to the Sacrament of Penance in a while. God invites all sinners to return to his loving embrace and the fullness of life and communion with Him and the Church. Saint Paul Cathedral has regular confession times on Friday at 12:45 pm and Saturdays at 12:45 pm and 7:00 pm. In addition, there will be a special evening the diocese on Wednesday, April 10. Bishop Zubik has asked that we participate in the program called, "The Light is On For You", an invitation to draw all Catholics back to confession during this Lenten season. Confessions will be heard from 6:00 pm until 9:00 pm at Saint Paul Cathedral and from 6:00 pm until 7:30 pm at both Saint Stephen and Saint Rosalia.

### **BLESSED IMAGE OF VERONICA'S VEIL.**

During this Lenten season at the Friday evening Stations of the Cross at Saint Paul Cathedral, we will expose a blessed image of the **Holy Icon of the Veil of Veronica**. Tradition has noted the kind act of this holy woman, Veronica, wiping the face of Jesus on the Way of the Cross. She is said to have bequeathed the veil to Pope Clement I, the 3<sup>rd</sup> successor of Peter and it was kept safe in the catacombs and later placed in Saint Peter's Basilica where it resides today in one of the four great pillars near the main altar where it is displayed for public veneration and devotion a few times each year. In 1849 when Pope Pius IX fled the revolutions in Rome to take refuge in Gaeta, he endeavored to appeal to God's favor and mercy to end the evil that devastated the Church by permitting the Holy Veil to be publicly exposed during the Christmas octave. During this public exposition, the Holy Veil became illuminated and it was said "that the veil became engulfed with a soft light while the face assumed a tinge of color and shone forth as though it were alive." Etchings and representations of the Holy Veil were made during this time and placed on the Holy Veil to be blessed and these copies were affixed with stamps and authenticating seals for devotion in Churches throughout the world. One such etching, blessed by the Holy Veil itself and affixed and authenticated with the Holy See of the Vatican, will put on public display at the Cathedral during the Friday evening stations throughout Lent. It is a reminder to us of the great suffering endured by Jesus himself for our sins, and the beautiful and humble act of kindness extended to him by Veronica as he walked to the Crucifixion. May it inspire in us a deeper desire to love Jesus and to love others. This representation of the Holy Veil is being made available to us this Lent through the kindness of **CAROL SPECK**. We are grateful for her kindness.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS** are a beautiful devotion that invites us to walk the Way of the Cross with Jesus. Stations of the Cross will be celebrated during the Lenten season at Saint Stephen following the 10:00 am Mass on Wednesdays and at Saint Paul Cathedral on Wednesdays at 12:45 pm (following the 12:05 Mass) and on Friday evenings at 7:00 pm (with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction). I encourage everyone to come and pray with us, to bring your family and friends, and walk the Way of the Cross with our Lord.

**CRS RICE BOWL FOR LENT.** All four parishes in our parish grouping will be participating in this year's Rice Bowl project for Lent. CRS Rice Bowl is Catholic Relief Services' Lenten faith-in-action program. It offers opportunities for us to practice the spiritual pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It's an opportunity for us as 4 parishes to come together and reflect on what it means to live our Gospel call to go out and encounter those most in need. CRS is the official international humanitarian agency of the Catholic Community in the United States. 94% of funds donated to CRS go directly into programs to help those most in need. Funds collected through CRS Rice Bowl are distributed as follows: 75% go to CRS and 25% stay in our Diocese to help the poor. **WHAT IS PRAYER?** Is it merely reciting formulas or reading prayers from a book? Prayer is, rather, raising the heart and mind to God. Prayer is entering into a dialogue with the living God. Prayer is, for all Christians, a necessity. Lent started last Wednesday and during Lent we are called to intensify our prayer.

Prayer is one of the three pillars of Lenten practice. Through prayer, we raise our hearts and minds to God in thanksgiving and praise. Prayer is our "vital and personal relationship with the true and living God." During Lent, we place special emphasis on prayer and contemplation on the Passion and Death of our Lord. How will you rediscover this practice in your life and allow it to be renewed? Here are some suggestions:

- Arrive at Mass a bit early to spend quiet time with the Lord.
- Spend a half-hour of silence each day in prayer.
- Recite the Rosary daily in a meditative fashion.
- Read a portion of the Bible (Lenten readings for daily Mass).
- Talk to the Lord intimately AND listen to His voice as He speaks to you.

He aquí algunas sugerencias:

- Lleguen a Misa un poco más temprano para pasar un tiempo en tranquilidad con el Señor.
- Pasen una media hora al día de oración en silencio.
- Digan el rosario diariamente en forma meditada.
- Lean un poco de la Biblia (especialmente las lecturas de la Misa diaria para la Cuaresma).
- Hablen íntimamente con el Señor Y escuchen Su voz que les habla.



**LENTEN REGULATIONS FOR ALL CATHOLICS**

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence (no meat).
2. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (no meat).
3. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at age 14.
4. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) is obligatory for people between the ages of 18 and 59, but is encouraged for all who can do so without causing harm. No one should consider this obligation lightly.
5. All the faithful, children and adults alike, are encouraged to do acts of penance and charity during the Lenten season. This includes "giving something up" as part of the sacrificial nature of Lent and increasing prayers and works of charity as well.




