

## Christ the King Corpus Christi Procession for Vocations & Ice Cream Social

From 6 p.m.-7 p.m., we will host an **Eucharistic Procession around the perimeter of our campus immediately after the 5 p.m. Saturday Mass on June 5th**. Afterwards, all are invited to enjoy a free ice cream social outside on the north side of the church (or in the Parish Center in case of inclement weather).

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi (The Body of Christ) that we honor today was established in the 13th century and the Church has devoutly fostered processions of the faithful on this day ever since. The Corpus Christi Procession proclaims to the world that the real Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ are present under the appearance of the bread in Holy Communion and in the tabernacle and in the monstrance. It puts our faith and words into action as we simply and publicly demonstrate our most sacred belief that Jesus remains with us until the end of the world in a preeminent way in the Eucharist.

Countless documented miracles throughout history have confirmed the Church in Her belief in this mystery of the Real Presence, in which Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained. St. John Chrysostom declares: "It is not man that causes the things offered to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but He who was crucified for us, Christ himself. The priest, in the role of Christ, pronounces these words, but their power and grace are God's."

The Priesthood of Jesus Christ and the Eucharist are inextricably linked. We cannot have the Blessed Sacrament without priests to consecrate it and priests are expressly ordained to celebrate the Eucharist for the people. Today we march with Our Lord around our grounds both to make our faith in the Real Presence visible and to pray for increased vocations to the priesthood, particularly here in the Archdiocese of Omaha and from our parish and our families.

Do you know a young man who has faith, virtue, and

the qualities to make a good priest and pastor? Have you told him that?

## Masks Optional/Masses Required

With the recent end of the dispensation from the obligation to participate in Masses on the weekly Sabbath and on Holy Days of Obligation, we expect to see more people attending Masses. To accommodate more seating, maintain a zone for people who may still be vulnerable, and adapt to the end of the Omaha ordinance requiring masks indoors in certain situations, we are enacting the following changes today.

**Beginning June 5th & 6th**, our Saturday 5 p.m. Vigil Mass no longer requires masks to be worn. The continued wearing of masks is certainly welcome but masks are no longer mandated. Instead, the entire east side (St. Joseph statue side) of the church pews features signs enabling social distancing as a way of accommodating those who are still vulnerable or who are cautiously returning to Mass. The entire west side (Mary statue side) of the church pews, however, is now completely opened up for seating.

We realize that there are still many strong feelings in regards to the use or disuse of masks and social distancing. Please pray about it and be patient with others, always generously giving the benefit of the doubt to others. We both want to make the transition easy for people returning to Mass for the first time and also to progress towards normality. Inform your consciences and make the best decision you can for yourselves and for others and let us move forward together.


## Weekday Internet and Morning Mass Temporary Summer Hiatus


